

NEW TO MHS (2025-2026)

- 01 Cell Phone Policy- Per state law cell phones are not permitted to be used (from the tardy bell until the dismissal bell) at any public school. We will provide more information with the MPS policy soon.



- 02 Open Campus Lunch- Starting in August, Juniors and Seniors ONLY will now be permitted to leave campus for lunch.

- 03 Virtual Learning / Blended Learning programs are now available to Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors.



- 04 Bell Schedule- We have made several changes to our bell schedule this year, including the addition of Zero Hour courses, the extension of our student lunch periods, and the addition of a second flex day for academic intervention.

CELL PHONE POLICY

As you may have heard, for the 2025–2026 school year, a new state law (Oklahoma Senate Bill 139) requires all public schools in Oklahoma to prohibit student use of cell phones and other personal electronic devices from the first instructional bell to the last (dismissal) bell of the school day.

This law is designed to help create safer, more focused learning environments for students. Mustang Public Schools had already taken steps in recent years to reduce classroom distractions caused by personal devices, but SB 139 goes beyond Mustang's locally adopted policy (BOE Policy #5080) and forces additional changes to the PTD guidelines we previously implemented.



9th–12th

To meet the requirements of SB 139, students must turn off and store devices from 8:40 AM to 3:35 PM; no more lunch or passing period use.

Mustang High School

- **1st violation:** Cell phone/PTD will be confiscated from student and turned in and stored in the Main Office. A parent or guardian must pick up the cell phone/PTD. The student will be assigned 1 detention.
- **2nd violation:** Cell phone/PTD will be confiscated from student and turned in and stored in the Main Office. A parent or guardian must pick up the cell phone/PTD. The student will be assigned 1 day of ISI.
- **3rd violation:** Cell phone/PTD will be confiscated from student and turned in and stored in the Main Office. A parent or guardian must pick up the cell phone/PTD. The student will be assigned 3 days of OSS.
- **4th violation:** Cell phone/PTD will be confiscated from student and turned in and stored in the Main Office. A parent or guardian must pick up the cell phone/PTD. The student will be assigned 5 days of OSS.
- **5th violation:** Cell phone/PTD will be confiscated from student and turned in and stored in the Main Office. A parent or guardian must pick up the cell phone/PTD. The student will receive a change in placement to DPP for the remainder of the semester.

VISIBLE STUDENT ID

We will continue to use the Minga Digital Student ID across campus each day, but we will transition back to students being required to have their physical student ID visible. It doesn't have to be around the student's neck, but does need to be visible at all times.

It can be visible by being around their neck, attached to their backpack, or any other way that the ID is visible at all times.

During schedule pick up, students will have their photo taken for their student ID. Their ID will be available for pick up on the first day of school during lunch.



THE ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS

01 Where do students go to talk to about their attendance?

Students need to go to B118 and speak with their pod administrative assistant.

02 Can students leave campus for lunch?

Juniors and Seniors can leave campus for lunch, but Freshman and Sophomores ARE NOT ALLOWED TO LEAVE.

03 Where is the Counseling Center?

Students can find and enter the Counseling Center through the courtyard just outside of the "B Hallway"

04 Where are the pod principals located and who is my principal?

Students' pod principals are located in B118 and their specific principal is based on their last name.

05 Where do I go for schedule changes?

Students will need to stop by the counseling office and complete a schedule change form. Changes are not promised and are based on availability.

06 Can I change my lunch?

No, students are not allowed to change or request a change in their assigned lunch.

07 Where is the Finance Office?

The Finance Office is located in the Media Center. You can enter the Media Center through the Commons.

08 Where is the school supply list?

At MHS, we don't have a school supply list. Each teacher will supply a list of items needed for their class.



THE ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS

- 09** **Do I have to wear my student ID?**
Students are required to visibly wear their ID for the safety and security of the campus.
- 10** **How do I call home if I can't use my cell phone?**
Students are always welcome to come by the Main Office and use the student phone, if they have permission from their classroom teacher.
- 11** **Where is student parking?**
Students have several options for parking including the main student lot, the Performing Arts Center (PAC), the CV Tech lots, and the gravel lot.
- 12** **Where is the Media Center?**
The Media Center is located between the Commons and the Counseling Center. Students will enter through the Media Center entrance in the Commons.
- 13** **What is Flex Time?**
Flex Time is our scheduled intervention time on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- 14** **How do I know which lunch I have?**
Your lunch is a period on your class schedule and is listed as "Lunch". It will either be 3rd, 4th, 5th, or 6th hour.
- 15** **Where is the Nurse's Office?**
The Nurse's Office is located in the Main Office of the high school campus.
- 16** **What if I'm late to class?**
MHS tardy stations are located in multiple areas around campus. Students who are late to class will need to check-in at a tardy station to receive a tardy pass prior to reporting to class. They will not be allowed to enter class late without presenting a tardy pass to their classroom teacher.



THE ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS

17 **Who is my counselor?**
Your counselor is located in the counseling office and is based on your last name. You will have the same counselor for 4 years.

18 **Where does the bus drop me off in the morning?**
Your bus will drop you off in the south bus loop every morning.

19 **Where do I get on the bus after school?**
You will load the bus after school in either the north or south bus loop and this will be listed on your Minga (digital) student ID.

20 **How do I know what bus number I ride on?**
Your specific bus number and what bus loop you will use after school will be listed on your Minga (digital) student ID.

21 **What is the DECA store?**
The DECA store is a student operated drink and snack station where students can purchase items during lunch time.

22 **Where are the food trucks during lunch?**
The food trucks are located between the JROTC building the east end of the K building.

23 **Where is detention located?**
Lunch detention and AM/PM detention are located in B131.

24 **What is Minga?**
Minga is your all-in-one solution for bringing school operations into the digital age. Digital ID's, Student ID's, and more!

What is ISI?

ISI is in school isolation (also known as in school suspension) and is in school detention that last for the full school day.

26

How do I get school information and news?

Minga is the best place to find all things MHS. Students should check Minga everyday and be expected to know what is going on.

27

What is BEAST Week?

Beast Week is our student led campus wide fundraiser to raise money for a family in need.

28

Where do I get a new student ID for door access?

Students are only provided 1 free ID. Should they need a new ID, they would need to go by the finance office to purchase a new one.

29

Who are our SRO (School Resource Officers) ?

We have two full time school resource officers who will be visible around campus all day. (Officer McDaniel & Officer Brauer)

30

Where do my parents come to check me out?

All students will need to be checked out through the main office.

31

Who do I talk to about senior information?

All senior information will be provided on the senior website or you can visit with the senior sponsors.

32

Does the high school have a mental health counselor?

Yes, we have a full time mental health counselor available to all students.





ATTENDANCE

STUDENT ATTENDANCE POLICY

Educational programs are built on the foundation of continuity of instruction and participation in the classroom setting. Consistent classroom attendance can lead to the development of strong work habits, responsibility, and self-discipline. Because attendance also has a definite correlation to academic performance, the quality of a student's education suffers when he/she is absent from class. Students are encouraged to maintain regular attendance and to schedule non-academic activities during times which will not conflict with classroom instruction.

Mustang Public School Attendance Policy

- A. Students who exceed eight (8) absences in a semester shall receive a NC for that class, unless they have failed the class and then they will receive an F.

- B. If a student exceeds eight (8) absences, a doctor's statement that confirms the dates of the illness may be turned in to the attendance office upon the student's return to school resulting in the absence(s) being changed to an excused absence(s). Doctors' notes should be submitted to building administrative assistants upon return from absence(s). Original doctor's notes or other documentation should be kept for your own records.

- C. Students who fail based only on their attendance exceeding the eight-day limit may submit an appeal to a site committee within five (5) days prior to the end of the current semester. Where do students get picked up after school?


Students need to be picked up in the designated parent pick up spots. Please see the map below.



MHS PM Traffic Flow




