Notan Art Project

Notan (濃淡) is a design concept from Japan tied to the Taoist symbol yin and yang. Notan focuses on the harmony between light and shadow, helping to show the balance of positive and negative space.

Try out this fun project that can be scaled up or back depending on your skill levels!

MATERIALS:

- Paper
- Pencil
- Scissors or a craft knife
- Glue stick

1. **Grab two pieces of paper.** You can use black and white, complementary colors like orange and blue, or even Edina school colors—green and white!
2. **Draw a line down the center of one of your pieces of paper lightly with pencil.** This will be your mirror line.
3. **Using your pencil, draw shapes starting from one edge of your other piece of paper.** These shapes can be organic or geometric. Anything your imagination can come up with!
4. **Start to cut out your shapes and glue them to your piece of paper with the centerline.** Alternate which side of the line you are gluing your shapes on, but make sure the edges of your shapes line up with your centerline.
5. **Once everything is glued once, erase your pencil lines and admire your new artwork!**

Coming Full Circle

Sam Burkhardt's 20-Year Journey with Kids Club

For Sam Burkhardt, Kids Club isn't just a workplace—it's been a second home for more than two decades. Currently a Site Lead with Kids Club, Sam represents a remarkable success story of how after-school programs can shape childhood experiences and entire career paths.

"I was a participant in Cornelia Kids Club myself starting in kindergarten," Sam explains. "I was in Kids Club and Surge (Community Ed's middle school after school program in the early 2000's) every day growing up until I was 14." What began as a necessary solution for working parents transformed into a passion that would define Sam's professional life.

At 14, Sam's relationship with Kids Club evolved as he began volunteering after school daily from 3:45-6:00 PM. "I got my first Volunteer Service Letter when I volunteered for Kids Club," he recalls, noting how these early experiences sparked his interest in education. By 16, Sam had earned his first employee badge, marking the official start of his career with the program.

Even during his college years, Sam maintained his connection to Kids Club. "I always worked on breaks. Every summer and winter break I was always here subbing and working," he shares. "I never really left because I always let Kids Club know I was ready to help when I was home." Following the pandemic, Sam returned as a full-time employee and within a year advanced to his current leadership position.

What keeps someone dedicated to a single program for over 20 years? For Sam, it's the meaningful relationships and positive impact. "I like the social connection with the kids.

You get to help them grow and help them succeed and see them grow as a person because of the values we help instill," he explains.

There's also the unique perspective Sam brings to his role. "My past experience as a participant helps give me a different relatable experience," he notes. "I see both the kid and staff side of situations, which helps me bring a unique perspective."

In his day-to-day work, Sam thrives in the busy atmosphere. "I really enjoy the chaos of the afternoons," he admits with enthusiasm. "From check-ins to snack to activities—I like hearing my name called and running around all over the place."

Perhaps most rewarding for Sam has been witnessing the program's cycle continue as former participants return as staff members. "With being here 10 years now, I have seen kids who have come back as staff, which has been really fun for me to see," he shares.

When asked why he's chosen Kids Club as his career path, Sam's answer is refreshingly simple: "I get paid to have fun with kids everyday. Even though there's so much more that goes behind it to ensure safety and organization, at the end of the day, the majority of it is having fun! If I am having fun, the kids are having fun."

Sam Burkhardt's journey from kindergartner to Site Lead exemplifies the profound impact that quality after-school programs can have—not just on children's development, but on shaping dedicated education professionals who understand firsthand the importance of creating spaces where young people can belong, grow, and thrive.

High School Volunteers Make a Difference at the Edina Early Learning Center

In the bustling halls of the Edina Early Learning Center, two freshman students from Edina High School have found a special way to make a difference. Emma Griffing and Sabrine Bahi volunteer weekly with preschoolers as part of the Edina Public Schools Community Volunteer Program, creating meaningful connections while earning volunteer hours toward their EHS Community Service Letter.

Both Emma and Sabrine discovered the program through family connections—Emma from her brother who had previously earned his letter, and Sabrine from friends' older siblings who had participated in the program. Both students were drawn to the Early Learning Center because of their love for working with children.

The two freshmen have established a consistent volunteering routine, arriving at the center every Thursday after school for a few hours. “We just come straight from school, we usually carpool together,” Sabrine notes, highlighting how they've integrated this commitment into their weekly schedule.

During their volunteer sessions, Emma and Sabrine engage with three- to five-year olds in various activities based on the children's interests. “If we are in the gym, we play with them. Either some activities with balls such as soccer or we can read books with them,” Emma describes. “Or if they are in the ‘Butterfly Room,’ they chill and do whatever they want. For example, I was hanging out with Bo and his dinosaurs, so we adapt and play with them and whatever they want to do.”

Hide and seek has become a particular favorite. “In the gym we do a lot of hide and seek, that's one of our favorites!” Sabrine says enthusiastically. “Sometimes tag, or they just want to crawl all over, but it's so fun!”

The experience has been rewarding for both students, who highly recommend it to their peers. “It's really fun and it's really rewarding to get to play with all these kids and get to learn about their lives,” Emma reflects. Sabrine adds that it's “a nice way to have fun every week with little kids and still earn your service hours at the same time.”



Both freshmen are already looking forward to continuing their volunteer work at the Early Learning Center. "I would definitely come back here. I really like it, it's so fun, and I want to be able to come more than once a week," Emma says. Sabine agrees and mentions she's even "working on my summer application!"

Their impact extends beyond just fulfilling service hours. As Community Education and Strategic Partnerships Director Anne Marie Leland, Ed.D., points out: "These high school volunteers like Emma and Sabine also need to know that they themselves bring a sense of belonging, and a sense of community to our little kids here at the Early Learning Center. I think that is so impactful for them to know that they have these high schoolers in their lives. You are such great role models to these young students."



Through their weekly commitment, Emma and Sabine exemplify how giving back to the community can be both meaningful and enjoyable, creating lasting connections across generations in their community.

High School Volunteer Opportunities

High School student volunteers provide support throughout the school year in numerous different programs and schools within EPS. Community Service Letter Program

Edina High School students entering grades 9-12 can earn a letter in Community Service. Students can earn a letter by making a difference by serving their community and others.

Here are the steps required to earn a Community Service Letter:

1. Join the Community Service Letter Schoology page (September)
2. Attend an in-person orientation (October)
3. Complete an application (due mid-December)
4. Complete 120 hours of service with at least 60 hours addressing a specific social issue. Hours must be completed by early April 2026 (deadline TBA)
5. By the April deadline, students will submit the following materials on Schoology:
 - Hours log demonstrating 120 hours of service
 - One letter of recommendation from a supervisor with an organization you volunteered with
 - Create a Creative Reflection artifact that represents your service work
6. Share your creative artifact and service experiences in a reflection session with your peers (April/May 2026).

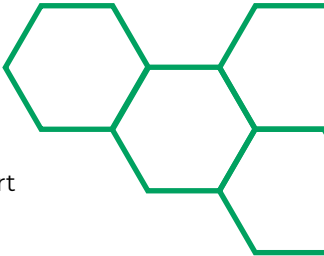

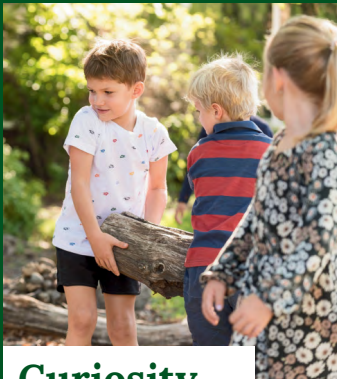

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 small Granny Smith Apple
- 3 tablespoons melted butter
- ¼ cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon apple pie spice
- 1 8-ounce can crescent roll dough
- ½ cup pecans chopped

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 375 F
2. Slice the apple into 8 slices and remove the core
3. Pour melted butter into a bowl, and then add the apple slices and toss to coat. Set aside.
4. In a small bowl, combine the brown sugar with the apple pie spice. Set aside.
5. Cover a baking sheet with parchment paper. Open the can of crescent roll dough and separate the triangles. Lay the triangles out flat on the prepared baking sheet.
6. Top each triangle of dough evenly with the brown sugar mixture and chopped pecans.
7. Place one wedge of apple on its side on the wide end of each dough triangle. Roll the dough around the apple.
8. Brush each roll with the remaining melted butter and sprinkle with a small amount of apple pie spice or cinnamon.
9. Bake at 375 F for 10-12 minutes until golden brown. Cool slightly before serving.

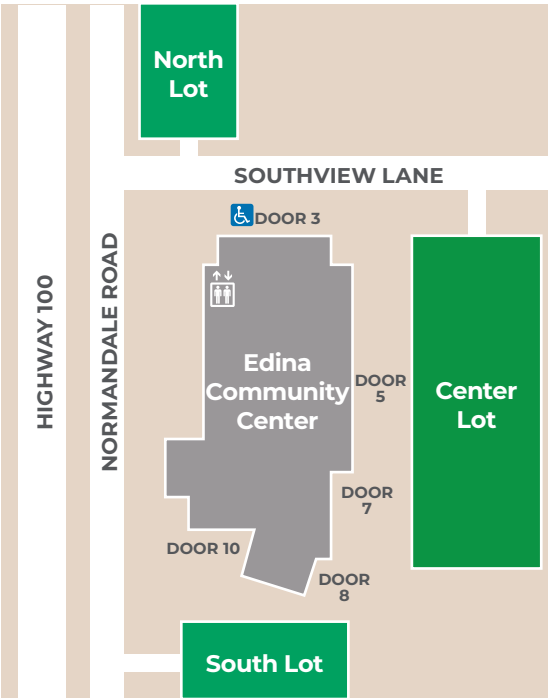

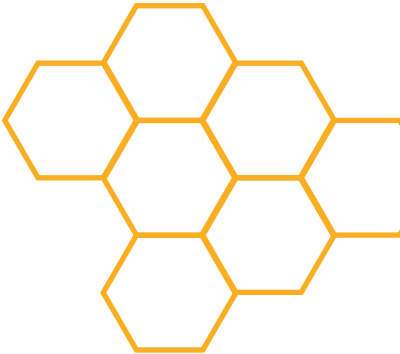
