

peachjar for LBUSD Families

Check Ibschools.net and school websites for the latest information and updates.



Make sure your contact information is current in ParentVUE.

This website allows parents to view their child's current and historical information, including daily attendance, grades and more. If you are not receiving emails, texts or phone calls about your child, or if you need help signing up, please contact your school.



Complete your annual verification online.

Families should confirm that they received and updated important school information in **ParentVue**.



Make sure you know your school's start time.

In most cases high schools will start at about 8:45 a.m., and middle schools at 8:00 a.m. this fall.



Obtain vaccinations for all eligible family members.

Health officials have determined that vaccinations are safe and effective. Vaccines are an important part of protecting yourself and others. Learn more at the Long Beach Health and Human Services website at **longbeach.gov/health**.



Be aware of your child's social media activity.

Please remember that students who make threats, even as a joke, can face arrest and serious disciplinary consequences, including expulsion. If you or your child see or hear something suspicious, please say something.



Practice new routines.

Daily routines such as getting up and getting dressed on time, eating on a regular schedule and becoming comfortable around other adults and children are all important parts of the transition back to school.

Health/Wellness at Home

Parents are reminded to monitor these potential symptoms daily before children go to school:



- Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher
- Cough, sore throat, congestion or runny nose
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
- Chills or muscle or body aches
- · Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea

Stay home if ill, and contact your child's school.

Traffic and Pedestrian Reminders

The volume of pedestrian and vehicle traffic around schools will increase as school starts. Remember to:

- Follow school drop-off procedures
- Teach your child to always cross the street at a crosswalk
