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What is Title 1?

What is it?

How is it revised?

Robert J. Burch Elementary school invited parents to attend our annual Stakeholders Meeting last Spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Who is it for?

The activities and opportunities described in this plan are for all students and their families. Our school will provide opportunities for participation of parents of students with disabilities and limited English proficiency, including providing information and school reports in a family friendly format.

Shared Decision Making

Our faculty and staff want to partner with you to ensure your child's academic and social-emotional success. We believe a strong school-home relationship is instrumental to student growth. Therefore, we strive to provide multiple opportunities for shared decision making. Thank you for participating in our surveys, Title 1 meetings, discussions, conferences, and other school-home communication opportunities. Your input is critical to the development of our school-wide improvement and family engagement plans and helps us plan family instructional programming, purchase resources, and support you and your child. In addition, one percent (1%) of our Title 1 funds are spent on parental involvement.

Robert J. Burch Elementary Goals

Reading - Increase by 2% annually, the percentage of 3rd - 5th students and subgroups reading on grade level or above as measured by GMAS End of Grade reading indicator.

ELA & Math - Increase by 3% annually, the percentage of students and subgroups scoring at Proficient and Distinguished Achievement Levels as measured by GMAS End of Grade Assessment.

During the 2025-2026 school year, 50% of students will have a 50% or higher growth percentile as measured by STAR assessments.

School Climate - Improve student leadership opportunities, attendance, positive behavior; and increase staff and family engagement as measured by state, district, and school surveys.
