

Child Find: A Search for Children with Disabilities

As a public school district, Struthers City Schools fulfills the responsibility to identify and evaluate children suspected of having a disability. Please notify Struthers City Schools of any child suspected of being affected by a disability, by contacting Struthers Special Services via the information below.

A preschool child (ages of 3-5) is identified as having a disability if she/he has a documented deficit in one or more of the following areas: communication skills, hearing, motor functioning, social-emotional development, behavioral difficulties, or vision impairment. An evaluation team works with children and families to determine if a child has a disability that impacts them in the preschool setting, then provides appropriate programs and services prior to the child entering elementary school. A child may be eligible for preschool-based services at no cost, while ages 3-5.

School age children (ages 5-21,) may qualify for special education services if he/she is found to have a disability in one or more of the following categories: autism, developmental disability, intellectual disability, behavioral/emotional disability, speech/language impairment, multiple disabilities, specific learning disabilities, traumatic brain injury, health or orthopedic impairment, or vision/hearing disabilities.
