CHS Cell Phone Guidelines - Clarification

The following serves as a clarification of our guidelines regarding cell phones and other electronic device usage. Please be aware that additional procedures are outlined in the Student Handbook, which is available on the high school website. To maximize learning opportunities for students and to encourage our students to be safe, respectful, and responsible, CHS has the following guidelines for students.

RED Zones are times and places where cell phone use is unacceptable, and they should be put away, silenced, with notifications turned off and/or placed in a location determined by a teacher's classroom procedures.

GREEN Zones are times and places when cell phone use is acceptable.

Green	Red
Before/After School	<u>Classrooms</u>
Cafeteria and Hallways	Restrooms/Locker Rooms
Lunch/Passing Time	Any time staff asks you to put it away
When your teacher gives permission	Testing Centers

Cell Phone Privilege Guidelines

Act Responsibly

- Phones must be put away in a **RED** zone
- Earbuds/Air pods/Headphones must be put away in a **RED** zone
- Standard classroom procedures – every classroom is a **RED** zone, and a teacher/staff may issue a **GREEN** zone at their discretion.
- Only use your phone in a **GREEN** zone
- Follow directions from staff
- If you feel you MUST use your phone in a **RED** zone, ask and receive permission first

Act Respectfully

- Be courteous with your phone
- Volume OFF or use headphones when in a **GREEN** zone

- Turn off your notifications
- Put your phone away if asked by a staff member
- Hands off others' phones and other electronic devices

Act Safely

- Use your phone appropriately
- Think before you post on social media
- Do not take pictures/videos of others without permission

District Immunizations & Annual Update Information

Immunizations: Important Please Read

Minnesota law requires children enrolled in childcare, early childhood education, or school to be immunized against certain diseases, unless the child is medically or non-medically exempt. Children having incomplete immunization records will not be allowed to remain in school after October 31st, 2025. What you need to do:

- Contact your health care provider and review your student's immunization status to make sure they are up to date.
- If you missed a required vaccination, make an appointment with a healthcare provider or local clinic as soon as possible.
- Follow up with your students' school if they have reached out to you regarding your students immunization status.
- Turn in medical (must be signed by health care provider) and non-medical (must be notarized) exemption forms to your child's school.

Visit health.state.mn.us/people/immunize for vaccine schedules, exemption forms, and more information including where to get free/low-cost immunizations. Check the Campus Parent Portal for the immunization status of your K-12 student.

Annual Update Information

Each year families are required to review and update annual data for students such as annual notifications, agreements, emergency contact information and preferences, ...etc.

Parking Permits - 1st Semester Application Process

1st Semester Parking Permit 2025-26 Information

ONLINE Parking Permit Application Registration

Who: Seniors & Juniors

Please note: Sophomores are not included in this application process. Sophomores would only be eligible if permits are available after the Seniors & Junior application process is completed. This would be a completely separate application process in the 2nd week of the semester for Sophomores.

When: Tuesday, August 12th at 7:00 am through 8:00 am Thursday, August 14th, 2025.

How: Access link from home computers, mobile devices

Where: link can be found on CHS website. Students must be signed into their isd12 Google account to access the application.

What information you will need:

- Student Name, grade and e-mail address
- Vehicle Make, Model, Color, license plate number for all vehicles
- Student transportation needs (i.e.: 916/OEC program, work experience, open enrollment, mentoring, peer leader, activities/athletics, carpooling etc.)
- Carpooling student names, email address, and vehicle information
- Student activities information
- Applications will be time stamped when entered

Special Notes: Parking Permit Application Criteria

- 125 to Seniors with carpools
- Open Enrollee's, OEC, Part-Time PSEO, Work Experience Program, etc. (any educational service that is done for credit, but the school district does not provide transportation).
- Seniors that are Carpooling *AND in Activities
- Juniors that are Carpooling * AND in Activities
- Seniors that are in Activities
- Juniors that are in Activities
- Seniors that are Carpooling*

- Juniors that are Carpooling*
- Seniors that ride alone
- Juniors that ride alone

Due to the limited parking spaces available, student and families should not expect a permit, even if they had one for a prior semester. This criteria system will best serve the most students possible.

- Because of limited availability, 9th and 10th grade students are not factored in as part of carpools.

Cost of parking permits per semester:

Centennial High School student parking permits will cost the same for all student parking lots. The price will be \$150.00 per semester. Students will be issued a physical parking tag and they must have it displayed in their vehicle when parking on campus. Student parking lots will cost the same amount and all spaces in the 3 student parking lots will all be available to student permit holders on a first come, first pick each day. There will be NO differentiation on the student parking lots as far as where students can park with their 1st semester permit. The lots formerly known as the Front, Stadium, and Back Lots will be open for whomever parks in the lot depending on the time the student arrives at school.

Please note that the Union Lot will no longer be a student lot. A map of the 3 student parking lots will be included at the end of this notice.

***** Students must have all fees and fines paid before they will be allowed to pay for and pick up their parking permits.**

Students that are eligible to receive a permit will be notified by email AND a list will be posted in the East Office by Tuesday, August 19th, 2025.


Students can pay for their parking permits beginning August 19th online through the Infinite Campus Portal under fees. After paying for the parking permit the actual parking permit tag can be picked up in the **East Media Center** during Fall Kick Off, Tuesday, August 19th from 1:00-7:00pm. After that time, permits can be picked up in the East Media Center Monday-Thursday from 7-3.

Students need to pay for and pick up their permits by the end of the first day of school, Wednesday, September 3rd or they may forfeit the permit.

Families should pay for their parking permits online through the Parent/Student Portal in Infinite Campus. If an accommodation is needed for a family to pay by check, please be aware that if the check bounces the permit will be revoked until proper payment is made.

After the Junior and Senior parking applications process has been completed, if any 1st semester permits are still available, an application process for Sophomores will be made available. This is **NOT** a guarantee, and 10 grade families should **NOT** expect to be able to purchase parking permits.

This will be a separate application process and 10th grade families will be notified if this opportunity is available during the 2nd week of 1st semester.

Centennial's goal for 9th-grade orientation is to ease anxiety, promote responsibility, increase school involvement and school spirit, empower students, and reduce disciplinary and attendance concerns.

On Tuesday, September 2nd, 2025 9th grade students will join us for a day built specifically for helping them to get comfortable with the high school. CHS Dance Guidelines

2025 - 2026 Centennial High School Dance Guidelines

- Students wishing to bring a guest to a dance who is not a student at CHS must pick up a guest clearance form from either office and have it signed by an administrator.
- Students are allowed to bring **one guest**:
 - Homecoming Dance: Only students enrolled in a secondary School
 - Prom: Only students under the age of 21 years old
- No guests will be admitted without the appropriate clearance form and proper ID.
- Guests who are unable to provide completed clearance forms and/or are not enrolled in a secondary school setting will be subject to a criminal background check at their own cost.
- Upon an informal interview, the Principal and/or the Principal's Designee have the right to deny any guest from attending CHS dances or functions.

****Any event/behavior that has a disciplinary action may cause a student to lose extracurricular privileges, including not being allowed to attend a school dance.**

2025 - 2026 PSAT/NMSQT & ACT Testing Information

2025 PSAT/NMSQT INFORMATION

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test is offered each fall to all students in their junior year of high school. Junior students planning to attend a four year college are encouraged to register for the test. Sophomore students may also want to take the PSAT to become familiar with the test format before taking it as juniors.

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test is a co-sponsored program by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation. This standardized test provides firsthand practice for the SAT Reasoning Test. Scores from the PSAT are used to select the top students nationwide to compete for scholarships through the National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship programs.

This nationally standardized test allows students to compare their performance with other college bound students. This test measures critical reading skills, math problem solving skills, and writing skills and provides the opportunity for students to experience a college entrance test in a practice setting. Following the test, students receive feedback about their performance on these critical academic skills. Students also have the opportunity to receive information from colleges.

The College Board determines the PSAT testing date. Centennial High School will provide the test to interested students on Thursday, October 16, 2025, from 8:00 AM - 12:00 PM at Centennial High School. **Please note that this is the Thursday of MEA break.** The non-refundable fee to cover the test and its administration cost is \$40. When registration opens, the payment method will be communicated to families in the fall. Registration is scheduled to open Monday, August 18, 2025, and close Friday, September 5, 2025.

ACT TEST INFORMATION

Students who plan on attending a four-year college or university can take the ACT exam toward the end of their Junior year. ACT has a 30-minute Writing Test as an optional component of the ACT assessment. To find out which colleges are requiring the Writing Test or to register to take the ACT, visit www.actstudent.org. Due to security enhancements, students are required to upload a photo of themselves when registering for the ACT. This photo will be printed on their registration ticket and matched against their ID on test day.
