Basic Access to Homeless
Education and Community Support
Students experiencing
homelessness and their families
may be eligible for up to five nights
of hotel accommodations, based on
availability. Families must be
registered in school and meet
McKinney-Vento eligibility
requirements. We will also connect
families with local community
agencies for additional support and
resources, which may be available
based on individual needs.
