FEE PAYMENT

Parents and guardians can pay registration fees online from May 12 - August 12 through Skyward Family Access. After logging in, go to "Fee Management" to pay the fees associated with your student. Discover, Visa, and Mastercard are accepted. All past due fees/fines are due and payable before Distribution Day.

PAY BY AUGUST 12 AND SAVE \$25 PER STUDENT. The registration fee AFTER August 12 is \$280 per student. If you do not have computer access, you may pay online at the District Office (1 S. Virginia Road, Crystal Lake) or pay by check or cash.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

STUDENTS ID'S & YEARBOOK PICTURE

Every student's ID picture will be taken at registration. Please come prepared to be photographed. This photo will be used in the yearbook (for freshmen, sophomores, juniors) and on all students' IDs. Any student unable to have his/her yearbook photo taken at distribution day will have an opportunity during retakes in October. Students who were unable to get an ID picture taken may get their ID picture taken in the front office once school starts. Students are required to carry their ID at all times while at school. It serves as their library card, bus pass, work-release, lunch release, and activity pass, and is required for textbook sign-out and admittance to study halls and the library. The replacement cost for a lost or altered card is \$5.

SENIOR PORTRAITS

Seniors who came in during the summer to take their senior portrait WILL receive their ID on distribution day and will NOT need to take another picture. Seniors that did NOT have their picture taken over the summer will need to take their picture on distribution day. This picture will differ from the picture used in the yearbook. In order for your picture to appear in the senior section of the yearbook you must have your picture taken by Empire Photography. You are under no obligation to purchase anything, and there is no fee if you are only having a picture taken for the yearbook. If you still need to schedule your portrait session, please visit

TRANSPORTATION

Buses will not run during distribution days or freshman orientation. Buses begin running on August 13, the first day of school. FRESHMAN & TRANSFER STUDENT ORIENTATIONS

Students will have the opportunity to meet other transfer students and have time to walk the building to locate their classrooms. *Please note, bus service will not be provided on orientation day. Students should be dropped off at the bus circle drive on Walkup Avenue, east of the building, beginning at 11:45 a.m. Bus transportation will start on the first full day of school: Wednesday, August 13.*

SCHOOL PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE

Because irregular or poor attendance denies the student opportunities to maximize benefits from teachers and fellow students, the following policies have been adopted:

- A parent or guardian must call the school each day a student misses all or part of his/her school day.
- You may leave information on the automated voicemail system 24 hours a day, or you may call the switchboard between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Written notes are not acceptable to excuse absences.
- A student is only allowed FIVE days of absence without question, per semester, provided there is a call from a parent. (*Note: Absences that are valid and accompanied by supporting documentation are not counted toward the five days of absence.*) Please see the student handbook or the website for further information.

CELL PHONE USE

Students are ALLOWED to use their cell phones and headphones ONLY during passing periods, lunch periods, and study halls. The use of cellphones and other electronic devices are NOT ALLOWED in academic spaces. Cell phones must be OUT-OF-SIGHT and PUT AWAY during instructional time. If a student is actively using their phone or headphones outside of staff direction, there will be corresponding consequences. On the first offense, a discipline referral will be written and on the second offense the student will be sent directly to the Dean's office for additional consequences. For three or more infractions, additional interventions may be given.

ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATIONS

The school will use an automated calling system to alert parents when their student is considered absent/ truant. The notification system also allows the school to communicate via text message. Parents and guardians who gave permission to be called and/or texted and provided a mobile phone number during online registration will receive attendance notifications. Parents and guardians can revoke this consent at any time by notifying Shannon Podzimek, director of communications, spodzimek@d155.org, or by following the instructions in the automated phone call or text messages. Please ensure that your primary number stays up-to-date throughout the year so that we can provide you with pertinent information if necessary.

SCHOOL COMMUNICATIONS & EMERGENCY ALERT NOTIFICATIONS

D155 will use ParentSquare to communicate with you, and you will receive all district and school communication via email, text, or app. You can download the free mobile app for iOS or Android or use the desktop version at http://www.parentsquare.com/ If you do not download the app, you will continue to receive notifications via email and emergency notifications via text, email, and phone call. Please ensure your primary number stays up-to-date throughout the school year to receive important school alerts.

SCHOOL PROCEDURES

SCHOOL VISITORS

Parents or others visiting during the school day should:

- Park in the "Visitors" space.
- Enter the building through the main door. Press
- the button to be buzzed in.
- . Sign in at the greeter's desk in the office.

For the school's security, all visitors must present a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned through a national database. You must leave your license or ID at the front desk while visiting Central, and it will be returned to you upon check-out.

STUDENT PARKING

Due to limited space, only juniors and seniors with a parking pass may park in the student lot. Emergency, one-day parking privileges are available for \$5.00 per day. Please see the deans' secretary for details.

DRIVER EDUCATION

State law requires that no student be permitted to take driver's education courses unless he or she has received a passing grade in at least eight credit-carrying courses during the previous two semesters of school. All students enrolled in Behind-the-Wheel driver's education must pay a \$250 fee due at registration plus the Secretary of State permit fee of \$20 due on the first day of class. Students will fill out the permit application on the first day of class.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

District 155 allows students to use their ID card to make cafeteria purchases. The cashless purchase program allows a student/parent to add money to the ID by clicking the "Food Service" link in Skyward Family Access.

LUNCH RELEASE

Seniors and juniors may be granted lunch release privileges with their parent's or guardian's permission. Lunch release forms can be picked up during distribution day and returned on the first day of school. No freshmen or sophomores are allowed to leave campus during lunch. If a student chooses to violate this rule, consequences may include a four-hour detention for the first offense.

FREE OR REDUCED LUNCH FEE WAIVERS

Applications should be completed and returned before registering your student for school. If you have a Medicaid, SNAP, or TANF number you should receive a letter in the mail regarding your direct certification of lunch benefits and approval for waiver of fees.

If you have any questions regarding the direct certification process or about the forms, please call the Student Services Office at 815-459-2505, ext. 2249.

If you do not receive a direct certification letter and would like to apply for fee waivers and/or free or reduced lunch, forms will be available on the school's website after July 14. <u>Click HERE for applications</u>. Please complete this process by distribution days.

STUDENT HANDBOOK

The student handbook includes all school rules and regulations on academics, student conduct, student attire and dress, attendance, transportation, athletics, and activities. Parents and students must become familiar with the content of the student handbook, which is available on the school's website. HEALTH SERVICES

FRESHMAN REQUIREMENTS

FRESHMAN PHYSICAL:

All freshmen are required by law to have a physical examination completed between August 8, 2024, and August 7, 2025. The exam must be documented by a physician using the state approved form available to download on the district website, parents must complete the Health History section. Physical examination forms are available on the <u>Health Services website</u>.

**Please note that Athletic physicals do not meet the requirements for students entering 9th grade.

FRESHMAN DENTAL EXAMS: All freshman are required to submit proof of a dental exam within 18 months of the start of freshman year. The exam must be documented by a physician using the state approved form available on the **Health Services website**.

SENIOR REQUIREMENTS

MENINGITIS VACCINATION: All seniors must meet Illinois Department of Public Health immunization requirements for meningococcal disease prior to the start of the 12th grade. Proof of vaccination must be provided prior to Senior Distribution Day, August 5, 2025. .

ALL STUDENTS

MEDICATION FORM: Any student needing to take medication (prescription and/or over-the-counter) must have a Medication Form on file with the school nurse. Forms must be submitted annually. The form is available on the **Health Services website**.

ASTHMA ACTION PLAN: Students who have asthma are required to have an "Asthma Action Plan." It must be kept on file in the school nurse's office. The form is available to **download here.**

You have two options to submit the State of Illinois Certificate of Child Health Examination and School Dental Examination forms. You can email the forms to your school nurse: _clcnurse@d155.org . Or you have the option to bring the forms to Distribution Day in August. This will be your ticket into Freshman Distribution Day.

STUDENT SERVICES

Student Services encompasses much more than scheduling. Parents and students should feel free to stop in or call our office with any social-emotional needs as our department includes counselors, social workers, a psychologist, and a school nurse. In addition, students and parents have access to our College and Career Center to research various post-high school educational and career options. ATHLETIC FEES

Student athletic participation fees for 2025-26 are \$100 per sport, with a student maximum of \$200 per student, and a family maximum of \$400 per household.

Athletic fees will be due after rosters have been finalized. The athletic fee will be posted in Skyward Family Access. Athletic fee payments can be completed through Skyward Family Access. After logging in, go to "Fee Management" to pay the fees associated with your student. Discover, Visa, and MasterCard are accepted for online payment. Athletic fees can be paid in person at school in the front office. Checks are payable to Community High School District 155. The athletic participation fee(s) will be waived for students who qualify and apply for fee waivers.

District 155 has a no refund policy after the first IHSA event/contest. Athletes who quit their sport prior to the first IHSA event/contest are eligible for a full refund, but must meet the following conditions:

- Notify the coach and athletic office (Athlete should notify coach and athletic office via email)
- Must be cleared of all uniform/equipment rentals by coach.

ATHLETICS

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for interscholastic sports, student athletes must have passed five core classes the previous semester and must continually be passing five core classes during the current semester. Physical education can be counted in these five courses as long as a student is not PE exempt. The athlete also must reside with a parent or legal guardian within District 155 boundaries.

ADMISSION PRICE TO ATHLETIC EVENTS

Admission prices to Fox Valley Conference and other athletic contests are \$6.00 for adults, \$4.00 for students with ID cards and \$3.00 for senior citizens and children in fifth grade and younger. Football, volleyball, boys/girls basketball and wrestling home events are free for D155 students with their ID. Costs for IHSA tournament events may differ, and no passes can be accepted for such events.

FAMILY PASSES

DIGITAL TICKETS FOR ATHLETIC EVENTS

The district uses digital ticketing by GoFan for athletic events. You can purchase tickets by downloading the "GoFan" app or purchase tickets on the website. All major credit cards are accepted, along with Apple Pay and Google Pay. Fans are encouraged to buy tickets online prior to arriving at the facility. Signage will be set up at the venue to help fans navigate an online purchase quickly and easily.
