# How to Identify ICE Agents



**VESTS LABELED WITH: ICE, POLICE HSI, ERO, OR POLICE HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS CAN ALSO BE WEARING PLAIN CLOTHES AND BE MASKED. UNMARKED VEHICLES WITH TINTED WINDOWS.**

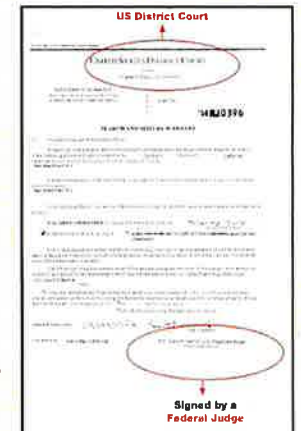


**IF THEY KNOCK ON YOUR DOOR, THEY MUST PRESENT A JUDICIAL WARRANT SIGNED BY A JUDGE. A NOTICE OF APPEARANCE IS NOT SUFFICIENT FOR CONDUCTING AN ARREST.**



## VERIFY

**ASK IF THEY ARE ICE AGENTS.  
ASK TO SEE THEIR BADGE**



## RECORD

**TAKE PICTURES AND VIDEO. TAKE NOTE OF THE TIME AND LOCATION**

## INFORM

**INFORM THE PEOPLE IN THE AREA AND CONTACT MIRAC SO WE CAN INFORM THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE (INFORMATION ON BACK)**

# KNOW YOUR RIGHTS



**You have the right to object to the dismissal/rejection of your immigration case**



## **Don't open the door**

An immigration agent can't open your door without a warrant signed by a judge. If they don't show you a valid warrant, you are not required to open the door. For businesses, lock the door and don't open without a warrant.



## **Don't answer any questions**

If an agent tries to talk to you, remember that you have the right to remain silent. You do not have to respond to any questions about your immigration status, your place of birth, or how you entered the country.



## **Don't sign anything without an attorney**

Don't sign any document without first consulting with an immigration attorney. Signing without understanding the contents could affect your case or your legal rights.



## **If you are not in your house**

If an immigration agent approaches you in the street or another public place, ask them: "Am I free to leave?" If the agent says yes, move away from them calmly without running or making sudden movements

***If an immigration judge offers to dismiss your case, be aware of the unexpected consequences of the dismissal.***

***If they offer to dismiss your case, always consult with an attorney first.***

***If they offer to dismiss your case, but you don't yet have an immigration attorney, ask for more time to contact an attorney.***
