



School Bus Transportation for NHCS Specialty Schools

How Does It Work?

The Transportation Department is pleased to offer service to eligible students who attend specialty programs. Morning Transportation

When Traditional high schools (Ashley/Hoggard/Laney/New Hanover) are in session:

- 1- Students ride a bus to their in-district Traditional high school.
- 2- At the high school, an NHCS Shuttle Bus transports students to their specialty school.
- 3- Students in the walk zone of their in-district school walk to their district high school to board the Shuttle Bus. This will be their bus stop to and from specialty schools.
- 4- Students not in the walk zone, who don't ride a bus to their district high school and want to take the Shuttle Bus to their specialty school, must fill out a Transportation as an Alternate Stop Exception Form provided by their school. Once approved, the student is assigned a Shuttle Bus from their in-district Traditional high school.
- 5- WEC/SEA-TECH students who live in the Laney district are "in-district" for their specialty school and are bussed directly to and from their schools.
- 6- WEC/SEA-TECH students within New Hanover High School's district board specialty schools' shuttles from the Career Readiness Academy at Mosley.

When Traditional high schools are not in session:

- 1- A community stop is assigned to students nearest their home. Students are driven directly to their specialty school.
- 2- Stop times are different than when riding on Traditional calendar days. Specialty schools notify their students of the time change a few days prior. Buses do not track on the Parent Portal App.
- 3- Isaac Bear students take a bus directly to the community stop nearest their home.

Afternoon Transportation

When Traditional high schools are in session:

- 1- WEC/SEA-TECG students board the Shuttle Bus to the transfer site, Hoggard High School, where students then board their assigned bus to the community stop nearest their home. Those who live in the Laney district are bussed directly to their community stop.
- 2- WEC/SEA-TECH students who are in the walk zone for Hoggard will have a stop at Hoggard.
- 3- Isaac Bear students take the bus from Isaac Bear to the community stop nearest their home.

When Traditional high schools are not in session:

- 1- Students are driven directly from their specialty school to the community stop nearest their home. Buses do not track on the Parent Portal App.
