Fairless Local School Food Service ensures that the Fairless Local School District meets the nutrition standards regarding the sale of "ala carte" items and beverages for sale during the regular school day (which is defined as the period from midnight before, to 30 minutes after the end of the official school day). Enforcement does not affect foods and beverages sold in connection with school-sponsored fundraisers or other events outside of the regular school day or in conjunction with interscholastic athletic events. Whereas, this Board then advertised the positions as being available to certificated individuals not employed by the district, and thereafter received applications from the following individuals who are experienced and otherwise qualified to serve in the position.

Be it therefore resolved, that the following individuals be employed under extra- curricular contracts in said positions for the school 2025-2026 year at the stipend amount for such positions as set forth in the current negotiated agreement, contingent upon satisfactory completion of the BCI/FBI criminal records check as required by law. Said coaches shall also have the necessary first aid training and CPR and/or other coaching requirements completed prior to beginning of season:
