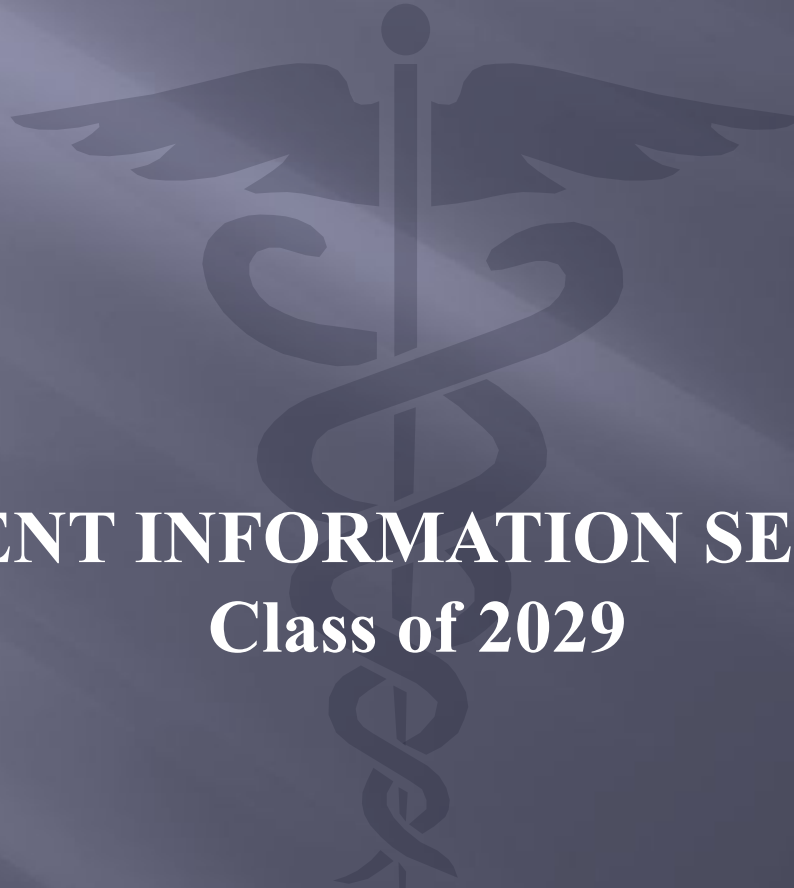

Program Overview

- The Academy for Health & Medical Sciences is a rigorous 4 year honors program for highly focused, college bound students.
- The program is a partnership between the Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School and Raritan Valley Community College.
- Successful students will graduate with both a high school diploma and an Associate of Science Degree in Science and Mathematics.



Mathematics Instruction



Parents of qualifying students would be responsible for applicable course fees and materials.

- The math curriculum is based on the graduation requirements for a high school diploma as determined by the NJDOE and the requirements for an Associate's Degree as determined by RVCC.
- Extracurricular math programs, competitions, "Math League" and other independent study programs will be offered for students seeking advanced studies.

Testing

Accuplacer Test:

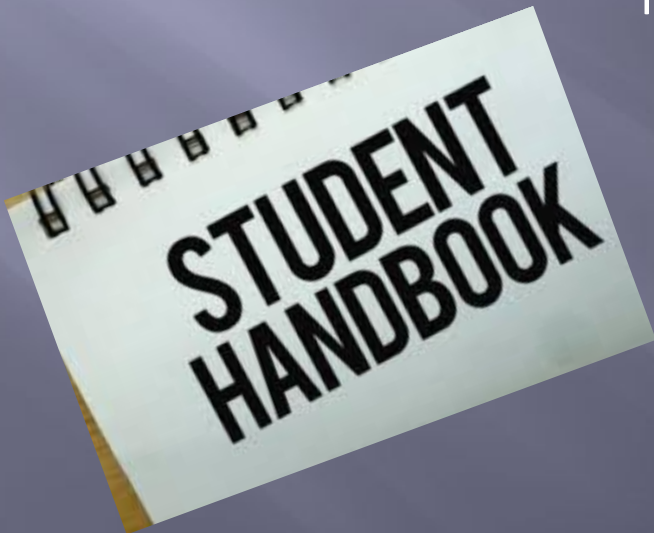
- End of freshman year (English) to qualify for the Human Origins/Cultural Anthropology courses
- If necessary, (English) again in Spring of sophomore year to qualify for English Composition I at RVCC during junior year
- Fall of sophomore year (Mathematics) and again in Spring, if necessary, to qualify for Pre-Calculus at RVCC during junior year

Student Expectations

The Academy for Health and Medical Sciences (AHMS) program is a rigorous and accelerated program, in which students must meet the Criteria for Continued Enrollment to ensure their success. In order to progress through the program, a 3.0 minimum cumulative RVCC Grade Point Average (GPA) is required, along with satisfactory placement via Accuplacer (RVCC Placement Test) in both the Freshman and Sophomore years. In addition, the AHMS follows a cohort format; therefore, courses must be taken in a continuous sequence. Students will not be allowed to retake courses unless special approval is granted through an appeals process. The AHMS policy states that a grade of D, F, or W in any required RVCC course will make a student ineligible to continue in the program.

Attendance Policy

Attendance Policy - Students enrolled in the AHMS Program must adhere to both the RVCC and the SCVTHS attendance policies.

1. RVCC Attendance Policy- Students are expected to attend all classes, laboratories, and clinical sessions for every course in which they are enrolled. To accommodate students' reasonable, personal situations that might prevent them from attending classes, each student is entitled to excused absences amounting to the equivalent of one week's class time in a semester.
 - ❖ 9th and 10th grade students will follow the SCVTHS calendar and attendance rules.
2. Any absences in excess of this standard can prevent students from achieving the course learning outcomes as evaluated by the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to read their syllabus for course or department attendance policies. It is the student's responsibility to be in communication with their professors at all times regarding attendance. (Source: *RVCC Catalog*)
 - ❖ 11th and 12th grade students will follow both the SCVTHS and the RVCC calendars and attendance rules.

Awards & Honors

Academy Principal's Honor Roll: Awarded each marking period to students earning an A or above in all subjects.

Academy Honor Roll: Awarded each marking period to students earning a B or above in all subjects.

National Honor Society for High School Students: Open to juniors and seniors who meet the society's standards for academics, character, leadership, and service. Students must have a GPA of 3.50 or above in their high school and college coursework in order to be considered.

Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society for Community College Students: Open to juniors and seniors who have a GPA of 3.50 or above in their Raritan Valley Community College coursework.

2024 RVCC Commencement: 25 students graduated with an Associate Degree in General Science.

Application Timelines:

- 1. AHMS Application Due Date: January 16th, 2026**
- 2. Admissions Testing To be determined**
- 3. Results for the math test come out in March**
- 4. Acceptance notifications go out in April**

Admissions Rubric

- 7th grade GPA – 20 points
- 8th grade GPA – 10 points
- 7th grade Standardized Test Scores (if applicable)– 15 points

Academy Admissions Test:

- i. Writing/Language Arts Section – 15 points
 - ii. Mathematics Section – 15 points * Minimum score required
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- i. Interviews - 10 points (If used)
 - ii. Minimum 68 out of 85 points needed for consideration

Academy Expenses: Your Share

The current program fee set by SCVTHS and based on RVCC tuition and fees is currently \$245.00 per credit for the 2024-2025 Academic Year. You will be notified of the 2025-2026 RVCC rate prior to the start of the Academic Year.

Students will be charged for 61 or 62 credits depending on their senior Mathematics sequence. Fees are subject to change.

Transfer of Credits

- ✓ RVCC credits earned in the transfer designed. A.A. and A.S. degree programs transfer very well to highly competitive colleges and universities according to the receiving colleges transfer policies.
- ✓ Students who have graduated have had great success in transferring credits to colleges and universities.
