HARDIN-JEFFERSON ISD Career and Technical Education Annual Public Notification of Nondiscrimination

Hardin-Jefferson I.S.D. offers career and technical education programs in Agricultural, Food, and Natural Resources: Principles of Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources, Livestock Production, Small Animal Management, Equine Science, Advanced Animal Science, Veterinary Medical Applications, Agricultural Mechanics and Metal Technologies, Agricultural Structures Design and Fabrications, Agricultural Equipment Design and Fabrications, and Principles of Floral Design. Arts, Audio Video Technology, and Communications courses include: Audio Video Production I, Audio Video Production II, Video Game Design, Graphic Design and Illustration I, and Graphic Design and Illustration II. Business Management and Administration courses include: Principles of Business, Marketing, and Finance, Advertising, and Virtual Business. Health Science Education courses include: Principles of Health Science, Medical Terminology, Anatomy and Physiology, and Health Science. Law, Public Safety Corrections and Security courses include: Principles of Law, Public Safety, Corrections, and Security and Law Enforcement. Hospitality and Tourism courses include Culinary Arts and Advanced Culinary Arts. Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) courses include: Principles of Engineering, Engineering Design and Problem Solving, Scientific Research and Design, Engineering Science, and Computer Science. Admission to these programs is based on prerequisites, students grade level, and the course selection guide.
