Re: Opposition to Proposal to Close Friendship School

Dear Members of the Pittsburgh Public School Board,

On behalf of the Friendship Community Group, we write to express our strong opposition to the proposal to close the Friendship School and transfer its Montessori program.

The Friendship School, which sits in the heart of the Friendship neighborhood, is currently home to the PPS Montessori PreK-5; a thriving, vibrant school program. Built in 1899, the school is an architectural gem designed for quality education and filled with functional beauty and charm that make it an ideal Montessori learning environment. Many of the students walk and bike to school, but families come from across the district to be a part of the highly sought-after learning environment.

In addition to being a beloved learning space, the Friendship School is the beating heart of our community. The historic school and ample grounds provide an essential space for the surrounding neighborhoods to gather, play, recreate and perform civic duties. The beloved play park, built by Friendship Community Group, serves as a public amenity and a testament to the strong community involvement that surrounds the school. **Closing the school would not simply reassign students- it would dismantle a vital institution that supports the health, safety, and vibrancy of the surrounding area.**

It is well documented that school closures inflict deep and lasting harm on communities. They erode social cohesion, reduce civic engagement, weaken neighborhood safety, and depress economic vitality. A 2011 Pew Charitable Trusts study on school closures found that shuttered schools led to higher neighborhood crime, declining property values, and increased blight. Empty school buildings became liabilities—not savings—and many districts failed to realize any meaningful financial gain. Furthermore, selling or repurposing school buildings tends to be extremely difficult and often unsuccessful, therefore making shuttered schools a source of blight and vandalism. ([Pew, 2011](#))

Friendship Community Group envisions a brighter future. One that not only keeps our school open, but invests in its success as a shining star in the district - further enhancing a beloved and highly sought after program for more students in the district, while maintaining a vital community asset and strengthening the East End community of Pittsburgh.

Instead of shuttering the Friendship School, we urge the Board to:

1. **Keep the Montessori program in the Friendship School.** Treat the Friendship School as an asset, investing in its renovation and expansion to enrich—not relocate—the Montessori program.
2. **Explore grants and public–private partnerships** to fund accessibility upgrades and repairs—resources are out there and our community is ready to help. Allow FCG and neighborhood stakeholders to help the district pursue funding sources.
3. **Include the community meaningfully in future planning decisions.** FCG and the Friendship community deserve a seat at the table in determining the building's future. It is essential that PPS commit to maintaining and preserving the Friendship School, and all of its buildings, and include FCG in decisions that would impact the community.

As stewards of our neighborhood, it is the duty of FCG to serve in the best interest of our residents. Likewise, your obligation as members of the School Board is not only to manage budgets, but to make decisions that serve the best interests of your constituents—the families, children, and taxpayers of Pittsburgh. As stewards of the public trust, you are accountable for protecting the infrastructure and institutions that strengthen our neighborhoods and our diverse city.

Enclosed you will find letters from our council members, an assessment of the proposed renovation budget for the school, and a petition signed by 377 school and community stakeholders opposing the closure of the school. Friendship Community Group is invested, organized, and prepared to work alongside you in preserving and strengthening the Friendship School for the continued housing of the Montessori program. We firmly believe that the Friendship School is worth the investment and we hope you will act in the best interest of the students, families, and taxpayers who depend on it.

To the Members of the Pittsburgh Public School Board,

I am writing to register my opposition to the proposed closure of the Friendship School and the relocation of the Montessori program currently housed there. As a City Councilmember representing the Friendship neighborhood, I am deeply concerned about the negative impact this move would have—not just on students and families, but on the broader health and safety of the neighborhood and surrounding areas.

Assessment of Renovation Estimates for Pittsburgh Montessori at Friendship School

This report examines the renovation cost estimates for Friendship Montessori School as outlined in the 2025 PPS General Fund Budget. Upon reviewing comparable estimates for similar facilities within the same document, there is substantial evidence to suggest that the projected renovation costs for Friendship are significantly inflated. This discrepancy raises questions about the accuracy of the projections and the rationale used to justify potential school closures.

According to the budget, the renovation costs for the Friendship facility total **\$16.57 million** between 2025 and 2027. This includes:

- \$13.5 million for general renovations, elevator installation, and air conditioning
- \$301,300 for building automation controls
- \$130,000 for emergency generator replacement
- \$1.68 million for design and permitting
- \$842,478 in contingency/change orders

This figure is second only to Brashear High School, a significantly larger facility, and vastly exceeds the budget allocated to similarly sized or more complex schools. For comparison:

- **Arsenal**, undergoing HVAC replacement, electrical panel upgrades, and related improvements, is budgeted at **\$4.4 million**, nearly a third of the Friendship allocation.
- **Brookline**, which includes air conditioning installation, emergency generator replacement, and other improvements is projected at **\$3.2 million**.
- **University Prep**, a secondary facility receiving HVAC and mechanical upgrades, is slated for a total of **\$5.76 million** in improvements.*

Additionally, Friendship's architectural and engineering fees alone amount to **\$1.68 million**, a figure disproportionately high compared to similar projects. The uniform annual allocation of \$4.5 million (\$13.5 million in total) for general renovations over three years lacks clarity and appears to be a rough guess rather than based on itemized assessments.

Furthermore, according to the building capacities data on page 334 of the budget, the Linden school can only house a mere 31 additional students over the existing Friendship school.

If we apply the same methodology used in estimating the renovation of Linden, and compare that to industry-standard renovation costs, the projected cost for the Friendship building could be substantially lower - just under **\$5.4 million**.

This revised projection, based on PPS precedent and square-foot cost metrics, suggests that the current budgeted amount for Friendship is **over three times** the likely actual cost of necessary renovations.*

In comparison, the Linden building renovation costs are estimated at \$5.2 million. Adding on the cost to move from one facility to another (\$12psf at a total of \$400,000) brings the total cost to move the Montessori school to Linden to approximately \$5.6 million.

Therefore, keeping the Montessori program in Friendship could **avoid an estimated \$200,000 in costs.**

Given the discrepancies found in this study, it is reasonable to question whether the estimated renovation costs are being used to justify closure or relocation rather than to support honest investment. The data strongly suggests the need for an independent review to ensure that public funds are allocated fairly and decisions are made transparently.

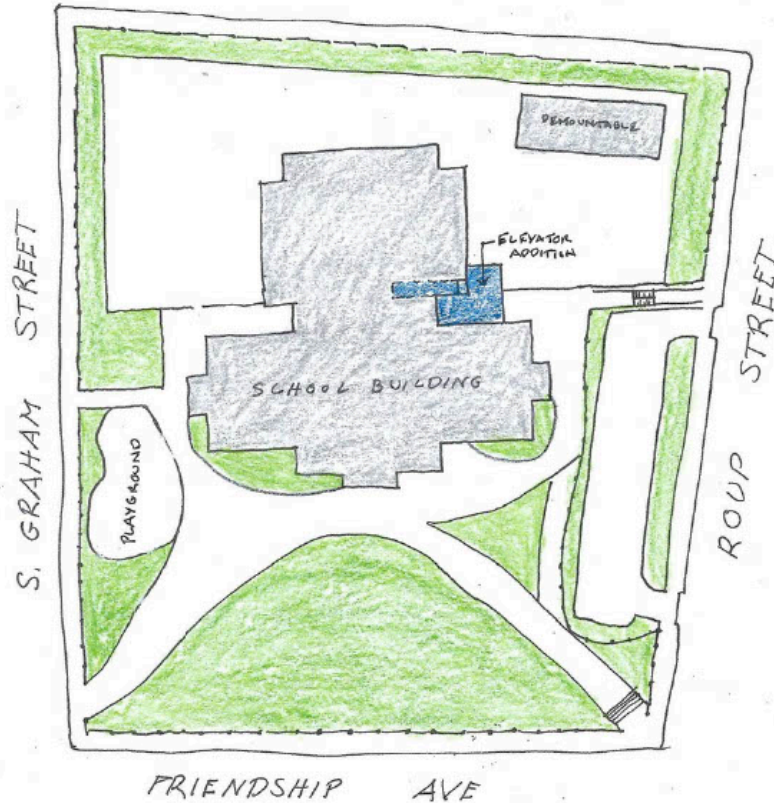
Before moving forward with any decision regarding the Montessori program’s relocation or the future of the Friendship facility, it is strongly recommended that the district:

- Reassess the cost projections using a third-party estimator;
- Require itemized breakdowns for high-budget renovations;
- Apply consistent cost metrics across facilities of similar size and condition.

Friendship School Proposed Elevator Addition



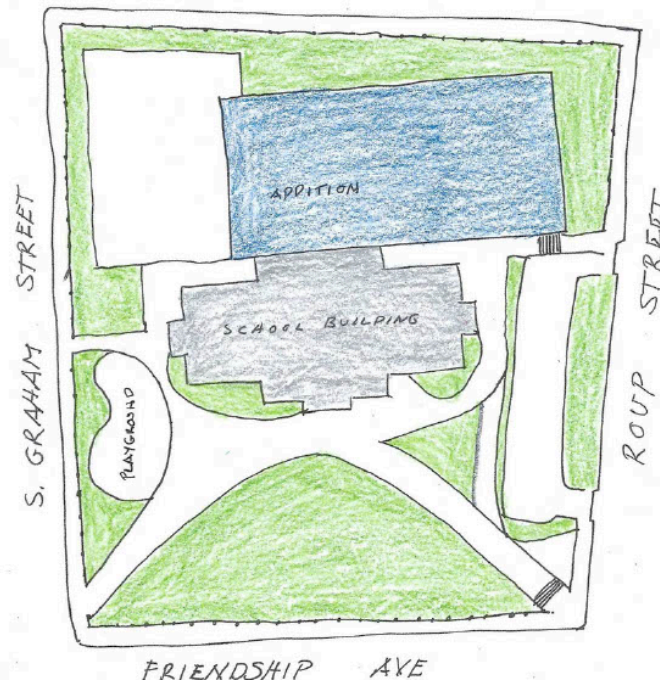

This proposal includes a modest 1,800 sq. ft. elevator addition designed to meet the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) and City of Pittsburgh accessibility compliance standards. The addition provides direct entry from the ground level into either the existing gym or the elevator itself. The elevator would serve the basement, first floor (which will be accessible via a short corridor connecting to the central hallway) and the second floor.

To preserve the integrity of the building's historic facade, the new structure would be set back from the existing exterior walls. Access to the main building would be achieved through existing gym entrances, by modifying the gym facade, or by utilizing current window openings within the historic structure.

Proposed Improvements: Option B

This proposal offers an opportunity to double the size of the existing facility with a large new construction addition to the rear of the historic school. There are two options, both of which include a new gym/performance space. One option is a new two story 44,600 sq. foot building. The second option is to build a 67,700 square foot three story addition. Both of these options would not disturb the historic structure of the existing building as the new addition would only touch the existing building where the current gym is already located.

This proposal presents an opportunity to double the size of the existing facility through a substantial new addition located at the rear of the historic school building. Two design options could be considered, each incorporating a new gymnasium/performance space:

- **Option 1:** A two-story, 44,600 sq. ft. addition
- **Option 2:** A three-story, 67,700 sq. ft. addition

Both options are designed to preserve the historic integrity of the original structure. The new construction would connect only at the site of the existing gym, minimizing impact on the historic facade and architecture. Each addition would include an elevator with the capacity to serve all levels of the existing building, improving accessibility and functionality.
