District Happenings:

- The annual IRSD Administrative Institute was held July 21-23. Principals, assistant principals and other administrative staff spent three days reviewing data, policies, strategic plans and the district's instructional focus for 2025-2026.
 The theme of this year's institute was "Intentional Leadership: From Insight to Action."
- The 2025-2026 school year will begin on Tuesday,

Major Capital Improvement Progress:

 At the new Sussex Central High School, final site work is continuing; finish work is substantially complete with punch list items being addressed; the main gym floor is complete; and electrical, plumbing and Fire Marshal inspections are complete. Office staff has moved into the building and furniture has been installed in most classrooms. The building will open for the 2025-2026 school year in September.
