# INQUIRY: establishing the purpose of the unit

#### **Transfer Goals**

<u>Phenomenon</u>: When determining the concentration of iron(II) ions in a sample, results obtained from spectrophotometry, redox titration, and atomic absorption spectroscopy (AAS) often differ slightly, even under controlled conditions. These discrepancies raise questions about the limitations of each method, the role of instrumental and human error, and the propagation of uncertainty through complex calculations. Investigating this reveals how scientific measurements are inherently estimations, bounded by uncertainty — and how method selection and error analysis are crucial for drawing reliable chemical conclusions.

<u>Statement of Inquiry</u>: Accurate and precise measurement in chemistry is essential for ensuring safety, quality, and innovation in real-world contexts such as medicine, environmental monitoring, and industrial manufacturing.
