GENERAL INFORMATION

At Mission Viejo Christian School, 2nd grade students begin each day with a time of pledges, prayer and worship, setting a Christ-centered foundation for learning. A biblical worldview is integrated throughout all core subjects, including math, science, language arts, social studies, and Bible. Enrichment classes—such as physical education, music, STEM, library, and art—are taught by specialized instructors who bring expertise and creativity to each discipline. To enhance learning through technology, iPads and Chromebooks are used in the classroom.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Chapel & Missions

Students at Mission Viejo Christian School attend chapel each Friday, where they participate in age-appropriate worship and hear practical, biblically grounded messages. Living a Christ-centered life is modeled through serving and loving others as the hands and feet of Jesus. MVCS also offers meaningful, school-wide and classroom-based mission opportunities that help students grow in compassion and develop servant hearts.

SOCIAL SKILLS

As part of a school-wide focus, Mission Viejo Christian School emphasizes Christian character development, manners, relational skills, and biblical conflict resolution. The School Counselor supports this initiative by visiting classrooms to teach age-appropriate lessons on communication, emotional regulation, and resolving conflict through the lens of Scripture.

ACADEMICS

English Language Arts

Students build foundational literacy skills through phonics, spelling, vocabulary (including prefixes, root words, and suffixes), and parts of speech. They develop reading fluency and comprehension using texts matched to their individual reading needs, and strengthen writing by composing clear paragraphs with a main idea and supporting details.

Mathematics

Students develop a strong understanding of place value, number sense to 1,000, and strategies for addition and subtraction with regrouping. They explore time, money, measurement, and basic geometry, and are introduced to concepts of multiplication, division, and fractions. Hands-on manipulatives and technology, including Chromebooks, support conceptual understanding and problem-solving skills.

Science

Students explore key concepts in life science (plants, vertebrates, and invertebrates), physical science (energy, force and motion, and simple machines), and earth science (rocks). Learning is enhanced through hands-on activities and experiments that promote inquiry and curiosity.

Social Studies

Students study America's past, culture, and traditions, while also exploring global communities. They learn about geography, government, basic economic principles, and develop skills in interpreting graphs, charts, maps, and globes.

By studying worldview alongside apologetics, students gain greater confidence in Christ and develop the ability to care for others by thoughtfully addressing objections to Christianity and sharing compelling reasons for their faith.
