
## Initial Eligibility Webinar



Division I schools require you to meet academic standards. To be eligible to practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship in your first year of full-time enrollment, you must meet all the following requirements:



Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the following areas:



10 of the 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits (including 7 in English, Math, or Science) must be completed before the start of senior year

Minimum 2.3 core-course GPA - use worksheet to help calculate core-course GPA
