Families must enroll in PowerSchool and log into PowerSchool to compete enrollment. Once you have registered your child the Office Staff will place them into the correct grade level.



School Begins Monday, August 18, 2025

School Hours: 8:45 AM-4:00 PM

Daily Attendance and timely arrival is essential for student success. Students may not be out of vehicles on school property or exit vehicles before 8:45 AM. Car riders and walkers will enter through the main entrance beginning at that time. For safety, adults must always remain in vehicles during drop-off and in control of their vehicles.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Morning Arrival (8:45 AM):

- Cars are released by assigned staff; students remain in vehicles until directed at 8:45 AM
- All students enter through the main entrance.
- Breakfast is served in the cafeteria from 8:45–9:00 AM. Students not eating breakfast report directly to their classrooms.

Dismissal (4:00 PM):

- Bus riders are escorted by staff.
- Car riders, daycare vans, and walkers are called for pickup at 4:00 PM.
- Parents must use the curbside car line. Please pull forward as directed for a safe and quick dismissal.
- All students must be picked up by 4:10 PM.

Early Dismissal for family appointments Ends at 3:30 PM:

• For safety and end-of-day transitions, no early dismissals will be permitted after this time.

Free Breakfast Program

Breakfast is available daily from 8:45–9:00 AM. Learning begins promptly at 9:00 AM. No late breakfast will be served.

School Uniform Policy—Outerwear will not be allowed to be worn over the uniform in classes or hallways this year. Full Uniforms must be always seen.

Uniforms are required daily.

Tops:

- Solid navy blue, powder blue, or white polo style shirts (no logos).
- Optional winter cardigan: solid logo free uniform colors, or Normandy-issued black cardigan with logo.
- Former Hunter Green Uniform Tops and Sweaters with the Normandy Logo will be allowed.

Bottoms:

- Tan/Navy khaki pants or skirts. No jeans or cutoffs. Former Normandy Logo khaki pants/skirts allowed.
- Students may wear a thin white, powder blue, or navy long-sleeved shirt under their uniform shirt.
- Outerwear (jackets, hoodies, coats) is not permitted inside the building.

Items Not Permitted:

- Head Wear Not allowed: Bonnets, scarves, wave caps, hats, bandanas, hoodies, head bands, etc.
- Shoes Types Not allowed: Crocs, slides, sandals, high heels, open-toe or open-heel shoes.
- Preferred Shoes: Tennis shoes.
- Winter hats/earmuffs may be worn outdoors but must be removed indoors.
