WHAT'S WORKING ACROSS THE DISTRICT:


- CARING STAFF:


WHAT NEEDS FOCUS MOVING FORWARD:


- BEHAVIOR & ACCOUNTABILITY:

 - Staff and families want strong, visible leadership with a clear vision.




How would you rate your learning experience in the district?










How transparent do you feel the district is?






How safe do you feel your child is at school?









How well does the school support struggling students?





Do struggling students feel supported?




Is student learning the top priority of the district? Are students held to high academic standards?


Does the district create a safe and supportive learning environment?










How would you rate the quality of the curriculum?
