### **Community Center for Athletics and Wellness: Lead Donor - *Funded***

The Community Center for Athletics and Wellness will inspire generations of Catlin Gabel students to advocate for their own self-care and become the best version of themselves, physically and emotionally. In addition to fostering wellness and physical discovery in ways that have not been previously possible, the new Community Center will foster greater community across all grades and ensure the school can continue its long tradition of offering no-cut athletics programs. Built near the main entrance, this facility will transform the arrival experience onto campus, reflecting the importance of the Community Center and your gift in support of health and wellness.

### **Gymnasium Floor: Naming Level \$3 Million**

The gym is intentionally designed to be a flexible space where it can be modified to meet the needs of the audience. The equipment and seating will be moveable so that the floor can be arranged for all-school gatherings, graduation ceremonies, athletic games, and special events. The size of the gym will be able to accommodate nearly 1,400 people, the largest indoor gathering space on campus. The use of natural materials will create a warm and inviting environment

### **Dining Commons: Naming Level \$2 Million**

The new dining commons will more than double our seating capacity for lunch time, provide much needed indoor social spaces during the day for Middle and Upper School students, and create opportunities for meaningful connection among students, faculty, and staff. Beginning and Lower School students will still utilize our iconic barn for meals, giving our youngest students their own space for meals and social connection. This new dining commons will be equipped with a full commercial kitchen, enabling us to host more events on campus. Imagine the generations of Eagles and visitors in what will surely be one of the most utilized and beloved spaces on campus.



### **Alumni Center: Naming Level \$1.5 Million**

The Community Center will also serve as an alumni and visitor center with our very own Alumni Center located adjacent to the main entrance and lobby. The Alumni Center will promote a sense of community and showcase our alumni and history with displays of photos, history, and rotating exhibits from archives. It will provide adequate space for alumni to reconnect and remember their time at the school, space for current students to connect and study, and will welcome prospective families in the admissions process. We are excited to have such a wonderful setting to tell the story of Catlin Gabel, past, present, and future.

### **Bazemore Lobby: Naming Level \$500,000**

The main foyer area is intentionally designed to also function as an event space. Its open size will accommodate multiple sitting areas and comfortably welcome larger groups. The easy access to other areas of the Community Center will also encourage further exploration. Imagine entering this foyer named after our beloved Head of School, which will regularly welcome hundreds of community members and guests, both during the day and evening.

As we approach Tim Bazemore's last year as Head of School, Don Vollum '84 and Alix Meier Goodman '71 kick off an exceptional effort to honor Tim and his service to Catlin Gabel. Don and Alix, both proud alumni and parents of alumni, have served Catlin Gabel on numerous boards and committees. ### **Movement and Wellness Studio: *Funded***

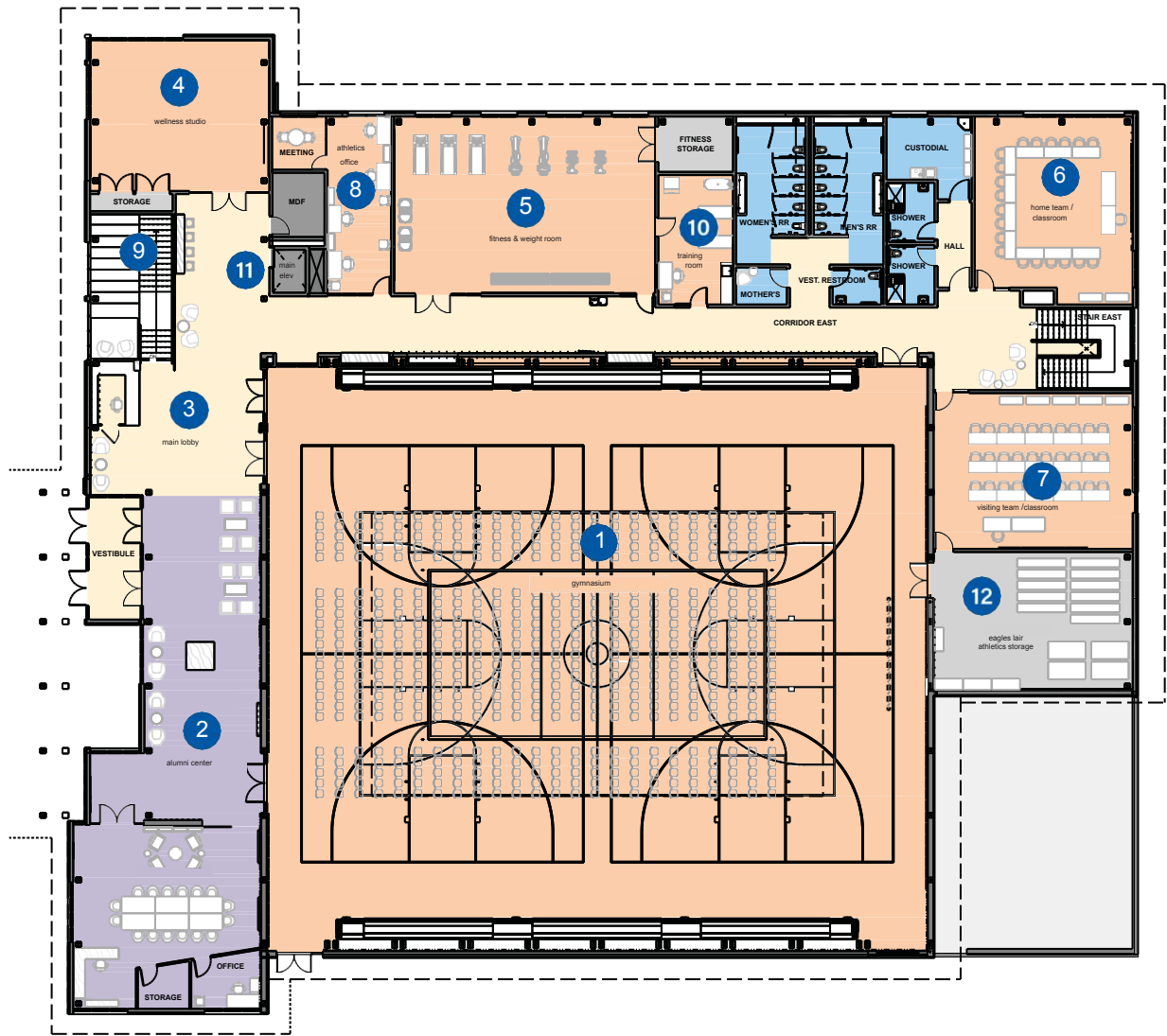
This multi-use space will be occupied, both during the day and into the evening. It will be designed to accommodate students jumping and stretching or engaging in classwork, as well as teachers, staff, and alumni gathering for smaller receptions or meetings. Special attention will be taken to the lighting, windows, and technology so that it can easily be transformed to serve multiple purposes. This is the largest gathering space within the building, outside of the gym.



### **Fitness and Weight Room: Naming Level \$500,000**

The Fitness and Weight Room will be located directly across from the gymnasium and next to the athletics office. It will have ample space for team and individual athlete workouts and will have cardio and weight training equipment.

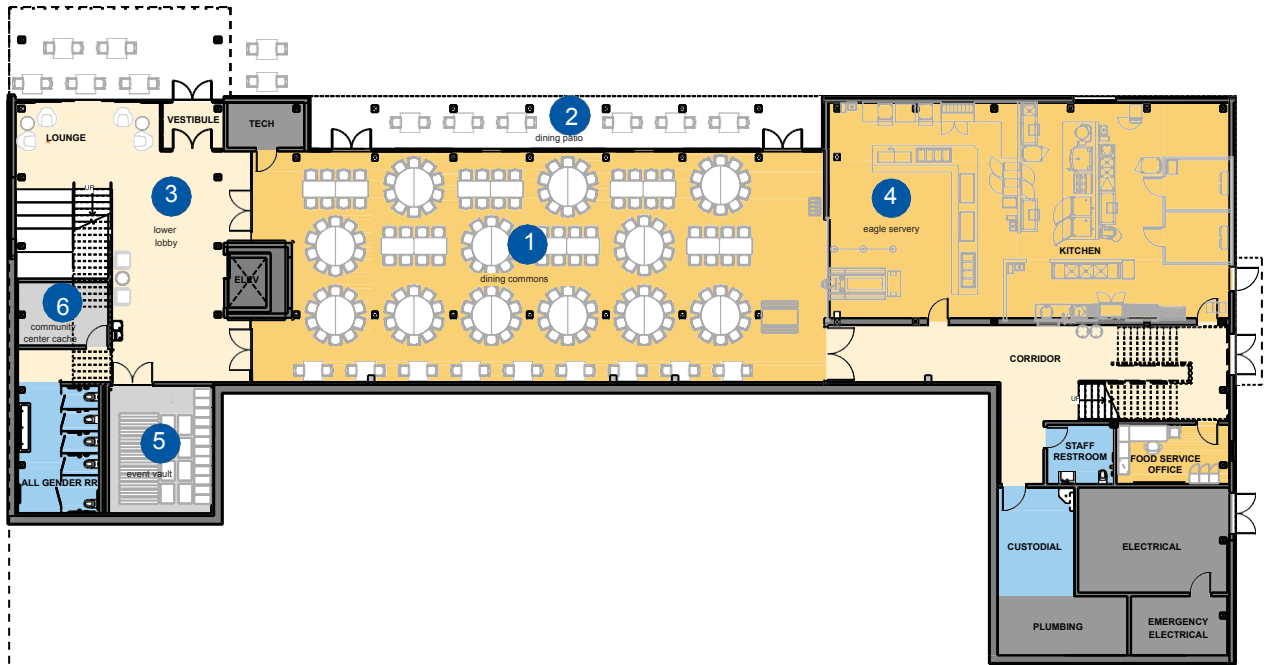


## Ground Level
