LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 have enjoyed learning to tell the time this week! They have been working hard on telling the time to the hour and half past on analogue clocks! They have also been doing lots of computing this week and have enjoyed using beetbots

The multiplication tables check results have been issued and we are incredibly proud of our Year 4 children. The average score was 23 out of 25, which is above the national average and our highest average as a school. Almost half of the children received full marks. The scores have been written into the children's planners to share at home. We would encourage all the children to keep working on their times tables over the summer ready for Year 5 Maths.

Reception enjoyed their transition day in Year 1 with Mrs Dewar and had fun exploring the classroom. They focussed in the story Farmer Duck and completed some Maths, English and role play activities about the book. When back in Reception, we spent time talking about different emotions we are feeling with these changes and wrote some sentences about they did in Year 1. Ask me: What did you do in Year 1?
