Other Information You Need to Know:

Student Schedules

The PowerSchool parent and student portal will open on August 11th. Students and parents will be able to view their child's schedule there. We are still in the process of adding new students and balancing class sizes. Students' schedules are not "Final" until school begins. Students will report to their homeroom class for the first day of school. Students will be assigned lockers, provided with the necessary school supplies, and learn about the expectations.



Student Expectations

Personal Electronic Devices (Cell phone, headphone, etc): Students will not be allowed to carry personal electronic devices during the school day. Our goal is to minimize distractions that can occur when students have access to phones/headphones/AirPods during learning time. Students are expected to secure their electronic devices in their lockers from 8:00 AM to 3:05 PM. Students will have access to their iPad throughout the day. Please be sure to discuss this expectation with your child before the start of the school year, as it will be enforced beginning on day 1. If a student has their personal electronic devices with them, they will be directed to return them to their locker or turn them in to the office. We will partner with parents, as needed, to ensure this expectation is consistently enforced.

Attendance: When children regularly attend school, they are more likely to develop their whole selves—personally, socially, academically, and emotionally. They can connect with friends and adults, collaborate, problem-solve, think critically, and be creative. In other words, showing up matters.



Hall Pass: Hall Pass is a digital tool that allows the school to monitor student movement throughout the building. This tool will provide the school with an additional behavioral data point to help us maximize students' learning time, identify patterns, and address any concerns that may arise. It is essential to us that students are present in class and actively engaged in learning.



S.O.A.R: We will continue to focus on S.O.A.R. this year as the anchor for our school's culture and climate. We have worked this summer to build out S.O.A.R. expectations for all the areas of the building. These will be shared with students on the first day of school. We have included a few examples below. Students will be able to earn PBIS points for exhibiting these positive behaviors throughout the school. Points can then be redeemed at our school or during one of our raffles.



The School Day

Doors will open at 7:30 AM for students wishing to eat breakfast. Adult supervision, on campus, begins at this time.

Students will enter the building to get ready for the school day at 7:50 AM. Classes begin at 8:00 AM and end at 3:05 PM. Students must arrive on time to optimize instructional time and minimize disruptions to the learning environment.

Students who demonstrate a pattern of being tardy will be addressed on the following continuum.

- 1. Reteaching the expectation
- 2. Parent communication
- 3. Problem-solving session(s) with the school counselor/social worker
- 4. Parent meeting

Breakfast and Lunch

Breakfast and lunch fees have been updated for this year. Families requesting Free/Reduced lunch, please complete the application <u>here</u> before the first day of school.

Middle school students (6-8 grades) can purchase a la carte items if they do NOT carry a negative account balance. Change for cash purchases will not be given; instead, the balance will be applied to the student's lunch account for future purchases.
