

The Oriskany Central School District Board of Education is committed to striving for higher student achievement in all of our academic and related program offerings. The Board has worked hard to allocate appropriate resources that will allow the school district to pursue the lofty goals of having all students graduate career, college and life ready. Please review the information on this page and the following page to help you better understand the role and organizational structure of the Board of Education. It is the hope of each school board member that our students enjoy a positive learning environment throughout their school experience.

As the Oriskany Board of Education, we welcome parents, students, staff members, community residents and other interested persons to our meetings. We appreciate your interest in and concern for our school system. The Board can better represent its constituents when members of the community take the time to observe the Board in action, express opinions and ask questions.

What is the Board of Education?

The Board is the official policy-making body of the school district. The Board is composed of seven members, elected by the public, who serve three-year terms of office. Board of Education members receive no paid compensation for their services.

What are the responsibilities of the Board?

- Establish District policies
- Identify District philosophy and direction
- Develop an annual budget for voter approval
- Act on the Superintendent of Schools' recommendations regarding personnel matters
- Review programs and instructional materials

No person or group of persons acts in the name of the Board. All motions require a majority vote before the Board can act. A Board member acts in an official capacity only during an official Board meeting. The Board employs a Superintendent of Schools as the Chief Executive Office of the school district. The Superintendent of Schools is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the District and administration of Board policies, programs and plans for Board action.

How are Board Meetings conducted?

If I attend a Board meeting, must I stay until the end?

Don't worry if you have to leave early. We won't be offended. Some of you will leave at the conclusion of the "resident participation" section of the agenda, some of you will stay longer and some of you will stay for the entire meeting.

Can the public speak at Board meetings?

Normally, the Board will allow opportunities for the public to speak at the beginning of each meeting. You will be asked to state your name and address before speaking. Visitor comments will be limited to three minutes each. The President will curtail discussion on a topic to ensure that others have an opportunity to speak and that there is sufficient time to consider all agenda items. The Board of Education members will not engage in dialogue with the public during this time. Comments relative to personnel or students are inappropriate to address in an open session and will not be allowed.

What is Executive Session?

Occasionally, it is necessary for the Board to conduct a discussion on a confidential matter which, under State Education guidelines, requires a "closed" or executive session. Such topics could include personnel matters involving a specific person, negotiations' strategies, building rental or property acquisition. Although these discussions are not open to the public, any action on an executive session item must be taken in open public session. Executive sessions are usually held before or near the end of meetings. Only items which fall in the executive category can be discussed during such a session.

When and where does the Board of Education meet?

The Oriskany Central School District Board of Education typically meets at 6:00 p.m. at the district office, unless otherwise noted. Please refer to our website, www.oriskanycsd.org, for updated information regarding the Board of Education meeting schedule.

Do you have a concern?

The Board encourages parents and community members who have a concern about their children's education or other school-related problems to try to resolve them first at the level most directly involved; the classroom teacher or the building principal. If your issue remains unresolved, you may contact the superintendent for his assistance.





Safety tips for students:

- Tell the bus driver, teacher, or parent if something or someone makes you feel unsafe at the bus stop or on the bus.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST & LUNCH PROGRAMS

The OHM BOCES School Food Service is pleased to announce that during the 2025-26 school year, we will be operating under the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), meaning all meals are FREE to all students!

The Food Service team strives to provide students with tasty, nutritious, fresh foods that appeal to students and the school community. We have continually exceeded federal and state guidelines for all required nutrients and increased our offerings of fresh fruit and vegetables.

Each student has their own meal account with an assigned pin number. Please be sure to help your children learn their numbers, especially if they are new participants. You can also use this account to make payments for a la carte items. Online prepayments through ezschoolpay.com are preferable, however, checks should be made out to OHM BOCES Food Service and cash in a labeled envelope is also an option.

Because we are operating under CEP this year, families do not need to fill out free/reduced meal applications. However, it is helpful to your school if you complete the income collection form available at ezmealapp.com. PDFs and hard copies are also available. Eligible families may qualify for benefits such as waived test fees.

While complete meals are FREE, single items like milk will still be charged to student accounts. Milk this year will be \$0.75. Other a la carte items such as frozen yogurt, baked chips and whole grain cookies will be available for purchase most days in the school cafeteria. Prices on those items range from \$0.75-\$2.00. There is no charging of a la carte items, meaning students must have a positive account balance or cash in hand in order to purchase.

PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff,

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

As a reminder, the Oriskany Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications.

The following applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- antimicrobial products;
- horticulture oils and soaps;
- granular pesticides;
- injected pesticides;
- spot use pesticides covering an area less than 9 sq. ft. in less than 32 oz. amounts;
- emergency use as long as the NYS Health Commissioner is notified immediately after pesticide use;
- foundation applications meant to control indoor pests;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready to use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetra hydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a direct spray in containers of 18 fluid ounce or less when use to protect individuals from imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.

In the event of an emergency, application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

FAMILYID ATHLETIC REGISTRATION

By New York State Education Law, students participating in sports are required to have a yearly physical and complete an updated Athletic Health History Form.

Oriskany is excited to announce that we are now offering the convenience of online athletic registration through FamilyID. **FamilyID is a secure registration platform that provides you with an easy, user-friendly way to register your student(s) for their upcoming athletic teams, and helps us to be more administratively efficient and environmentally responsible.**

When you register through FamilyID, the system keeps track of your information in your profile. You enter your information only once for each family member for multiple uses and multiple programs. It will be helpful to have the date of your student(s) most recent physical handy to allow for accurate completion of your online registration.

Upon selecting the sport of participation, the parent/guardian will review and complete information regarding athletic health history, photograph consent, athletic handbook consent, transportation and specific medical needs. Please take the time to read through and review this information with your student-athlete. Once completed, this information will be securely housed on the FamilyID platform.

The only hard copy documentation that parents will need to provide the school with is the updated physical. Even if you choose to upload the physical onto your FamilyID account, the school will still require a hard copy for record keeping purposes. This documentation may be dropped off at the high school nurse's office Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

USE OF SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS

The Oriskany Central School District promotes student, staff and visitor safety in all District facilities, grounds and buses. In an attempt to ensure a safe and effective learning environment, the Board promotes the use of surveillance cameras when necessary in all District facilities, grounds or buses. Surveillance cameras will not be used in public areas and other non-public areas such as restrooms and locker rooms where there is reasonable expectation of privacy.

Audio recordings will not be made in conjunction with the use of cameras. Such prohibition does not preclude the use of audio recordings by law enforcement or District personnel when used in accordance with their official duties and as authorized by law.

NOTICE TO STUDENTS AND PARENTS: STUDENT USE OF NONSCHOOL OR PERSONAL INTERNET-ENABLED DEVICES POLICY 7208

The Oriskany Central School District believes in creating a focused learning environment. Personal internet-enabled devices can be a distraction to learning and engagement during the school day.

Therefore, the use and possession of personal internet-enabled devices (like smartphones, smartwatches, etc.) are generally prohibited anywhere on school grounds during the school day in accordance with New York State Education Law.

Key Points:

- **Storage:** Devices must be stored in personalized storage or in student lockers during the school day.
- **Visibility:** Devices should not be visible unless a staff member gives permission.
- **No Liability:** The school is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices.
- **Simple Cell Phones:** Basic cell phones (without internet access) are allowed.
- **School-Provided Devices:** Laptops or tablets provided by the school for instruction are permitted.
- **Devices in Vehicles:** Leaving a device in a locked vehicle during the school day is not a violation.

Exceptions where device use may be authorized:

- For educational purposes with permission from the Principal or District.
- To manage a student's healthcare condition.
- As part of a student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan.
- For translation purposes.
- For student caregivers, as determined by a school psychologist, social worker, or counselor.
- When otherwise required by law.

This policy aims to help students focus on their learning and interact effectively with teachers and peers.

INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS AND ELIGIBILITY

The interscholastic program includes the sports listed below. All students are welcome to try out for these teams, provided they meet the physical and academic qualifications. Information regarding the sports program can be obtained by contacting the athletic director.

Participating in athletics is a privilege for all students, as long as they remain academically eligible and in good standing. All students will begin each academic year with their eligibility intact as there is no carryover from the previous year. Student progress will be measured every five weeks.

A student who receives two failing grades or more during any five-week period will be declared ineligible to participate in any interscholastic activities. The period of ineligibility begins on the Monday after progress reports or report cards are mailed and concludes on the second Monday after that date.

1. An athlete will be ineligible for two weeks, during which they can bring their eligibility up to passing standards. They are required to stay after school and work with their teachers.
2. During this two-week period, athletes are required to practice with the team but cannot participate in any games. The athlete must sit in street clothes on their bench during these games (excluding golf).
3. If an athlete becomes eligible after the initial two-week period, the athlete will be permitted to participate on the following Monday.
4. The initial two-week ineligibility period must include a minimum of eight school days. Student progress during this period will be monitored by the athletic director.
5. If at the end of the initial two-week period the athlete is still ineligible, the athlete cannot play or practice for the remainder of the ineligibility period lasting until the end of the current grading period. (Exception: the athlete will be allowed to practice with the team only to meet NYS conditioning requirements.)
6. Any student may try out while ineligible but not practice until they become eligible.

FAMILY RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 (FERPA)

The procedures for the confidentiality of student records shall be consistent with federal statutes, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) and its implementation regulations, and the Commissioner's Regulations.

The District shall arrange to provide translations of the following notice to non-English speaking parents in their native language.

To Parents/Guardian(s), Eligible Students:

This section is intended to advise you of your rights with respect to the school records relating to your son, your daughter or you. Pursuant to the Federal "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974."

Parents of a student under 18, or a student 18 or older, have a right to inspect and review any and all official records, files, and data directly related to their children or themselves, including all material that is incorporated into each student's cumulative record folder, and intended for school use to be available to parties outside the school or school system, and specifically including, but not necessarily limited to, identifying data, academic work completed, level of achievement (grades, standardized achievement test scores), interest inventory results, health data, family background information, teacher or counselor ratings and observations, and verified reports of serious or current behavior patterns.

DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT

The Dignity for All Students Act (DASA) effective July 1, 2012, specifically prohibits bullying, discrimination and harassment by school employees and students on school property or at a school function by school employees and students based on, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, actual or perceived: race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender, sex and any other legally protected status.

Also included are provisions for reporting and intervening in cases of discrimination, harassment or bullying. Any related complaints should be brought to the attention of the building principal who also serves as the Dignity Act Coordinator (DAC) to assist in implementation of the DASA in each school building.


