 - Guide students in finding, evaluating and selecting appropriate text.
 - Identify parts of a book e.g., title, author, and parts of text e.g., beginning, end, details.
 - Read aloud grade appropriate texts and facilitate discussions to identify parts of book and major events in a story in chronological order.
 - Identify text features to locate key facts or information in a text.
 - Utilize a variety of print to read, view, listen and discuss the objective and make inferences to gather meaning.
