Subject: Graduation Requirements

Liberty Adult Education

The Governing Board desires to prepare all students to successfully complete the high school course of study and obtain a diploma that represents their educational achievement and increases their opportunities for postsecondary education and employment.

District students shall complete graduation course requirements as specified in Education Code 51225.3. Unless exempted as provided in "Exemptions from District-Adopted Graduation Requirements," district students shall also complete other course requirements adopted by the Board. Students who are exempted from district-adopted graduation requirements shall be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and school activity related to graduation in which other students are eligible to participate.

Where a course is applicable to more than one subject area requirement, the units will be counted only once.

Course Requirements

To obtain a high school diploma, students shall complete at least the following courses in grades 9-12, with each course being one year unless otherwise specified:

1. Four courses in English (Education Code 51225.3)
2. Two courses in mathematics (Education Code 51225.3)

Students shall complete at least one mathematics course that meets the state academic content standards for Algebra I or Mathematics I. Students may complete such coursework prior to grade 9 provided that they also complete two mathematics courses in grades 9-12. (Education Code 51224.5)

Successful completion of an approved computer science course that is classified as a "category C" course based on the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) "A-G" admission requirements shall be counted toward the satisfaction of additional graduation requirements in mathematics. (Education Code 51225.3, 51225.35)

3. Two courses in science, including biological and physical sciences (Education Code 51225.3)
4. Three courses in social studies, including United States (U.S.) history and geography; world history, culture, and geography; a one-semester course in American government and civics; and a one-semester course in economics. (Education Code 51225.3)

A student who completes a one-semester personal finance course requirement may elect to be exempt from the one-semester economics course requirements commencing in the 2030-31 school year. (Education Code 51225.3)

5. Beginning with the 2030-31 school year, a one-semester course in personal finance (Education Code 51225.3)
6. One course in visual or performing arts, or world language. For purposes of this requirement, a course in American Sign Language shall be deemed a course in world language (Education Code 51225.3)

7. Two courses in physical education, unless the student has been otherwise exempted pursuant to other sections of the Education Code (Education Code 51225.3)
8. Beginning with the 2029-30 school year, a one-semester course in ethnic studies (Education Code 51225.3)
9. A one-semester course in health education.
10. 145 units must be completed in accordance with the content or subject area minimum requirement indicated in the basic requirement chart below. Beginning with the 2029-2030 school year, 150 units will be required.
11. 145 units are required, in grades 9 through 12, to qualify for a diploma of graduation. Beginning with the 2029-2030 school year, 150 units will be required.

To qualify for a diploma from Liberty Adult Education, a student must earn 145 semester units in grades 9-12. All one hundred and forty-five semester units must be met in accordance with the subject area requirements indicated below:

*Ethnic Studies graduation requirement. Beginning with the 2029-30 school year, students will complete a one-semester 5-unit course in ethnic studies.

**Personal Finance graduation requirements will be included as a graduation requirement for the 2030-31 school year. Commencing with students graduating in the 2030-31 school year, a student who completes a one-semester personal finance course requirement may elect to be exempt from the one-semester economics course requirement.

Supplemental Sources

Students may qualify for credit in the above categories through supplemental sources as per administrative regulations.

1. Public or private secondary school credits
2. Community College credits
3. Instruction taken in foreign countries
4. Work experience
5. Armed Forces Service

Residency Requirement:

Completion of a minimum of 10 units in residence at Liberty Union High School District Adult School in order to graduate from that school. Appeals for exception to this policy may be approved by the Director of Alternative Education under special circumstances.

Fourth Year Limitation:

Students may earn no more than 90 units from all sources in the calendar year prior to their graduation (September - June). Appeals for exception to this policy may be approved by the Director of Alternative Education under special circumstances.
