New Georgia ELA K-12 Language and Texts Big Ideas:

Context: Students recognize influences on texts and analyze how they shape meaning.

Structures & Style: Students analyze and use organizational structures and style to shape ideas and information.

Techniques: Students analyze and apply various techniques to comprehend and shape meaning.

<u>Grammar Conventions</u>: Students observe, analyze, and use the structures and conventions of Standard English grammar, usage, and mechanics as they interpret and construct texts.

<u>Vocabulary:</u> Students engage in a wide range of written and spoken activities during which they expand and deepen their vocabularies, build word analysis skillsets (morphology), and determine or clarify the meanings of words and phrases.

Practices: Students engage routinely in four literacy practices that ground, shape, and inform the expectations of the Foundations, Language, and Texts domains.
