# What is Dual Enrollment?

- Earn college credit while attending high school classes
- Taught on the high school campus by college certified high school teachers
- Class taught at the college level
- An opportunity for eligible students to earn lower-division college credits that will be required for an Associate's or Bachelor's degree
- Credits transfer to most colleges and universities

### Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- Credit is based on the grade received in the class, not one test taken at the end of the year
- Saves Time Complete lower-division college credits that satisfy general education requirements = don't take these same classes in college, and take courses within your major area of study sooner
- Saves Money Save 80% in tuition by earning the credit at your high school rather than taking the course at university. No additional expenses (books, parking).
- Builds Confidence- Learn about how college works, start college a few credits ahead with an established GPA

### Costs

- In-state tuition rate is \$97 per credit hour plus \$15 registration fee per semester
  - Tuition for one class costs \$306 (3 credits) or \$403 (4 credits)
- Payment plans available
- The Maricopa Grant is a Maricopa Community Colleges tuition assistance program
  available for students based on financial need. Funding is limited and awarded on a
  first-come first served basis, so applicants are encouraged to apply early.
  - Apply online through your Student Center
    - May cover up to 6 credit hours per school year
  - Can only apply for funding in the Fall (Deadline September 22nd)

### Prerequisites/Placement

Depending on the dual course, students may need additional placement to meet class eligibility (check the Class List> Prerequisite tab for required placement).

#### **Admissions Requirements**

9th Grade: Take EdReady College Reading

10th-12th Grade: unweighted GPA > 2.0 OR Take EdReady College Reading

## **Enrollment Steps**

Taken dual enrollment courses before? Skip to Step 3

- 1. Apply online (<u>admissions.maricopa.edu</u>) and complete the **High School Students** application
- 2. Log in to your Student Center with your MEID and password and set up Duo Mobile
- 3. Maybe: Take placement test (check the class list to see prerequisites for your dual course)
- 4. Complete dual enrollment forms:
  - → New CGCC students only: ID Authentication
  - → New CGCC students only: Under 18 and FERPA Release
  - → Class Form = register for your dual course
- 5. Monitor your Maricopa student email (MEID@maricopa.edu) for confirmation you are enrolled or if you are missing anything.
- 6. Pay in full or enroll in a payment plan by Sunday, September 21 at 11:59pm
