Air Force JROTC Launching at High School This Year

Barbers Hill ISD will launch an Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps program at Barbers Hill High School this year. This new opportunity brings a nationally recognized leadership and character development program to our campus and community.

While grounded in military tradition, AFJROTC is not a military recruiting program, and there is no obligation for students to enlist in the armed forces. Instead, the program emphasizes life skills, leadership, citizenship, and personal growth—preparing students for success in any career path they choose.

AFJROTC is open to all Barbers Hill High School students in grades 9 through 12. Participants will engage in a curriculum that blends aerospace science, leadership education, physical fitness, and service learning. Cadets will also have the opportunity to take part in Leadership Development Activities, such as field trips, drill and ceremony, and team-building events.

Barbers Hill High School unveils \$75 million expansion this year

Barbers Hill High School has officially completed a significant \$75 million expansion, increasing the school's footprint by 30 percent. The extensive project, driven by the Barbers Hill ISD's growing student population, adds 150,000 square feet of new construction, renovates 32,000 square feet of existing space, and provides 73,000 square feet for 256 new parking spaces.

The expansion comes at a critical time for Barbers Hill ISD, which anticipates enrolling 8,226 students in the upcoming 2025-26 school year. Projections for the 2030-31 school year range dramatically from 11,389 to 14,866 students, highlighting the need for increased capacity.

The centerpiece of the expansion is a **new three-story classroom wing** and a one-story **PE/Athletic facility**, designed to accommodate an additional 1,000 high school students.

The new additions boast an impressive array of features, including:

- **40 grade-level classrooms**
- **10 science labs** with dedicated prep and storage areas
- Modern **administration and counseling suites**
- A **dance studio** complete with dressing rooms and storage



- Specialized **CTE (Career and Technical Education) lab spaces** for Health Services, Anatomy and Physiology, Business Management, and STEM programs
- An **auxiliary gymnasium**
- **PE dressing rooms**
- **Team meeting and multi-purpose activity spaces**
- Dedicated **football dressing rooms** for both JV and Varsity teams
- New offices for the athletic director and coaches

Beyond the new construction, significant renovations have been made to the existing Barbers Hill High School building. These

improvements include modifications to the administration offices and athletic dressing/training rooms, an expansion of the clinic and attendance office, upgrades to faculty workrooms and food service areas, and the centralization of special services instructional, lab, and office spaces.

Originally opened in 2001 with 295,000 square feet and featuring its distinctive three towering rotundas, Barbers Hill High School now spans an impressive 644,000 square feet. This extensive expansion solidifies the school's position as a cornerstone of student learning in the Barbers Hill community, ready to serve its rapidly growing student body for years to come.

School district heralds Centennial Class

On April 26, 1929, a unanimous 42-0 vote by the communities of Mont Belvieu and Winfree laid the foundation for something extraordinary: Barbers Hill Independent School District.

A century later, as Superintendent Dr. Greg Poole aptly puts it, this milestone isn't just about the passage of time, but "a testament to resilience, growth, and enduring excellence."

This year marks a pivotal moment, as the students who will proudly form the district's centennial class in 2029 step through the doors of high school, poised to graduate a century after the district's inception.

The journey of the Class of 2029 has been one of remarkable growth, mirroring the district's own expansion. When this cohort first entered kindergarten in 2016, they numbered 381 strong. At that time, Barbers Hill ISD operated six schools. Since then, the district has rapidly expanded, adding two intermediate schools with two more primary schools on the horizon, all to accommodate its ever-burgeoning enrollment.

The Class of 2029's numbers swelled alongside the district's development. By

the time they reached second grade, their ranks had grown to 427. This upward trend continued, with 569 students in their sixth-grade year, a direct reflection of new homes popping up across the thriving school district.

Today, as they embark on their high school journey, the Class of 2029 stands at an impressive 659 members, making them the largest freshman class in district history – so far.

Among this historic class are the "Century in Sight" students, a special group first featured in the district's 2015 newsletter. Initially photographed by district photographer Valerie Hull after their pre-K graduation, their annual photo tradition continued until the onset of COVID-19. Of the original 10 students who posed for those early pictures, seven remain within the district. While only six were able to make the latest photoshoot, most were, perhaps predictably, less than impressed by the honor of being a "Century in Sight" student – a charming reminder of their youthful perspective on history in the making.

From its humble beginnings as a one-room schoolhouse serving a handful of students,

The centennial class now enters a state-of-the-art high school sprawling over 600,000 square feet, a stark contrast to the district's origins. With the student body now topping 8,000, the Class of 2029 is not just entering high school; they are stepping into a legacy, ready to define the next chapter of Barbers Hill ISD's remarkable story.



Lori May – Distinguished Alumnus

In a community where tradition runs deep and "Eagle Pride" is more than just a slogan, one name stands out as a testament to unwavering dedication and a servant's heart: Lori May. A proud member of the Barbers Hill High School Class of 1985, May has been named the Barbers Hill ISD 2025 Distinguished Alumnus, an honor that celebrates her profound impact on both the schools and the community she has called home her entire life.

The Distinguished Alum award recognizes individuals who embody the character traits of leadership and service, demonstrated through their personal and professional successes. Lori May's journey is a living embodiment of these ideals.

From her days as a Barbers Hill High School student, May was a shining example of Eagle excellence. She graced the football field as a four-year cheerleader, was crowned Homecoming Queen, and earned the title of Miss BHHS. Her athletic prowess was evident as a state qualifier in the 800-meter relay and a key member of the 1983 state championship basketball team. Beyond her achievements, her spirit of community was fostered through her involvement in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Lori May's connection to Barbers Hill didn't end with graduation; it deepened. For an astonishing 38 years, she has dedicated her professional life to BHISD, serving in a diverse array of roles that speak to her versatility and commitment. Her career path has touched nearly every facet of the district, including stints in the business office, public relations, as high school registrar, teacher, counselor, and 504 coordinator. Today, she serves as the Executive Director of Safe Schools, a critical role in ensuring the well-being of the district's students and staff. Her exceptional contributions were recognized in 2020 when she was named BHISD Professional of the Year.

Beyond her official duties, May's passion for service extends into the fabric of the community. In 2010, she initiated the beloved "Christmas on the Hill" parade, an event that has since become a cherished annual tradition, bringing joy and festive spirit to Mont Belvieu. She has also lent her time and expertise to the Homecoming Association Committee and the BHISD Sports Hall of Honor Committee, actively preserving and celebrating the rich history of her alma mater.

When asked about the importance of serving the Barbers Hill community, May's response is heartfelt and clear. *"I believe that in order to keep Barbers Hill special, we must be intentional in keeping our values intact. This is a special place,"* she emphasizes. *"I love serving my community, supporting our kids and showing up when they need us."*



We must be good examples to them so that one day they can continue to carry on the Eagle traditions that make this place so special. Keeping our standards high is what makes Barbers Hill so great."

Her love for Barbers Hill traditions is palpable. *"I love that our founding fathers way back began traditions such as the bonfire, 'We Can, We Will' slogan, our school song,"* she shares.

May firmly believes that Barbers Hill's greatest strength lies in its unwavering commitment to high expectations. *"I believe that keeping our expectations high and not doing what others do is what keeps us so great,"* she states. *"It's very difficult to keep our success at such a high level year after year. I believe*

that staying ahead of our growth is a key factor in our success. Our superintendent and school board are very committed to keeping us all Eagles. They have been very strategic in controlling our growth that we don't lose sight of still being one district with the same vision."

The May family's roots run deep within Barbers Hill. "My entire family attended Barbers Hill," Lori proudly shares, listing her mom, dad, sister, and two brothers. Her mother, who retired from BHISD after working as a bus driver and cafeteria manager, was a profound influence. "She brought us to every event the school had. My mom was very active in the school. She volunteered her time at the Gulf Coast Classic Basketball Tournament from the very beginning. She cooked for the coaches in the hospitality room. She helped in the Ag Department, and she is the reason that having a servant's heart is very important."

On Aug. 1, Lori and her husband Benny May celebrated 38 years of marriage. Benny May himself has served on the BHISD School Board for almost 30 years, further solidifying the family's unparalleled commitment to the district.

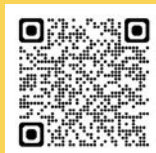

Rusty Senac – 2025 Honorary Eagle



In a testament to a lifetime dedicated to community leadership, longtime Beach City resident Rusty Senac has been named the 2025 Honorary Eagle by Barbers Hill ISD. This award recognizes individuals who, while not graduates of Barbers Hill, have profoundly and lastingly impacted the district, its students, and the wider community.

Born in New Orleans and a sixth-generation native of Louisiana, Senac's roots run deep, a heritage he proudly acknowledges as a member of the Sons of the American Revolution. His journey led him to Texas, where he attended Strake Jesuit High School and the University of Houston, earning a BBA.

For over 50 years, Rusty was a prominent healthcare executive in the Houston area, specializing in Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. He served as Executive Director of Brown & Associates Medical Laboratories for 24 years and consulted for numerous internal medicine clinics and pathology groups.

However, it is his unparalleled commitment to public and community service that truly defines Senac's legacy. Since settling in Beach City in 1980 with his wife Jenny – with whom he will celebrate their 55th wedding anniversary in August – his civic engagement is legendary.

For 21 years, he served on the Beach City Council, including a decade as Mayor. Beyond elected office, he was a hands-on volunteer, dedicating 16 years as a volunteer EMT and firefighter for the Beach City Volunteer Fire Department, where he also held various office roles. He was a co-founder of the Chambers County Fire and Rescue Association, further solidifying his commitment to public safety.

Senac's influence expanded across Chambers County. He was elected Chambers County Commissioner Pct. 4 in 2010, serving two terms until his retirement in 2018. He served on the boards of both the Mont Belvieu and Baytown Chambers of Commerce, the Coastal Water Authority, and the Houston Galveston Area Council, serving on various HGAC committees during his time as Beach City Mayor and County Commissioner.

Even in retirement, Senac remains an active force in the community. He is a dedicated member of Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Mont Belvieu. He is an active member of the Baytown Rotary Club and the Barbers Hill Lions Club. His current board memberships underscore his continued dedication to regional development and education: the Baytown West Chambers County Economic Development Foundation, the Lee College Foundation Board, the Barbers Hill Scholarship Association Board and the United Way of Greater Baytown and Chambers County Board.

His profound impact on Barbers Hill ISD is particularly noteworthy. Rusty served on Barbers Hill ISD bond committees and was a huge supporter of the BH branch campus initiative, demonstrating his belief in the power of education and his commitment to the district's growth and success.

Senac's community service has not gone unnoticed. He has been honored multiple times as Beach City Person of the Year (1993 & 2003) and West Chambers County Person of the Year (2014) by the Mont Belvieu Chamber of Commerce. The Texas Department of Transportation Commissioners recognized him as a "Texas Road Hand" in 2018. Exxon-Mobil Baytown/MB complex facilities recognized him as honorary "Refiner of the Year" in 2022 for his exemplary service to the Baytown area. In 2025, he received the prestigious Fred Hartman Leadership Award from the Baytown Chamber of Commerce for Outstanding Leadership and Service.

Beyond his impressive resume, Rusty finds joy in family, community service, activities involving Galveston Bay, indulging in Gulf Coast seafood, especially blue crabs, and family genealogy. His life is a testament to dedicated service, quiet leadership, and a profound love for his community.

4. Select **Off, Instant or Digest** for each type of notification (Email, Text, App), and for each school or district if there is more than one.

New coach ready to kick off first football season at The Hill

The Cody Simper era of Barbers Hill football kicks off with a road game season opener on Aug. 29 versus New Caney. The first home game will be on Sept. 12 versus Deer Park.

Simper took over the Eagle football program in February. Over the course of his career, Simper has compiled a 106-55 overall record. Most recently, he led Cypress Woods to an 8-3 season in 2024, following a district championship performance in 2022. Before Cypress Woods, Simper spent five seasons at Corpus Christi Veterans Memorial, where he posted an impressive 50-14 record and guided the team to the Class 5A-Division I state semifinals in 2020.

Here is a Q&A with the new Eagles head football coach:

Any new game day routines for football team?

The game day experience begins first thing in the morning, as our varsity team members will meet for what we call our "Family Meeting". This includes a team breakfast, devotional, and goal setting. It is a great way to get the guys out

of bed and focus on the day ahead. Our guys will also look different on game day, as they will be in professional dress. These student-athletes are young men and leaders in our community and school. It is important that they are able to carry and present themselves with pride.

What's your overarching coaching philosophy, both for football and for developing young athletes?

Athletics is a great tool for learning how to be successful in life. We believe in our program's principles of respect, discipline, commitment, and work ethic. When we are being successful in any phase of life, it is likely that we are being successful in upholding those principles. The same is true for being unsuccessful. Those principles are great places to reflect and redirect.

Our kids learn that they will be competing throughout their entire lives, so learning how to win is crucial. We believe that winning is a skill that can be taught through teaching how to set goals, create action plans to accomplish goals, and develop the grit to execute plans.

How do you define success for a high school football program?

We define success by being able to answer one question. Is Barbers Hill High School a better place to get an education because our program exists? It is our purpose to uplift our community by providing leadership that inspires school pride and a world class learning environment. We then align our goals to reach that purpose. Those goals include academic success of our players, leadership in our school and community, and building a championship program. It is impossible to overstate the impact a team can have by accomplishing those goals.

What style of offense and defense do you plan to run?

Offensively, we line up in multiple formations and utilize a number of shifts and motions to put us in the best position possible to attack defenses. From that point, the goal is to get the ball into the hands of the playmakers. This includes a balanced running and passing game, that includes a vertical passing attack that will stretch defenses and not allow them to key in on any single player or play.

Defensively, we will line up in an odd front, that allows us to move from three down defensive linemen to four, depending on the offensive formation. Defense starts correct alignment, technique, and playing with relentless effort. We will focus on stopping the run and mixing blitzes and coverages to create turnovers in obvious passing situations.

Any final thoughts?

We graduated the majority of our starting offensive and defensive units, but our young men have worked hard all spring and summer and are prepared to step up and fill those voids. We are a young, but very talented team. When you couple that with the quality of competition that we will face, it will make for a very exciting 2025 season!

High School Achieves Highest Ever 5A Lone Star Cup Ranking

Barbers Hill High School concluded the 2024-2025 school year with its most impressive performance to date in the UIL Lone Star Cup, securing a seventh-place finish among 253 Class 5A schools. This marked the highest ranking the school has achieved at the 5A level since the inception of the comprehensive award in 1997.

Barbers Hill finished second in 2006 when it was a 3A school. The highest previous finish at the 5A level was 11th in 2021.

The UIL Lone Star Cup is a highly coveted honor, recognizing the top-ranking schools in each of the six classifications (1A-6A) based on their overall success in district and state championships across academics, athletics, and various extracurricular activities. Points are awarded for overall team achievement in a wide array of competitions, including Team Tennis, Military Band, Volleyball, Football, Spirit, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, VEX Robotics, Girls Soccer, District Academic Champions, One-Act Play, Baseball and Softball. Individual champions, while celebrated, do not contribute to the team's Lone Star Cup point total; points are exclusively earned through team district championships and post-season advancements.

Ticket sales are final and are non-refundable. All reserved tickets will be digital.

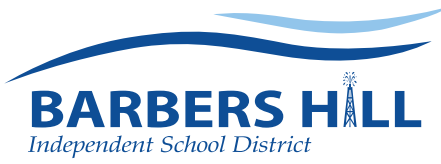
