



ORMONDALE... Highlights

- Ormondale is a community of learners grounded in respect, responsibility, safety, and kindness.
- Art, science, and STEAM classrooms, lush gardens, and warm, welcoming spaces create an ideal environment for teaching and learning.
- Teachers collaborate regularly in teams and groups to plan meaningful curriculum and instruction.
- Our new **therapy dog**, a goldendoodle, supports student and staff well-being by providing comfort and reducing stress.
- **Students perform** in school-wide events like the Winter Concert, Spring Folk Dance Festival, and Spring Musical.
- **Project-based learning** allows students to demonstrate their understanding in creative, self-designed ways.
- Service learning builds civic engagement through partnerships with local nonprofit organizations.
- In 2024–25, we launched a **new research-based ELA curriculum** in grades K–3, supported by training, coaching, and vertical collaboration.
- Students are supported by a strong team of specialists, including a full-time counselor and two Reading Specialists.
- All students enjoy enrichment in Physical Education, Music, STEAM, Library, Garden Thyme, and chicken care, as well as cross-grade connections through Buddy Classes and Ormondale Families.



CORTE MADERA... Highlights

- The CMS community fosters empathy and a welcoming school climate every day, highlighted by the joyful annual Kindness Fair.
- Spring musical (Something Rotten Jr.), concert performances, and offsite competitions **showcase student talent and teamwork**.
- Every grade level enjoys dynamic **Field Trips** that bring learning to life—hands-on, memorable adventures, including overnight experiences in Yosemite and Camp Jones Gulch.
- Students thrive in **inspiring spaces** throughout the day, including the STEAM Lab, Art Room, Science Lab, Library, Game Room, and the vibrant campus garden.
- Advanced Math and **academic enrichment opportunities** challenge students in grades 4–8 to think deeply and stretch their skills.
- A wide range of **after-school athletics**—from flag football to pickleball—keeps students active, with the Annual Sports Fair celebrating teamwork and movement.
- Inspiring **cultural art assemblies** and uplifting visits from mental health support animals enrich our school environment.
- Robotics, Wind Ensemble, and Choir before and after school spark creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking.
- CMS successfully rolled out **new English Language Arts and 6–8 Science Curriculum**, alongside Reading and Math support classes and after-school academic help for grades 4–8.
