## Use Bullets to Summarize Family Feedback

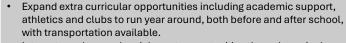
- · Access to regular, nutritious food

## Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities



 Integrate and expand enrichment opportunities through curriculum connected field trips, assemblies and family engagement activities with the support of local partners.

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice



- Strengthen student and family voice in decision-making by utilizing the needs assessment and survey data regularly to inform programming.
- Include student leadership, family representatives and community partners on the Community Schools Steering Committee.

Integrated Systems of Support



- Address the top needs as identified in the needs assessment to include; access to mental health services, food/clothing resources and extra curricular opportunities.
- Leverage community partnerships and county resources to build a coordinated referral system for basic needs and mental health support.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



- Create a supportive and inclusive environment where students feel emotionally and physically safe and cared for, while implementing best SEL practices and building strong relationships with trusted adults.
- Train staff in trauma-informed, culturally responsive and restorative practices.
- Recognize and celebrate student success with families and the community.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement



- Strengthen our student ambassador program to welcome and mentor peers and new families through a variety of forums including in-person, virtual, newsletters and email/text blasts.
- Offer regular, accessible family engagement events including workshops, cultural nights and social events.
