### HOW TO REPORT TO REPORT AN ABSENCE

The phones at the high school will usually be answered from 7:00am-8:40am. Our automated attendant is accessible the remainder of the day. Reporting an absence can be completed the following ways:

1. Phone call- 715-387-8464
2. Email- [attendancehs@marshfieldschools.org](mailto:attendancehs@marshfieldschools.org)
3. Skyward Family Access- Click on Attendance and Absence Requests

If you call in your child's absence or we contact you by phone, you do not have to send a note indicating the reason for the absence. However, if you do not call, or we cannot reach you, your child is marked as "unexcused-absent without reason" for the day until a note is brought in or a phone call is placed to explain the reason for the absence. This must be done within 5 days of the absence in order to change it to excused.

If your student is absent due to a medical appointment, please bring a note signed by the provider. This will then be excused as medical and not counted as a regular absence. This must be done within 30 days of the appointment.

## **Student Fees for the 25-26 School Year:**

- *Materials Use Fee-* \$35.00 (applies to all students)
- *New Student Registration Fee-* \$20.00 (all students brand new to the district)
- *Course Fees* (vary)
- *Parking Pass-* \$30 Must be paid in person as the student's valid driver's license must be presented at the time of purchase, along with license plate number of vehicle/s.

**Please make every effort to attend registration this week. If you are unable due to a prior conflict, you may register in the MHS Main Office from 7:30AM-3:00PM Monday-Friday starting on Friday, August 15th.**

**Please note that student services will be available sporadically beginning Friday, August 15th. Schedule changes will need to be requested through the QR code and will be answered in the order that they are received.**

## **Schedule Change Request Information**

- Schedule change requests will be processed during registration week.
- Students will have the option to avoid lines at registration by submitting a digital form with their change request. QR codes for the form will be posted around the school during registration week.
- The form will also be linked on the high school website as of August 12th.
- Counselors are available for walk-in meetings with students and/or parents on registration days.
- Prior to making a change request, please ensure that the reason fits within the board-approved schedule change policy, which can be read on the next page.
- Counselors are unable to accommodate requests that do not have a valid reason within the change policy.

# SCHEDULE *CHAnge* POLICY



Students may drop any course and add another course in their schedule for one or more of the following reasons:

- For medical reasons
- Due to significant changes to a student's post-high school plans
- There is a computer error on the student's schedule
- There are two study halls in one semester and none in the other
- The student is in a Co-op, Health Career Connections, Work-Based Learning, or Youth Apprenticeship and needs to be free at certain times for his/her job
- The student IEP requires that modifications be made
- The class needs to be added as it is a graduation requirement

## Adding a Course to Your Schedule

Students may add a course in place of a study hall during the first **six** school days of a semester if space is available in the course. Students must consult with the teacher regarding make-up requirements for any missed content for the new class.

## Dropping a Course From Your Schedule

Students may withdraw from a course if they make the request during the first four weeks of each semester and if they continue to have 6.5 credits on their schedule for the school year without the dropped class.

Students who drop a class after this time will receive a grade of "F" and have a failing grade included in their grade point average.

If students need to add a class to reach 6.5 credits, the class must be added during the first six days of the semester and must fit into their schedule without moving other classes.

## Request For a Course-Level Change

To initiate a course-level change after the 6-day window has ended, the following process must be completed:

1. The student, parent, and teacher must communicate to discuss the reason for the request.
2. If it is determined after this communication that a level change is advisable, the teacher will notify the school counselor to process a schedule change.
3. Outside of the 6-day change window, level changes can only occur at quarter breaks in the grading periods. The student's quarter grade from the previous course will be entered in the grade book for the new course and averaged for the semester grade.

## Project Graduation 2026

### ATTENTION ALL HIGH SCHOOL PARENTS

Preparations for Project graduation for the Marshfield High School class of 2026 will soon be underway. This marks the 39th year for this program and another great year of activities, entertainment, and many great prizes!  
Project graduation can only be accomplished with the participation of parents at all grade levels.

Monetary donations as well as time and energy are the most basic items required to provide our 2026 seniors with a great memory of their graduation night.

The planning committee will begin meeting in January, with monthly meetings continuing through May. Specific needs will be decided and shared with all parents during this time. Please watch for more information to come as the school year starts.

## Open Campus Privileges for Juniors and Seniors

Open Campus for study halls and lunch is a privilege for juniors and seniors meeting the following criteria (these address the areas of academics, attendance, and conduct):

- No discipline referrals or assigned consequences for concerning behaviors.
- No failing/incomplete grades for lunch privileges; no grades below a C- for study hall privileges.
- No excessive absenteeism (excused absences reaching/exceeding the 10 allowed by law).
- No more than 5 periods of unexcused absence and/or tardies for lunch privileges.
- No more than 3 periods of unexcused absence and/or 3 tardies for study halls privileges.

The above criteria are checked approximately every 3-4 weeks (2-3 times per quarter) so students have a chance to earn back the privilege if they did not qualify during a criteria check. Dates for the next check are shared with families and teachers are given specific dates in which to update grades for this and other administrative processes.

A student's custodial parent/guardian must give consent for his or her child to leave campus. Consent will be given through **Skyward Family Access** which will open on August 12th and continue thru the school year. Consent may be withdrawn by a parent/guardian at any time by calling the Marshfield High School Main Office.

Students are expected to maintain requirements to retain the privilege; administration reserves the right to revoke the privilege at any time for students no longer meeting requirements or other conduct issues that create a concern for safety. While off campus, the students may not be involved with law enforcement by violating any laws or ordinances and retain their privilege.

## **Registration is Open!**

The next meeting is scheduled for **Tuesday, August 20 at 6:00 p.m.** This meeting is required for all families participating in athletics for the 2025–2026 school year.

## **Physicals & Payments:**

- Physical exams must be dated after April 1, 2024 and are valid for two years. Forms must be signed by a physician and a parent, and can be uploaded during registration.
- We've streamlined the process with online payment through MySchoolBucks, accessed during registration in Arbiter.
- Teams with supply fees will see those added later through Skyward once rosters are finalized.
- Outstanding obligations from previous years must be resolved—or a payment plan arranged—before participation can begin.

# SKYWARD FAMILY ACCESS

Skyward Family Access allows parents/guardians access to their children's schedules, grades, attendance, lunch account balance, report cards, and more. Logins remain the same from year to year. Passwords are individual and are not available from the school.

If you do not know your Skyward username, please contact the MHS Main Office at 715-387-8464 for a password reset link to be sent to your email. Please make sure your email is updated.

## Report Cards

Current year and past years' report cards can be found under the Portfolio tab in Skyward Family Access.

Please note that we do not print report cards for Quarters 1, 2, or 3. Report cards will be uploaded to the Portfolio tab in Skyward Family Access once grades are final each quarter. A final year report card will be printed and mailed home once grades are finalized in June.

## Changing Family Information in Skyward

Skyward Family Access "Request Changes" helps your information be more accurate and timely. Here are the steps to request a change:

1. Log into Skyward Family Access
2. Go to the "Student Info" tab
3. On the right, click on "Request Changes"
4. Select the information to be changed
5. Click on "Save" at the bottom of the screen to submit the changes.

District staff will process your request. Please do not request address changes prior to your move.

## **Attendance Policy**

A child may be excused for up to **10** days in a school year by a parent/guardian for any reason per state statute. However, absences beyond 10 days require a note from a physician to be excused. Previous excused absences due to approved school-related activities or when medical notes stating the student was seen by a medical professional were provided do not count towards the 10 days.

**Senior Status:** Students of senior status may not be excused from school in excess of 20 school days. School-sponsored activities will not be counted toward the 20-day limit. Documentation will be requested upon reaching the 20-day threshold. Students surpassing the 20-day threshold will not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony including Project Graduation.

## RESTRICTION OF YOUR STUDENT'S RECORDS

Under the No Child Left Behind Education Act, military recruiters have full access to all high school student records. This access can only be restricted if parents indicate in Skyward that they do not wish to have the information released. This can be done in Skyward Family Access under the Student Info tab. Click on Request Changes and go into Student Information. At the bottom, you will see a "Military Use" area where you can select "Yes" or "No". Don't forget to hit "Save"!

### Does the School District Carry Medical Insurance?

The answer is NO.

The school district has no medical payment coverage for student injuries or accidents that may occur on school property.

## IPADS

The district iPad damage deductible will cover all families/students in the event of accidental damage, loss, or theft at the following rates. Note that this applies to damage that occurs in and outside of school.

- One incident of accidental damage at no charge
- Second incident of accidental damage with a \$60 deductible
- One incident of loss with \$100 deductible

## Transcript release & Transcript requests

The **Transcript Release Form** (which includes the option to release rank) is available in the counseling office and on the counseling department website. A signed Transcript Release Form must be on file with our registrar before any requests to release or send a transcript can be met.

Official transcript requests must be made through Xello. Unofficial transcripts are often acceptable for upload into online college applications and can be obtained in pdf form by contacting a student's counselor or the registrar.

\*Please allow at least one week's processing time for all transcript requests.

## PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT / National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test)

The PSAT/NMSQT test will be given on the morning of October 9, 2025, to interested sophomores and juniors. Parents and students received email communication about the test opportunity in May 2025 and sign-up occurred through submission of an online form.

Students who signed up in May will be asked to confirm their intent to test and provided with additional testing details in early September. Limited seating may be available for additional interested students who did not sign up previously.

A charge of \$18 per test will be posted in Skyward fees after the test is administered; no payments by check or cash should be sent.

This is an optional exam that tests students' verbal, mathematical, and writing abilities. If taken as a junior, the PSAT is the route of entry to the National Merit Scholarship Program. PSAT results can also be used to help students select appropriate Advanced Placement courses.

The [MHS Counseling Page](#) is a great place to find information on academic planning, post-secondary exploration career resources, frequently used forms, scholarship opportunities, financial aid, and more. We strongly encourage you to check it out.

## HAVE YOU CHECKED YOUR AP SCORES?

The College Board reports AP scores exclusively online. Students must log in to their AP account and enter the proper identifying information in order to view their scores.

Students who want to check their scores may do so at:

<https://apscore.collegeboard.org/scores>

Once students are able to view their scores, their score report should list ALL the AP scores they have earned during their high school career. If a score report does not show all the scores, it is likely that there is a problem with the student's identifying information that has prevented all the scores from being consolidated.

Students having account or scoring problems must call 888-225-5427 and select the "0" option to speak with a College Board representative and request a score consolidation.

## Financial Aid and Scholarships

Any student who is planning to pursue post-secondary education in the 2026-27 academic year should complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The FAFSA must be submitted to be considered for federal and state financial aid including grants and loans. The 2026-27 FAFSA is expected to be accessible online at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov) on October 1, 2025. The counseling team will try to provide notification of any changes to this date but parents and students are also encouraged to monitor [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov) for updates.

Wisconsin students can get free help completing their FAFSA at College Goal Wisconsin events held throughout the state. Visit <https://collegegoalwi.org> to register for one of these events when they are scheduled for the upcoming year. In addition to getting professional help with FAFSA completion, attendees will have the opportunity to enter a drawing to win a scholarship.

Many scholarship listings are available on the high school website. Go to High School Home / Counseling Department/[Scholarships](#). New/additional opportunities will be added as they become available. Make sure to watch for local, regional, state, and national updates.

## HOW MUCH CREDIT WILL YOU RECEIVE FROM A COLLEGE FOR YOUR AP SCORES?

Each college has its own unique policy for accepting AP credits. If you earned AP scores, it is a good strategy to review the AP policies for the colleges you are interested in. These can vary considerably, especially with private schools. The amount of credit you can receive from your AP scores may be an important factor in college selection process.

You can generally find a colleges' AP credit policy on each college's website, or you could contact a college's admissions office and request that a copy be mailed to you.

The University of Wisconsin HELP website provides this information for public universities in Wisconsin at: <https://uwhelp.wisconsin.edu/prep-for-college/credits/>

Also, College Board website: <https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/creditandplacement/search-credit-policies> will allow you to view college AP credit policy information.

Many technical colleges also grant credit for AP test scores. Contact an admissions official at the technical college you are interested in to find out which exams might give you credit. Remember that even if you will not receive credit for your scores, your participation in the rigor of an AP class or classes will help you in the college admissions process.

College success research clearly shows that your participation in an AP class will also improve your chances of success in college. Many students' score lower on their first AP exam, but score higher in the succeeding years as they develop their academic skills.

- Photo must be in original file format. Please do not send a screenshot!

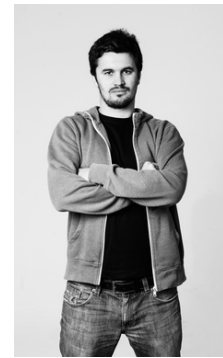

# ***Need a Work Permit?***

A work permit is required before anyone under the age of 16 is allowed to work in any job except for agriculture or domestic service work. As of July 1, 2023, the Marshfield High School Office no longer has the ability to process work permits.

All work permits must be applied for on the following website:

Once the application is complete, a child may start their job with the confirmation email. The work permit will be mailed directly to the employer from the Department of Workforce Development.

## Pathway Partners

Pathway Partners, a United Way Partner Program, is a career focused mentoring program designed to assist Marshfield High School students explore their post high school career goals. Pathway Partners is free and is open to all students.

To join, students simply complete a short application stating their career interests, personal interests, and hobbies. An adult volunteer from the community who works in that career and shares similar interests is then matched as a mentor. Mentors and mentees meet about once a month during the school year. Each mentor and mentee design their own relationship based on the student's interests, goals and availability. Meetings can occur at school or in the community.

A mentor can enrich and enhance a student's career development planning. The mentor is not meant to replace the guidance of parents, teachers and counselors. The mentor's purpose is to simply be another adult available to support, encourage and guide the student during the high school experience. A mentor can add another dimension to the student's life and help the student to consider post high school options.

Mentors listen; share their own work experience, knowledge and expertise with their mentee; and can serve as a link to experiences that the mentee might not otherwise have. Mentors and students may go to coffee or lunch together or volunteer in the community. The relationship is meant to be fun and rewarding for both!

Students who have participated in Pathway Partners have commented that having a mentor "made me feel more confident and secure", that my mentor "accepts me for who I am and looks past my disability", and my mentor "has definitely helped me grow as a person".

Pathway Partners will also assist with setting up job shadowing or informational interview opportunities and community networking. Students interested in a short-term experience to learn more about a specific career can set up a job shadow or informational interview experience through Pathway Partners.

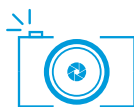

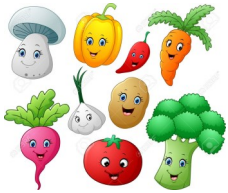

## Food Service Policy: Negative Balances

Below is the negative balance section of the Food Service Policy.

*School District personnel will notify families with low or negative balances. Negative/low balance statements will be issued once per week at the junior and senior level and twice per month at the elementary level. For elementary students, no more than three (3) charges will be allowed per student. If the family cannot be contacted by phone, a letter will be sent. After the third charge, elementary students will be served a sandwich and water until the account is paid in full. The appropriate cost for the sandwich will be added to the family account.*

*Junior and senior students do have the opportunity to pay cash for items from the a la carte line if they have a zero or negative balance in their account. If a student has money to purchase a reduced price or paid meal at the time of meal service, a full meal will be provided. The money will not be used to repay unpaid charges if the students intends to eat that day.*

Here are a few tips to make sure your food service account is in good standing.

- If you have received a text or email indicating your balance is low or negative, send payment as soon as possible or make a payment in Skyward Family Access.
- Talk with your middle and high school students to set limits on ala carte spending if needed
