# SAFETY DRILL WEEK

## AUGUST 18-22

This week we will be conducting our first round of required safety drills. Our goal in teaching and practicing the procedures for these drills early, is to ensure that our students and staff know what to do in the event of an emergency. Teachers will spend time discussing and practicing what to do for each drill with their students prior to our practice drill.

**Monday  
August 18th**



**SECURE: Secure! Get inside. Lock outside doors**  
Why: Lockout is called when there is a threat or hazard outside of the school building. Whether it's due to violence or criminal activity in the immediate neighborhood, or a dangerous animal in the playground, Lockout uses the security of the physical facility to act as protection.

**Tuesday  
August 19th**



**SHELTER: SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.**  
Why: Shelter is called when the need for personal protection is necessary. Training should also include spontaneous events such as tornado, earthquake or hazmat.

**Wednesday  
August 20th**



**EVACUATION/Fire Drill: EVACUATE! To the announced location.**  
Why: Evacuate is called to move students and staff from one location to another. (Ex. Fire alarm has sounded.)

**Thursday  
August 21st**



**HOLD: HOLD! In your classroom. Clear the halls.**  
Why: There may be situations that require students to remain in their classrooms. For example, an altercation in the hallway may demand keeping students out of the halls until it is resolved.

**Friday  
August 22nd**



**LOCKDOWN: LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight.**  
Why: Lockdown is called when there is a threat or hazard inside the school building. From parental custody disputes to intruders to a weapon on campus, Lockdown uses classroom security to protect students and staff from threat.
