

FDC: Education of Migrant Students

The superintendent will develop and implement a program to ensure that migratory students receive appropriate services in the same manner as other students selected to receive services.

The program shall contain a means to:

- Identify migrant students and assess their educational and related health and social needs.
- Provide a full range of services to migrant students including applicable Title I programs, special education, gifted education, vocational education, language programs, counseling programs, and elective classes.
- Provide migrant children with the opportunity to meet the same statewide assessment standards that all children are expected to meet.
- Provide advocacy and outreach programs to migrant children and their families and professional development for district staff.
- Provide parent/guardians an opportunity for meaningful participation in the program.
- Parent Involvement in the Migrant Education Program (MEP)

The district in conjunction with parents/guardians of migrant students shall develop a parental involvement plan and compact, which shall be adopted by the Board and integrated into the district's overall parental involvement policy and compact. The MEP parental plan shall contain procedures for consulting and communicating with parent(s)/guardian(s) about student achievement and the migrant program's development, operation, and evaluation.
