THE NURSES' CORNER

Two registered nurses staff the health room full-time, Monday – Friday from 7:00am - 3:30pm

The Health Room is located down the hallway between classrooms 5 and 6. The nurses are on campus to support our students' mental and physical health needs, focusing on "wellness" and personal responsibility. Our nurses provide first aid, health counseling, and educational programs. If it is not an emergency, students should come to the Health Room during passing periods, breaks, or lunch to avoid missed class time. We ask that the nurse evaluate students before contacting her parent or guardian if she is not feeling well. In addition, Rosary Academy has three CPR/First Aid certified American Red Cross instructors on campus.

Medications

All medications must be kept in the Health Room at all times. Students are not allowed to carry medications on themselves, in their backpacks, lockers, or cars. Students with asthma/allergies (provided proper documentation is completed in the Health Room) may carry an inhaler or EpiPen with them. Still, it is also highly recommended to keep an extra Inhaler/EpiPen in the Health Room in case of an emergency. All students are required to have a completed & up to date "Student Health History Form" & "Parent/Healthcare Provider Request Form" turned into the Nurse's Office.

Immunization

To enter into Rosary Academy, incoming freshmen and transfer students must have immunizations that meet the California School Immunization Law, Health and Safety Code Sections 120325-120380. Incoming Freshmen and students transferring from out of the country, whose immunization record has not been received by the new school at the time of admission, the school may admit the child for up to 30 school days. If the immunization record has not been received at the end of this period, the school shall exclude the pupil until the parent or guardian provides documentation of compliance with the requirements. Under a 2011 California law, all California high school students must be vaccinated against pertussis (whooping cough). For 9th-12th graders, at least one dose of the "Tdap" booster (pertussis-containing vaccine) is required on or after the 7th birthday.

Change in Medical Conditions

Please contact the Nurses in the Health Room if there are any changes in your daughter's health condition. This includes but is not limited to concussions, sprains, broken bones, a new medical diagnosis, injuries, change in or addition of a medication, or a recent or upcoming surgery.

Students should feel well enough to participate in all classroom activities when coming to school. If she is suffering from an active illness, she is advised to stay home in order to protect other students and staff from possible disease transmission. If your student develops a fever or is sent home from school with a temperature of 99.0 or higher, she must be free of fever for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicine before returning to campus.
