Along with our *Parent Aware Rated* preschool and ECFE programs, we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help when extra help is needed.

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3-6 Intervention

The Early Childhood Special **Education (ECSE) Preschool**

Program provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool).

Preschool Screening

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.



Early Childhood Screening

Has your 3 year old been screened? The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.

REFERENDUM PROJECTS UPDATE

The building projects at Jordan Elementary School and Jordan High School started in 2024. Phases 1.5 and 2 work is being completed this summer. Phase 1.5 included the old main office (which will become the student support services area) the music room, 1970s gymnasium, and the old cafeteria and kitchen (which will become a dedicated Kids' Company space, additional restrooms for the Early Learning Services wing, and a wellness room for nursing mothers). Phase two included the Early Learning Services and K-1 wings of Jordan Elementary School. At

the same time, the roof over these two areas of the building are being replaced, and the front parking lot work is being completed. At the end of the project, all areas of Jordan Elementary School will have been renovated and an additional 70 parking spaces will be added to help alleviate parking constraints at Jordan Elementary School.

With the opening of the new secure entrances at JHS, JES and ELS, we have implemented a new process for building visitors at all of our building entrances that includes a visitor background check being completed in the vestibule prior to building entry. We ask that visitors have a valid state-issued ID ready to ensure a quick and smooth entry process. This added security measure will help us ensure our buildings are as safe as possible!

GRADES K-4 BACK-TO-SCHOOL

Before school starts in the fall, all students and families in grades K-4 will meet individually with their teacher to drop off school supplies, discuss grade level expectations, curriculum and Jordan PRIDE, and have school pictures taken. Kindergarten students typically attend KickStart to Kindergarten, unfortunately, due to our construction project, that program will not take place again until the 2026-2027 school year.

The JES Back to School Conferences/Curriculum day will be held on Thursday, August 28, from 12pm-7:30pm. Students and families will meet with their homeroom teacher and support staff for approximately 15 minutes. Afterwards, students and families will have the opportunity to travel around the building checking in with specialist teachers (Music, Art, Phy. Ed. and Media/Tech), support staff, school nurse, or office staff. School pictures will also take place during this event, which is different from what has happened in the past. Please remember that in order for students to be enrolled at JES, we need proof of immunizations or a conscientious objection form on file and supply a copy of their child's birth certificate.

JES families in grades K-4 will receive an email in mid August about the Back to School Conference Day and who your child's teacher is for the fall. The email will also contain information on how to sign-up online for a conference time. If you did not receive an email, are new to the District, or do not have access to our school website to register for these conferences, please contact the JES office at 952-492-2336. **We only have one time slot available for each student to meet with the classroom teacher and complete assessments, so please plan accordingly if you have a dual household.**

Morning AM drop off for grades K-4 is from 7:40am - 8:10am.

- ALL families will enter and exit the north parking loop via the round-a-bout on Sunset Drive for pick up and drop off.
- Please **DO NOT** line up in the loop prior to 7:30am since supervisors do not start assisting students into the building until 7:40am.

Afternoon PM pick up for grades K-4 is from 3:15pm - 3:30pm.

- Please **DO NOT** line up in the loop prior to 2:45pm. We need to avoid traffic build up on Sunset Drive for school buses and in-town traffic to drive through in the afternoon.
- -Remain in your vehicle during pick-up until supervisors reports to the loop. Please make sure your child exits and enters your vehicle on the right-hand side of the vehicle.
- -Have your child practice buckling themselves in so we can keep traffic moving forward and we don't have to wait for adults to stop and buckle students into their seats.
- -Stay alert to traffic moving in the front loop. Stay off of cell phones and make sure to move up close to the vehicle ahead of you to prevent a long backup.

NOTE: If you need to drop off or pick up at any other time during the school day please park in the main lot, enter through the front of the building, and check in at the main office by using our JES Visitor Management System located in the vestibule.

Jordan Community, Families, and Students,

The staff at Jordan High School looks forward to welcoming our students for the 2024-2025 school year. We are excited to celebrate a new year of growing our Jordan PRIDE (Preparedness, Respect, Integrity, Dependability, Excellence). We will continue to focus on improving attendance and timeliness for our students. Phone usage will also be a focal point for our school day. We believe



that preparing our students to leave Jordan High School is essential. We have preached about the "three E's"meaning that students leave JHS and are ready to be employed, enlisted, or enrolled. Expecting students to show up daily, be on time, and stay off their phone are ways that we can assist in their preparation.

We are excited to host our tenth year of Freshman FOCUS, to assist in the transition for our newest students to the high school. All 9th grade students will report to school on Tuesday, September 2. We will take the students through an orientation, community building, and walk through their schedule. We find this to be a great day to ease the nerves of students new to JHS. On the same day, September 2, our grades 10-12 students will "Go Remote" and will be responsible for checking in online with their teachers and completing assignments remotely. See more on page 65.

Teachers will again be using Google Classroom, a learning management system, that will help students organize their calendars and keep track of assignments. Parents will have access to their students' account and will be able to see what students see when they go into Google Classroom. Teachers will organize the sites by courses that include folders for each unit. These folders may include presentations, links, videos, assignments and/or quizzes to be completed digitally, curriculum information, the class syllabus with classroom expectations, and other information. Parents will also be able to access a daily or weekly summary with assignment due dates and test dates.

During the past ten school years, students have become accustomed to working with Google docs and saving their assignments to the Cloud. This allows students to collaborate with each other and their teachers simultaneously. They can access their documents using their Chromebooks or any other device, including their phones, from any location. Storing work on the Cloud means students will never lose their assignments or forget them at home; they can easily retrieve them from home and school. Finally, teachers can respond to student work more quickly as well.

The 2025-2026 school year will include a number of classes that allow our students opportunities to earn college credit or grow their skills in the trades. A student at JHS could earn over 45 college credits without ever leaving the building. We are extremely proud of the opportunities that are offered for students to challenge themselves while continuing to work with our faculty at JHS.

The beginning of the school year is always exciting. We encourage our students to take their education seriously and begin to decide who they want to be and how they are going to get there. As always, the staff at JHS thanks parents for their support and encourages parents to call with

questions and concerns.

Arrival/Dismissal Times

JHS students' hours are 8:00am - 3:00pm. Students are allowed in academic wings at 7:45am. The school day begins at 8:00am every day. Please be sure to have your child/ children here on time. All students who arrive after 8:00am must sign in at the office along with their parent/quardian or a note stating the reason for being late. **If your** child is sick, please call before 8:00am using the student attendance line at **952-492- 4488.** If your child is leaving during the school day, please send a note with your child to the office by 8:00am to get a pass to leave. Doing this will reduce interruptions into the classroom during the academic day.

Breakfast & Lunches

For the 2025-2026 school year, Jordan Public Schools is participating in the Free School Meals Program. All families are encouraged to fill out the Application for Educational Benefits. Students who were approved for benefits last year will still need to turn in a new application this school year. School Pictures

All students (including seniors) must have their pictures taken during picture day. Parents may choose not to purchase the picture package but **ALL students** (to include seniors) must have their picture taken so they have a student identification card which we use for flex period check in. Parking Permits


