We are here in the Rightsizing process.

Why is rightsizing needed?

Our enrollment and school-aged populations have been declining, and as a result, many of our schools are only being used at about 66% capacity. Enrollment in individual schools is not relatively even. Some are slightly above capacity, while most others are very small in comparison. As a result, students and their families do not have the same experiences in our schools.

What advantages are there to rightsizing?

Rightsizing can lead to greater access to academics, special education services, fine arts, and athletics, among other essential services such as social-emotional learning and mental health support.

Our goal is to strengthen educational opportunities by rightsizing schools, enhancing innovative programs, optimizing budgetary resources, and reducing our reliance on aging facilities, ultimately ensuring a sustainable future for our district and our students.

How does it impact me?

While no changes are planned for the 2025-2026 school year, we believe we have a powerful, once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to envision and plan for our bright future as a district, ensuring that we become that destination, high-performing district that inspires our community and that lays the foundation for a strong, better-than-ever City of Pueblo!
