
The Unami Jazz Festival





Spoiler summary:

Captain Marvel is about an extraterrestrial being named Veers, (actually Carol Danvers) and her adventures to unlock her full abilities. When we first meet Veers, she is a member of a race called the Kree. The Kree are in a giant war with the Skrulls, who can shapeshift into any person that they see. When Veers gets abducted by Skrulls, she eventually escapes on an escape pod and crash lands on earth. When she gets to earth her presence is then witnessed by S.H.I.E.L.D. When Shield gets to Veers, she meets two shield operatives, Nick Fury and Phil Coulson. Nick has found a crystal containing some of Veers' memories. Eventually, Nick decides to work with Veers to take down the Skrulls.

While all of this is happening, Skrull leader, Talos disguises himself on earth. Vers learns she was a pilot who is presumed to have died six years earlier while testing an experimental light-speed engine designed by scientist Wendy Lawson, who she recognizes as the woman from her nightmares. After this, Nick, Carol, and their cat stowaway, Goose, ride to Louisiana to meet with Carol's old friend from the air force named Maria Rambeau and her young daughter Monica. When they get there, Maria and Monica reveal Vers' real name is Carol Danvers. Carol finds out there that Maria was her best friend, and that Carol was Monica's aunt before presumably "dying." Talos, who had tracked her, arrives and asks to speak.

Using the black-box recorder of Lawson's crashed plane, Danvers learns an alien spaceship had shot it down, and she now remembers Yon-Rogg (one of her Kree friends) killing Lawson, as well as Lawson's warning that the experimental engine's energy-core had to be destroyed to keep it from the wrong hands. Vers shot it and was caught in an ensuing explosion, with her body absorbing the energy. Yon-Rogg brought the amnesiac "Vers"—with the remaining portion of "Danvers" on her broken dog tag—to Hala. In this part we find out that the Skrulls are just refugees and Lawson's engine was to help them escape beyond Kree reach. Using coordinates Lawson had given Danvers, she, along with Fury, Monica, Talos, and Goose (who actually turns out to be an alien called a Flerken) fly their Skrull-modified cargo jet to a cloaked ship in orbit.

There they find the source of the energy-core's power, the Tesseract and some Skrull refugees, including Talos' mate and child. Yon-Rogg's Starforce, having tracked them, captures Danvers and places her in VR before the Supreme Intelligence. Enraged at being used, Danvers fights back, and discovers that a Kree implant that purportedly gave her Kree powers was instead limiting them. After this, Carol unleashes her full power and gives Nick the tesseract for safe keeping. Danvers agrees to help the Skrulls find a new home world and gives Fury a modified pager with which to contact her in an emergency. Fury later drafts a proposal for an initiative, changing the name after finding a photo with Danvers' old call sign of "Avenger." That is when the Avengers initiative was born.

Indochinese Tigers in Danger

The Indochinese subspecies of tiger (*Panthera Tigris Corbetti*) is found in Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, and Burma. They once inhabited China too, but none of these stunning creatures have been spotted since 2007. It is estimated that fewer than 1,500 Indochinese tigers are left in the wild. However, since the tiger has a very wide range (lives in a large area of land), it makes it difficult for researchers to determine the exact number of tigers still alive today. Therefore, some scientists believe the numbers may be as few as 1,200. Since there are only a few of these animals left, the remaining specimens are sometimes prone to inbreeding (breeding with immediate family members). This leads to weakened genes and in some cases, it leads to defects (such as cleft palates or squints). They are naturally elusive animals, making them particularly difficult to study and observe in the wild.

The Indochinese Tiger is characterized by its smaller stature when compared to other tiger subspecies. It has a dark orange or golden base coat color, but its stripes are not as bold as the Bengal Tiger. Males are about 2.2 to 2.4 meters long (or 9 feet) and weigh between 150 and 200 kilograms (or 330 to 430 pounds). Females are between 2 and 2.2 meters long (about 8 feet) and weigh between 100 and 130 kilograms (which is equivalent to 220 to 287 pounds).

The Indochinese Tiger prefers a life of seclusion. They choose forested areas in which they are concealed and camouflaged. They also prefer mountainous regions to flat ones, as these cater more to their hunting style, diet, and way of life. Their habitat is mostly made up of remote forests and hilly or mountainous terrain. The Indochinese Tiger will eat the prey that is available to it within its natural habitat. This comprises of wild pig, wild deer, and wild cattle.

With only a few hundred Indochinese Tigers thought to be left in existence, the situation is critical. The poaching of tigers as well as of their prey is the most significant contributing factor to the depletion of this species. Chinese medicine is another major factor that has contributed to the mass killing of the Indochinese Tiger. Today, they can only be found in parks and reserves. There are a few programs and initiatives underway to promote and rehabilitate the tiger numbers. However, this subspecies remains in critical danger of extinction.




