We hope your children are soon comfortable in their respective classes.

Looking ahead on the calendar, the third annual Building Legacies Golf Classic is scheduled to take place on September 21. Thanks to all those who have been working hard to ensure a successful tournament!

Short Reports of the Board.....

Report for....August 15, 2013

The chairman called the meeting to order, read from Psalm 16, and then led in prayer. The minutes from the meeting of June 3,2013 with the principal were approved as written. Matters from the previous meeting's minutes were looked over by the board, and their statuses noted. As incoming mail, the board received a request from Stephen and Jessica Chase to join the School Society; an official response will be sent. The agenda for the first part of the meeting with the principal was adopted as published.

The board discussed the latest principal's report. Darryn Kleyn introduced and talked about his first report as principal, noting that things have been going well and that much is being done for the start of the new school year. Highlights included an update that the Houweling family is settling in well, the class schedule for grades 1-4, appreciation for the retirement and health plan work that has been done, and a new policy on absence notification. The new process for alerting the school in the event of a student absence is to send an email to "absent@cornerstoneschool.us"; this will ensure a more efficient means of alerting the entire staff at once. D. Kleyn also updated the board on some summer professional development. He thanked the CBM and IT Committee for recent work done, noting that iPads have been purchased for Fine Arts purposes, and are being readied for use by S. Houweling. D. Kleyn informed the board that he has met with three families who have students attending for the first time, and introduced them to the school. Also discussed was a matter of surplus income collected from athletic events, and a publication of a supplies list before the start of school.

- B. Lodder gave an update on Ed Comm developments, noting that a suitable typing instruction program replacement has been found, and that the IT Committee will handle the installation of the software. Also noted was the importance of the ongoing Language Arts curriculum development by the committee.
- T. Faber updated the board on items relating to the building, including painting projects both completed and scheduled, fire sprinkler inspection, carpet cleaning, and new classroom equipment.
- T. Faber reviewed recent IT Committee work, including the addition of new iPads and computers, and the upcoming wiring of the new library area for Ethernet.

The board discussed items related to the school assembly to mark the start of the school year. The assembly is planned for the morning of Tuesday, August 27th.

The board discussed setting dates for a regular meeting schedule. It was decided to meet regularly on the second Monday of each month.

The board briefly discussed the discovery of a new Teacher's College Board of Governors representative, as well as a staff-board vearly kick-off barbeque.

The board discussed the school visit schedule for the new year and assigned members for the year's first three school visits. B. Lodder agreed to take the September/October date, J. Bareman the November/December date, and T. Faber the January/February date. Further dates will be scheduled at future meetings.

J. Doornbos updated the board that the compensation committee has gathered and compiled a large amount of data from across North America, and identified important expenses for staff respective to where they live. The committee continues to work to help solidify the data into future policy.

The next regular meeting was scheduled for September 9, 2013 at 7:30 PM, and the quarterly Big Picture meeting was scheduled for September 30, 2013 at 7:30 PM, both in the school building.

D. Kleyn was thanked for his time and left the meeting at 9:34 PM.

The minutes from the second half of the June 3, 2013 meeting were approved as written, and past action items were reviewed. The agenda for the second half of the meeting was adopted.

The board spent timing discussing financial matters. A preliminary look at the financials for 2012-13 was tabled for the next meeting. The board discussed the progress of the new membership committee and looks forward to an update from the committee regarding potential new members.

Delinquent tuition was discussed, as well as possible changes in personnel on the Finance Committee.

The board also discussed the possibility of increasing the size of the board by one member, citing an increased workload in HR matters, and agreed to come to a conclusion at the next meeting.

T. Faber gave an update on the upcoming Golf Tournament, noting that the committee has so far

raised \$5,000 above last year's corporate figures.

Related to the recent property purchase, T. Faber informed the board that the Society will most likely have to pay property taxes on the new land until we have a designated use for it. Until then, the existing arrangement of grazing livestock will be maintained.

E. Brown led in prayer and the meeting was closed.

From the Treasurer......Mr. John Doornbos

Not much has gone on since the last report. We've all enjoyed a bit of respite since the busy spring! One item that was still being worked on was the Operating Pledge Drive. That is now complete and we are thankful that we have received enough pledges again this year to reach the goal we had set, and that is true despite the additional drain of the property pledge earlier this year.

Staff health and dental benefits have been set up for those that are eligible. Following much research, we went with an HSA plan offered by Group Health. With this plan the school also put a start-up amount of money in the staff's HSA account to cover any initial out-of-pocket expenses that they might incur. Ultimately, this plan provides the staff with good health care and the peace-of-mind to know that if something should go wrong they have adequate health insurance.

The same positive update can be given for the retirement program. A few wrinkles needed to be worked out at the beginning of the school year as staff set up their accounts with Edward Jones but in the end it all appears to be working as expected.

The Golf Tournament Committee continues to be busy getting organized for the event on September 21st. All appears to be on track --- in fact the corporate sponsorships to-date appear to be ahead of pace of where we ended last year! Great work committee! As in past years, now is the time when the committee will start enrolling individual golfers to compliment the players that are playing for the corporate sponsors... so now is the time to connect with Ryan and the rest of the team to get your team or name in.

Committee work begins again this week as the Finance Committee and Compensation Sub-Committee meet with a view to get back on track with the projects we had on the go. We pray that the Lord will continue to bless the work being done with these and other committees!
