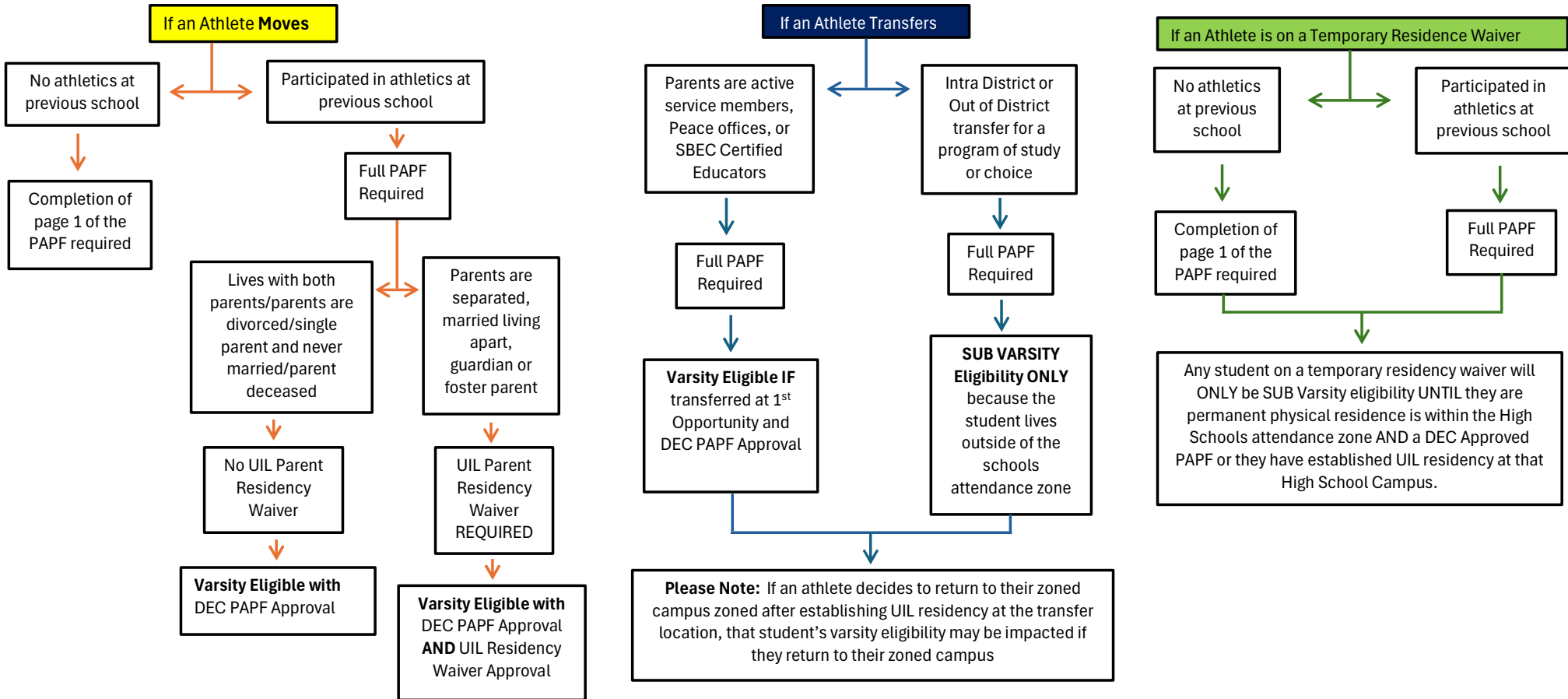


UIL Varsity Athletic Eligibility Flowchart



NOTE: ALL **NEW** Students to a high school attendance zone or feeder pattern, and student that reside outside the attendance zone needs a PAPF on file for SUB Varsity Competition



UIL Definitions

Move: A physical move of one’s residence from another school district into Pflugerville ISD or from one Pflugerville ISD high school attendance zone to another.

Transfer: Formal district approval to attend a high school not designated for one’s attendance zone. There is a change of schools without a change of address.

First Opportunity: First Opportunity” in reference to Section 442(h): If the first opportunity for a child to transfer to a new school occurs during a semester, the student is expected to at least start the next semester at the new school. Entry into the 9th grade is considered first opportunity.

Establishing UIL Residency at High School: The period of time (one calendar year) required by UIL varsity and Pflugerville ISD athletic rules before the student may participate in UIL Varsity athletics.

Primary Residency: Student athletes could be eligible for varsity athletics their first year of attendance if their parents have a bona fide residence (Section 442 [h]) within that school’s attendance zone.

Attendance Zone: A geographic area used by a school district to assign students to a school

Previous Athletic Participation Form (PAPF):This is a UIL required form for any new student athletes in grades 9-12. Any athlete that was not in the attendance zone of the high school they are enrolling in, during the previous school year, will need to complete this form.

District Executive Committee: Composed of the superintendents (or designees) of member schools competing in the assigned UIL playing district.

Sub-Varsity: Freshmen or Junior Varsity level

Residency Waiver: The waiver process is designed to give an opportunity to students who encounter hardships due to extenuating life changing circumstances. With this process in place, students that normally would be ineligible to participate in varsity contests, due to these involuntary or unavoidable circumstances, now are able to seek eligibility through one of the various waivers.
