



## Scholarship Support

The Sisters of St. Joseph's call to serve the dear neighbor without distinction is one we strive to instill in our students each day and is a call we must answer as a school community as well. Keeping St. Joseph's Academy financially accessible for deserving students of all backgrounds is vitally important.

### Facts:

- **36 percent** of SJA students receive scholarship support or tuition assistance.
- St. Joe will award more than **\$1,930,000 in scholarship and tuition assistance for the 2025-2026 school year.**
- Significant **additional funding for scholarships** is paramount to meet rising costs and the needs of families.
- SJA tuition is currently \$20,990, exclusive of fees and the cost of extra-curricular activities.
- The following framework is available in order for our donors to provide meaningful support for students in need:
  - + **Endowed Scholarship Funds** benefit students for years to come by maintaining principal, while annually awarding six percent of the interest earned. Endowed Scholarship Funds may be named and **begin at the \$50,000 gift level.**
  - + **Fully Funded Named Endowed Scholarships** (Full Tuition) **begin at the \$375,000 gift level.**
  - + **Partially Funded Named Endowed Scholarships** (Half Tuition) **begin at the \$187,500 gift level.**
  - + Contributions of less than \$50,000 are established as student tuition assistance funds. These funds may be named and awards are granted annually until the fund is depleted or additional donations are received.
  - + St. Joseph's Academy works with each donor to ensure their intention is met in concert with the mission of the school.
  - + A variety of payment options are available, including cash, checks, pledge payments, or gifts of stock, in accordance with the school's gift acceptance policies.
