

# GUIDELINES

At SJI International, our uniform represents not only a shared identity and pride in our school but also our commitment to fostering a respectful, inclusive, and supportive community. We strive to ensure our uniform policy promotes comfort, body positivity, and a sense of belonging for all students. We encourage students to wear their uniform with confidence and care, taking pride in being part of our diverse school community. Families play an important role in supporting this by ensuring uniforms are clean, well-fitting, and in good condition, in line with our policy.

## BOYS' UNIFORM

- White shirt (or option in the Senior School to wear a white polo shirt) and green trousers.
- Trousers must not be altered or tailored to make them tight-fitting.

## GIRLS' UNIFORM

- White blouse (or option in the Senior School to wear a white polo shirt) and green skirt.
- The uniform skirts must not be altered to make them tight-fitting or rolled up to make them shorter.
- Alternatively, a skort can also be worn.

## SCHOOL JUMPER

- SJI International jumpers can be worn if required.
- Jumpers must be black with the school crest.
- No other replacement garments, including sweatshirts or hoodies, are permitted.

## SHOES AND SOCKS

- Students can wear black leather, leatherette school shoes, or black trainers.
- Shoes or trainers must be entirely plain black, including the soles.
- Boots and platform heels are not acceptable.
- School socks must be plain and all white, crew length or ankle length.



## FORMAL MONDAY - ALL GRADES

- All students wear the school tie and formal white shirt.
- Ties must be of an appropriate length with shirts buttoned to the top.
- Students may remove their tie after assembly or when the formal event is over.

# VARIATIONS

## SENIOR SCHOOL (G11 & G12) SHIRT OPTIONS

Whilst Senior School students have some flexibility in their uniform, it should be noted that they must wear the tie and formal white shirt every Monday for assembly, and for all formal functions.

### SHIRT OR POLO OPTIONS GRADE 11 & 12 ONLY

Students studying in **Grades 11 and 12** have the option of wearing the official school polo shirt, or the regular shirt.

### NON-UNIFORM DAYS

- Non-uniform days as charitable events happen throughout the year. Students must pay the fee to participate.
- Clothing that is low cut, extremely short, or reveals the midriff is not appropriate.
- Other non-uniform days (e.g. National Day) may be held throughout the year and are free of charge.
- Students must observe appropriate clothing etiquette and may be asked to change into spare uniform if inappropriately dressed.

- Students are permitted to wear their PE kit for the whole day on days where they have PE or Drama lessons.
- White polo shirt with embroidered logo and green shorts (for boys and girls); non-marking training shoes.
- Black shorts of any kind are not permitted.
- A specialist kit may be required according to the PE activities being taken (e.g., swimming).
- Appropriate kit worn during CCA activities may be worn home when students leave school at 4.30 pm or beyond.

# HOUSE UNIFORM

SJI International House t-shirts are to be worn for House Shirt Days or House Events with PE shorts, school trousers, and trainers. Each House has a different colour t-shirt that can be purchased from the school uniform supplier.

# OPTIONAL ITEMS

Non-compulsory uniform items and sports attire can be purchased from the approved school uniform supplier Lim's Uniforms.

## NON-COMPULSORY UNIFORM



### JUMPER OPTIONAL ITEM

Students in **all grades** have the option of wearing the official school jumper.

No other jumpers, cardigans or hoodies are permitted during core school hours.

## NON-COMPULSORY SPORTS ATTIRE

### SJII HOODED SWEATSHIRT OPTIONAL ITEM

**IMPORTANT:** The hooded sweatshirt is to be used only for training sessions and sports fixtures, or for recreational wear outside school hours.

It is **not to be worn** in place of the PE Uniform or the school jumper during the school day.

It should also **not be worn** to and from school when students are wearing their day uniform.

# STUDENT APPEARANCE

In addition to the uniform, it is expected that students will present themselves as neat in appearance and take pride in representing SJI International and our community.

## HAIR, NAILS AND MAKEUP

- Hair must be clean, neat, and off the face for all students.
- Unnatural hair colour, glitter streaks, and beads are not allowed.
- Students must be clean-shaven unless exempt for religious reasons, validated by the appropriate religious authority.
- Tracks, lines, or symbols in hair are not permitted.
- Fingernails must be clean, short, and free of nail varnish. False nails or extensions are not allowed.
- Makeup, if worn, must be discreet.

## ACCESSORIES AND JEWELLERY

- Students are encouraged not to wear jewellery to school. The school will not be responsible for lost or damaged items.
- Belts, if worn, must be plain black with a simple buckle.
- Discreet items of religious significance may be permitted upon request to the Vice Principals (Senior School and Wellbeing and Achievement).
- Hats are not permitted inside school buildings, but should be worn as sun protection during outdoor activities. Students are responsible for applying sunblock and deciding when to wear hats.
- Ear piercings: only small studs in the earlobes are allowed. Hoops of any kind are not permitted.
- Other piercings: not permitted. Students may not wear clear sleepers.

## OTHERS

- Uniforms should be purchased from official school suppliers.
- We recommend that all uniform items should be clearly marked with the owner's name, including shoes.
