incinnati Public Schools offers families a wide range of choices through the CPS corridor model – making it easier to find the right educational fit. Students select their school based on the corridor where they live: East, Central or West. Each corridor features excellent schools and diverse learning pathways, including neighborhood schools, Montessori, Career and Technical Education and more– providing options for every interest and learning style.

Through the corridor model, students benefit from clear pathways and meaningful opportunities, from industry credentials and dual enrollment to college and career readiness. No matter which corridor you call home, CPS schools support the whole child and help every student thrive.





ENROLLMENT

CPS is proud to feature many educational choices, offering families options from neighborhood schools, magnet, Montessori, middle and junior high schools and high schools of choice, meaning students and their families have the opportunity to attend high schools in each of the District's corridors. While some schools have eligibility requirements, the corridor model helps provide equitable opportunities to all students.

To enroll at a magnet elementary school, junior high or a high school, students must apply through the School Selection Process and, in some cases, meet additional eligibility requirements. Students will be notified of their placement at the conclusion of the School Selection Process, at which time they will need to register for that school and provide required registration documents.

Once the student is registered, CPS will finalize the registration and enroll the student. Neighborhood schools have year-round enrollment based on the student's home address, and do not require participation in the School Selection Process. CPS has one elementary neighborhood school for each address in our district.

SCHOOL SELECTION PROCESS

The School Selection Process opens each year in the fall for the following school year, and is open to in-district families applying for an elementary magnet school or grades 7-9 at a junior high school or high school. Sibling applications for magnet programs are also submitted in the online School Selection Process.

Students with a home address that is not in the CPS District may apply to attend a CPS school during the online Open Enrollment Application Period held in April.

HOW TO REGISTER

CPS uses an online system to register students but also provides support to families needing assistance through its Customer Care Center. The online system simplifies and streamlines the process of registering children in CPS. Parents or legal guardians first must register a child using the online system at either their neighborhood school, or the school assigned to them via the School Selection Process.

Once the parent/guardian uploads all required documents, CPS staff finalizes the registration and enrolls the child as quickly as possible. Parents will receive confirmation from CPS' Online Registration system when enrollment is complete.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

PRESCHOOL

Children ages 3 to 4 years old that live within CPS district boundaries are eligible to sign up for a high-quality preschool classroom. A family can register their child for preschool online at www.cps-k12.org/preschool.

Additional assistance and registration support is available by calling 513-363-0240.

NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOLS

Students in grades K-6 are automatically eligible to register and enroll in their assigned neighborhood elementary school based on the school's attendance boundaries and the student's home address.

Schools that are both Neighborhood and Magnet schools enroll students into the Magnet program based on the School Selection Process. Neighborhood students can attend Neighborhood-Magnet schools without being enrolled in the Magnet program. MAGNET SCHOOLS

Magnet schools offer content focuses and programs aimed at students' different interests and learning styles. Students in grades K-6, and some in grades 7-8, are eligible to participate in the School Selection Process for their chance to register and enroll in a Magnet School. Schools that are both Neighborhood and Magnet schools enroll students into the Magnet program based on the School Selection Process.

Neighborhood students can attend Neighborhood Magnet schools without being enrolled in the Magnet program. Students with siblings that are currently enrolled in a Magnet program are given priority to enroll in the same Magnet school, but they must apply through the School Selection Process.

MIDDLE AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS

Students in grades 6-8 or 7-8 are automatically eligible to attend the middle school or junior high school in their assigned corridor. Students select the middle school or junior high school in their corridor via the School Selection Process.

MONTESSORI SCHOOLS

Montessori education is student-led and selfpaced while guided, assessed and enriched by knowledgeable and caring teachers, the leadership of their peers and a nurturing environment. Students in grades K-6 are eligible to participate in the School Selection Process for their chance to register and enroll in an elementary Montessori school. Students completing grade 6 that are currently attending a CPS Montessori elementary school will receive priority to enroll in a Montessori high school for grades 7-12.

A grade 6 student who does not currently attend a CPS Montessori elementary school, but would like to attend a CPS Montessori high school must have at least two years of Montessori experience and enter the School Selection Process. All students exiting a CPS elementary school must apply in the School Selection Process (except for Walnut Hills, SCPA and



HIGH SCHOOLS

Students across the CPS District can attend any high school in the district, regardless of their home address by meeting eligibility criteria for some schools and entering the School Selection Process. If a student completing grade 6 is currently attending a neighborhood K-12, specialized 3-12 or online school, they do not need to enter the School Selection Process to continue attending that school. However, if those students would like to change their high school, they will need to enter the School Selection Process.

Please note, some schools have additional eligibility requirements to enter, such as completing an audition for SCPA or earning above baseline scores on entrance exams for Walnut Hills or Spencer. For more information on high school eligibility requirements, contact the school of interest.





At Hughes' Cognia internationally accredited and STEM-certified through the Ohio STEM Learning Network high school, students focus on project-based learning and critical-thinking through the use of technology.




PS offers alternative programs to support the educational, social and emotional development of students that need specialized support unavailable in a traditional education environment. Alternative programs are available to students upon referral and/or with an IEP. Participation in an alternative program can be a student's entire educational experience or limited educational experience, depending on the specific needs of the student.

he CPS Hospital/Satellite Program provides educational services to in-district and out-of-district, at-risk students in an off-site facility until students can return to their home school. CPS' hospital and satellite programs are located at the following agency sites: Cincinnati Children's Residential Treatment-College Hill Campus, Cincinnati Children's Burnet Campus, Hamilton County Adult Justice Center, Hamilton County Juvenile Court Youth Center and Talbert House Passages for Young Women.

he Promise Center is an alternative to out-of-school suspension and expulsion program that provides additional academic, therapeutic and behavioral instruction. Led by restorative-practice trained staff, the program is designed to ensure that students continue their academic instruction while they are assisted in examining and eliminating the behaviors that resulted in their placement at Promise Center. In addition to meeting academic standards, students are expected to participate in activities that will help them modify negative behaviors by demonstrating positive decision making, problem solving, anger management and positive peer and adult relations. The Promise Center offers substance abuse and mental health counseling and transition services to help students return to their home schools and become productive, positive members of their school communities.

ASPIRE & 22+ CREDIT RECOVER

dult Education offers two key programs, Aspire and the 22+ Credit Recovery Program. Aspire is designed to provide out-of-school youth and adult students services in basic reading, math and writing; adult secondary education, High School Equivalency (HSE) preparation, English for speakers of other languages, transition services to post-secondary and employment and workplace education. Aspire also offers integrated education and training to earn a credential in culinary arts, construction, medical assistance (MA), Patient Care Assistance (PCA), phlebotomy and Hospital Work Readiness. The Aspire program serves approximately 1200 students each year at no charge to the adults who participate. Aspire is available to students ages 19 and above at eight sites across Cincinnati. Students ages 16, 17 and 18 can participate with documentation showing they officially withdrew from, or completed, high school.

Adult Education also offers the 22+ Adult High School Diploma Program offering credit recovery for adults 22 years old or older who wish to earn their high school diploma.

GLOSSARY



ADULT EDUCATION

Adult Education Solutions (AES) is part of the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) and the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE), offering free day and evening classes and wraparound Adult Services. Classes are also available online. AES offers two programs, Aspire and 22+ Credit Recovery- Adult Diploma Program, designed specifically for individuals whose goal is to attain the credentials they need to build a successful future.

AP

Advanced Placement courses provide students the opportunity to earn college credit after successfully completing the course and passing a subject-specific AP test.

AUDITION

The school has entrance requirements based on an audition.

CCP

Ohio's College Credit Plus program provides students the opportunity to earn college credits while still in high school.

CLC

The school also serves as a Community Learning Center.

COLLEGE PIPELINE

The school has a college pipeline program, providing students the opportunity to be accepted to a partner college or university as a college sophomore upon high school graduation.

CREW

A structure and culture at EL schools that provide students with the opportunity to work as a community and reach ambitious goals together.

CTF

The school offers Career Technical Education which provides students the opportunity to earn industry-recognized credentials for technical careers while still in high school.

DUAL IMMERSION

Some classes are taught in two or more languages for students learning a non-native language.

EXPEDITIONARY LEARNING (EL)

Education model designed to provide educational equity and redefine student achievement.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

The IB program enables students to make sense of the complexities of the world around them, while equipping them with the skills and dispositions needed for taking responsible action for the future.

LEADER IN ME

Education model that builds leadership and life skills in students and creates a high-trust school culture.

HSE

High School Equivalency Exam

MAGNET

An elementary school that offers a specialized program, such as STEM or Arts. Students are admitted based on the School Selection Process and/or additional eligibility criteria.

MONTESSORI

The school follows a Montessori education model. Students are admitted based on the School Selection Process.

NEIGHBORHOOD

Students admitted based on the school's neighborhood boundaries.

ONLINE

The school is primarily online, supported by a traditional school building.

PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

The school leans into a teaching method allowing students to engage in real-world, personally meaningful projects.

ENTRANCE EXAM

The school has entrance requirements based on qualifying test scores.

SBHC

The school hosts a School Based Health Center.
