HiSET

HiSET (High School Equivalency Test) is an alternative to a U.S. high school diploma for individuals who are at least 17 years of age, Maine residents, and no longer enrolled in high school. Candidates demonstrate they have the same skills and knowledge as a high school graduate by successfully completing competency based testing in Language Arts - Reading; Social Studies; Science; Mathematics; and Language Arts-Writing.

All students over 17 years of age are welcome to join us to finish that credential and move forward with that wish list! It's FREE and confidential. New students need to make an appointment to set goals and class placement. Official Tests are administered in Scarborough by appointment.

HiSET Preparation Lab



Workforce Training in Healthcare



Personal Support Specialist (PSS)

This 50 hour course prepares participants to work in home health care or residential settings. Personal care, communication skills, observing, reporting and documentation are taught. How to provide care safely and deal with emergencies, consumer rights, aging and illness are additional topics covered in the class. CASAS Reading scores of 220 or above are required. Students must be 18 years of age or older and be eligible to work in Maine. Please contact our office at 207-730-5045 for an application and to arrange a CASAS reading test.

Bridge to Healthcare

This class will prepare you to enter the healthcare field. We will focus on medical vocabulary, computer and workplace skills, and English instruction for students wishing to increase CASAS reading skills for admission to further health occupations classes. Students must be 18 years of age, have a high school diploma or the equivalent, and have a CASAS Reading score of 238 or above.

Black Point Cemetery Guided Tour

Black Point Cemetery has roots back to Scarborough's earliest days, and the grave-markers that have survived there span a 250 year period.
