In Our Schools...

Student Vendor Fair

On April 5, more than 50 students from all Tri-Valley schools as well as few students from neighboring districts, took that courageous leap, showcasing their talents at Dresden Elementary PTO's first-ever student vendor fair. The PTO created this event to give students a chance to show off their skills, earn some money, and learn real-world lessons and it delivered on all counts. Open to students ages 5 to 18, the fair featured a wide variety of vendors and products: 3D-printed mugs and fidgets, freeze-dried candy, photography, jewelry, baked goods, pottery, and more. The Farm

Frazesburg Elementary second graders visited The Farm at Walnut Creek. It is a working Amish farm with daily farming activities, such as plowing, planting, harvesting, thrashing, and more. They toured the non-electric farm house and were treated to freshly baked chocolate chip cookies.

The farm has more than 500 exotic animals such as giraffes, camels, zebras, and kangaroos along with more common animals like horses, llamas, buffalo, and deer. They had the opportunity to view and hand-feed the animals from a horse-drawn wagon.



The Works

Dresden Elementary first grade students visited The Works in Newark, Ohio on March 21st. They learned about states of matter and completed a hands-on experiment to watch the transformation of solid, liquid, and gas states. They were also able to explore things from the past and have a hands-on learning center to build circuits, build vehicles, and learn other of other science related materials. They also visited the sci-dome where they learned about how birds are related to dinosaurs from the past.

Second grade classes of Adamsville Elementary also attended a field trip to The Works. They were able to explore both the history and science parts of the museum. In the history portion, they learned about technology and life in the past. Students sat in the plane of the first ever woman, Jerrie Mock, to circumnavigate the globe on a solo flight. In the science portion, they enjoyed hands-on exploration with electricity, microscopes, and forces in motion. Students built their own car creations, then raced them down a ramp. They also experienced a glassblowing demonstration and visiting the sci-dome, where they learned about space and the stars in the night sky. It was a great day!



Real Money - Real World

Real Money, Real World. (RMRW) is a youth-centered financial literacy program offered through the Ohio State University Extension. Its success is built on the collaborative efforts of Extension educators, local school teachers, and dedicated community volunteers. The program features an engaging, hands-on spending simulation where students make lifestyle and budgeting decisions similar to those faced by adults in their mid to late twenties. In preparation, Middle School students complete four classroom lessons covering topics such as gross vs. net income, budgeting, spending priorities, saving, interest rates, and insurance premiums. The simulation itself takes place in the gym, where students move through various booths to either make payments or collect earnings and deposits. Throughout the experience, they record all transactions in a checking account register to track their financial decisions. A big thank you to all of the district and community volunteers whose support makes this program possible!



The Wilds

On May 5th, Nashport Elementary third grade classes went to The Wilds to observe animal adaptations. Along with the open air tour to see all of the animals, they walked around the carnivore area looking at Dholes, African Painted Dogs, and Cheetahs. These animals were a huge hit! On the tour, students saw animals such as Southern White Rhinos, Sichuan Takins, Grevy's Zebras, and Ostriches. To prepare or reflect on the trip, students were asked to complete an animal research project. This allowed them to dive deeper into animal adaptations, habitats, species, and all things animals. Students were able to answer questions like "What makes an animal a mammal", "Which animals are herbivores", "Why is the ostrich an omnivore", etc. The students loved this trip and asked to do it again!



AIM

The Lady Dawgs Soccer, Volleyball and Basketball teams donated their time to AIM Outreach in Frazeytsburg packing over 1,000 lunches to feed kids in the community over the summer.



JA BizTown

On May 12th and 13th, Nashport Elementary students went to JA BizTown in Newark. 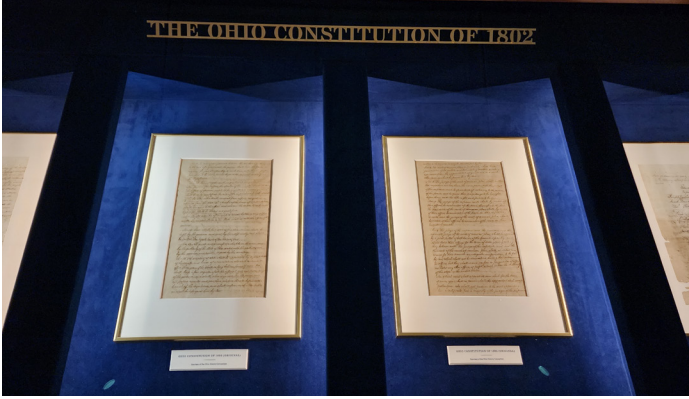
Bunny HOP 5K

Students were amazed that the home had four floors and how the family was one of the few with an indoor well to help in aiding runaway slaves making their way North.

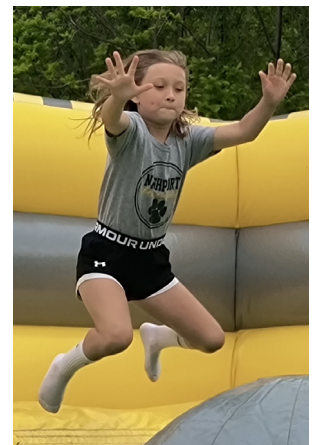


Field Day Fun!

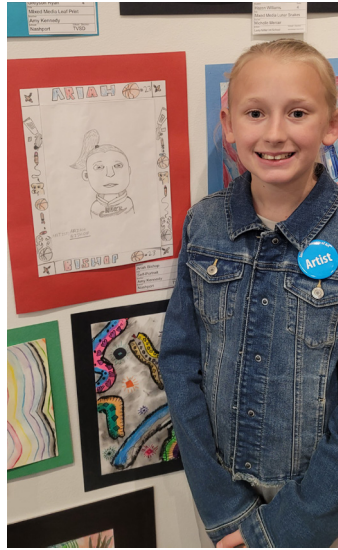

Hannah Tezen - Louis Armstrong Award

The Louis Armstrong Award, sometimes the King Bee Award, is the "top senior jazz award" or highest level interscholastic award given to students at high schools in the United States. It is given in recognition of "outstanding musical achievement and an incredible dedication to the program".

Leah Patrick - Leonard Bernstein Award

The Leonard Bernstein Musicianship Award honors students whose musical contributions, dedication, and creativity set them apart as deserving of the highest recognition for their achievements. In his long career, Bernstein made an indelible mark on the musical world as a conductor, composer, and teacher.

Mackenzie Bain - Band Directors Award

The Band Directors Award honors outstanding members of the junior or senior high school band. It's typically given to students who demonstrate exceptional musicianship, leadership, dedication, and contribution to the band. The award highlights a student's commitment and positive influence on the ensemble.

The Tri-Valley FFA officers attended District Eight Officer training where they learned how to run their chapter properly and develop a team atmosphere.

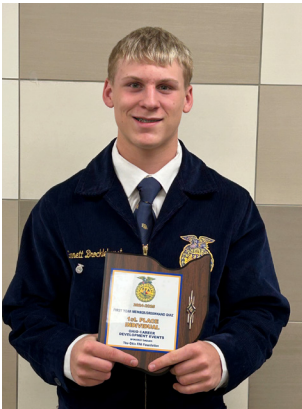


State Convention & State Degrees

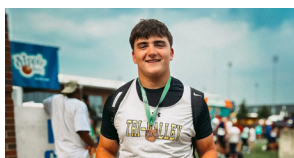
