



UPPER SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Student dress is to be neat, clean, and appropriate for the school environment. The following expectations describe appropriate dress.

All clothing must be appropriate for school as determined by the administration. Clothing may not include foul language or offensive pictures. **Hats, spaghetti straps and tank tops are not permitted. Neither undergarments nor the midriff should be visible.** Sheer items that reveal undergarments are similarly prohibited. Special consideration should be given to footwear requirements in science labs (refer to lab safety expectations).

Students who are uncertain about dress should inquire in advance of a faculty member or the Dean of Students. Final determination of appropriate dress rests completely with the Head of School, Head of Upper School and the Dean of Students. A student who is NOT dressed appropriately will be given detention. Repeated dress violations will result in a conference with parents and the Dean of Students and additional disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from the school or non-renewal for future academic years.

Dress Days:

On announced Dress Days, students are expected to dress up. Students should wear clothing that they would wear to a professional interview.

Theme Days:

On announced days, a theme is provided and encouraged. On Theme Days, the “general rules” of daily dress code still apply; however students and faculty are encouraged to dress in the theme of the day.
