PLEASE READ CAREFULLY & WORD-FOR-WORD / BOTH STUDENTS & PARENTS NEED TO READ THIS LETTER

We are so excited to start the new school year and can't wait to see ALL OUR KIDS 😊 the first day of school on **Tuesday, August 12th at 8:00 am for 10th, 11th, & 12th Grade!!** Doors open at 7:30 am. **ALL 10th, 11th, & 12th Grade students will report to the auditorium for a Welcome, Introductions of Teachers, and to receive their schedule.**

Note – ALL 9th graders will begin school on Monday, August 11th for orientation, learn our procedures, time to meet their teachers, find their classes, and learn the Odessa College campus.

The first 2 days of school will be busy with grade level meetings, student orientations and expectations, and following our bell schedule, which is the same as last year. Students will begin their regular schedule and classes on Tuesday, August 12th after our 8:00 am welcome assembly. School will be dismissed at 3:40 pm each day, and 2:40 on Fridays. Students will need to bring lunch money (approx. \$7.19 per day) cash or debit card. Note – ECISD will still offer free lunch to all our students in their portable. Students can also use their own debit card. Note – ApplePay and other cell phone payments will no longer be available for our students concerning vending machines and lunch food services in Travis Café. They must use cash or a physical debit card or credit card.

OCA is a closed campus for lunch for 9th & 10th grade. All Freshmen & Sophomores will eat in the Travis Café or the breakfast/lunch ECISD portable. We will assist them the first 2 days so they know where it is located and what to do. 9th & 10th Grade will also not have their cell phone with them during lunch.

ALL SENIORS will have a CLOSED CAMPUS for lunch for the first day of school on Tuesday, August 12th, so we can show them the services OC provides at the Saulsbury Center (\$7.19 for all you can eat). They also have microwaves in there if students bring their lunch. Seniors will resume off-campus lunch privileges on Wednesday, August 13th.

ALL JUNIORS will have a CLOSED CAMPUS for lunch for the first TWO DAYS OF SCHOOL on Tuesday, August 12th, and Wednesday, August 13th, so we can show them the services OC provides at the Saulsbury Center (\$7.19 for all you can eat). They also have microwaves in there if students bring their lunch. Juniors will begin off-campus lunch privileges on Thursday, August 14th.

We will discuss lunches in much more detail with students in our grade level orientations.

IMPORTANT CHANGES FOR THE 2025-26 SCHOOL YEAR:

With record enrollment and almost 500 students at OCA (492), there are some changes for the upcoming year. We will discuss them in detail in our student orientations and August parent meetings. They are listed briefly here:

- With the new State Law banning the use of student cell phones during the school day, there will be significant change. We will address this with students on the first day of school, explain in detail expectations, consequences for not following the new State Law, and answer their questions. We will also address the new law with parents during **Grade Level Parent Meetings / Orientations - August 18th for 10th & 11th grade, and August 19th for 12th grade.** The 9th grade parent meeting was during Summer Bridge went surprisingly well concerning the new State Law. We will also address how to get in contact with your student during the school day without them being able to use their cell phone.
- **Yearbook Pictures for 9th, 10th, and 11th Grade Students will be Thursday, August 14th, the first Thursday of school. We will announce this multiple times to students so they will look their best for their pictures.**
- High School Student Parking will be in the Andrews Lot, same as last year. We will work with students on parking registration who have a drivers license and are legal to drive by themselves (not a drivers permit).
- ALL 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students will use ECISD school issued Chromebooks for ALL classes and will not use personal devices.
- There will be a new tardy machine installed at OCA that will know students are late (down to the exact minute and second they are late - it scans their ID). It will be important that students are on time to avoid consequences. It is our goal to have more students on time to all classes.
- Please make sure the parent contact and email are correct in Focus Parent Portal. Almost all communication from OCA about student events and activities will be sent by email and by text to parents.
- AVID is working on more team building activities, more guest speakers for career options, a Career Day, and other activities as we prepare students for universities after graduation. Seniors will see a significant emphasis on completing many scholarship applications and college applications. The Senior AVID Teacher and AVID Coordinator for OCA will be Mrs. Hernandez, who taught 10th / 11th AVID previously.
- Parents are encouraged to join the OCA Booster Club so that parents can support our students in their many activities. They will be at our first parent meeting.
- There will be more school wide and grade level team building activities throughout the school year. Some during the day, some in the evenings. Some will be a surprise as the students will find out when they arrive to school. As we limit cell phone / social media access, it is important that our students talk, laugh, visit, play, team-build, interact face-to-face, socialize, and “be human” so to speak, with each other.

NEW TEXAS LAW PROHIBITS STUDENT USE OF PERSONAL DEVICES

OCA Families,

July 28, 2025

One of the most impactful bills passed by the Texas Legislature during the spring and signed into law by Governor Greg Abbott, is House Bill 1481 which is intended to create a more focused, engaging, and safe learning environment for students by banning the use of personal electronic communication devices on school property during the school day.

This law takes effect with the start of the 2025-26 school year.

Under this new law, ECISD students will not be permitted to use any personal devices that can send or receive data while on campus during the school day, including passing periods, lunch, and recess. It is also important for students and parents to know, the school district will not provide a place to secure personal devices during the day, meaning students who bring devices into the school will be responsible for storing them securely, out of use, throughout the instructional day.

Devices included in this new law include but are not limited to:

- Cell Phones
- Smart Watches/Smart Glasses
- Fitness Trackers with messaging capabilities
- Bluetooth Earbuds or Headphones
- Tablets and Personal Computers
- Gaming Devices
- Two-Way Radios
- Pagers
- Any other devices capable of telecommunication or digital communication

District and school leaders ask parents to discuss this significant change with their children as they prepare for the school year. Failure to follow the law will result in disciplinary consequences. More information will be available from me during student orientations and beginning of year grade level parent meetings as the school year begins. Working together, we can make this change smoothly and ensure both parents, students, and teachers maintain the communication necessary for safety and positive academic achievement.

NOTE – ALL OCA STUDENTS will still receive a student Chromebook at the beginning of school to complete their high school and college coursework in Blackboard. This has not changed from past years as OCA is a 1:1 campus concerning school issued student laptops.




- FOR 9th, 11th, and 12th GRADE STUDENTS – REGULAR USB WIRELESS MOUSE FOR LAPTOP. OCA HAS LEARNED THAT THE TOUCHPAD ON THE LAPTOP CAN WEAR OUT IF OVERLY USED. MANY STUDENTS USE A WIRELESS MOUSE BECAUSE IT IS MUCH EASIER & FASTER TO USE, HAVE LESS ERRORS ON ASSIGNMENTS, EASIER TO COMPLETE STAAR & MAP TESTS, AND IT EXTENDS THE LONGEVITY OF THE LAPTOP.
- 10th GRADE ONLY – A BLUE TOOTH WIRELESS MOUSE OR A USB-C WIRELESS MOUSE. YOU ARE USING THE SAME RED LAPTOPS AS LAST YEAR.
- Student will need a large, sturdy backpack. We recommend a large one that will hold their school issued Laptop and other materials including pens, pencils, markers, spirals, and composition notebooks. Students can choose the color and style of their backpack as long as it is big and sturdy enough to hold all their daily supplies. It must be brought to school every day with their supplies.
- Also, purses, small clutches, or other bags will be limited to those that measure 5 x 8 x 1. No other bags will be allowed to be carried to school, except for the laptop bag that is given to you by OCA.
- If students choose to wear a mask at school, they need to bring their own. Students can bring and keep their own hand sanitizer in their backpacks.
- **GENERAL SUPPLIES:**
- **ALL STUDENTS - 2 Tissue / Kleenex Boxes.** We will collect them the 1st day of school as students arrive. This will help us ensure we have tissue in all classrooms throughout the school year.
- Black, blue, and red pens, and mechanical pencils (no regular pencils)
- 1 Box of 12 map colors / 1 glue stick / 1 pair of scissors / 1 package of 50 3x3 sticky notes
- 5 highlighters of different color (your choice) / NO Sharpies, please. / 3 composition notebooks

- 100-125 page 8 ½ x 11 spiral notebook for 9th Grade Biology
- 100-125 page 8 ½ x 11 spiral notebook for 10th Grade World History.

- 1 Composition Notebook, 1 Daily Planner to write all your assignments & due dates in, and 1 accordion file (8 slots) for 9th Grade and 10th Grade AVID

- Students taking Reading or Creative Writing will need 1 composition notebook.
- Students taking Art I, II, III, IV, or Art Appreciation - one 9x12 sketch book with 50 pound or more paper weight, \$30 art fee for Art I and \$50 art fee for Art II, III, or IV. The art fee will be collected by Mr. Golden, the Art teacher.
- NOTE – Students taking Dual Credit college classes won't know the supplies they need until they attend class beginning on Tuesday, Aug. 19th, and Wednesday, Aug. 20th, when they meet their OC Professors.

ECISD Student Dress Code / Dress and Grooming **ECISD Student Handbook**


Dress and Grooming (All Grade Levels) The district's dress code teaches grooming and hygiene, prevents disruption, minimizes safety hazards, and maintains a positive learning climate. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

The district prohibits pictures, symbols, emblems, or writing on clothing, accessories (i.e. jewelry, rings or belt buckles) and in hair design, including, but not limited to, shaved or cut eyebrows and shaved images in hair that:

- Are lewd, offensive, vulgar, or obscene;
- Advertise or depict tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or any other illegal substance;
- Refer to satanic, cult, or gang activities; and/or Represent death and dismemberment and/or violence.
- House Bill 567 Prohibits discrimination bases on hair texture or protective hairstyles commonly or historically associated with race. (see glossary)
- Clothing (dresses, skirts, shorts, skorts) must be no shorter than five inches from the top of the kneecap.
- Form fitting, too tight clothing will not be allowed.
- Students will not be permitted to wear see-through clothing or have bare midriffs, bare shoulders, or backless fashions. Tank tops, muscle shirts, or clothing with spaghetti straps or strapless garments are prohibited. May be worn only with a full t-shirt (with sleeves) underneath.
- Undergarments may not be worn as outerwear.
- Pants, shorts, and slacks must be worn at the natural waist (no more than one size larger than natural waist size).
- Student must wear shoes at all times. Taps, metal plates, or cleats on shoes will not be permitted. Specifically prohibited footwear are bathroom slippers, footwear not intended for outdoor wear, and shoes equipped with roller blades/wheels. Flip flops are acceptable.
- Extremely torn clothing will not be permitted. Holes or shredding in jeans or similar garment shall not reveal undergarments at any time.
- Students will be required to wear their hair well-groomed and clean at all times. Extreme modes of hair design and color will not be permitted; mohawks are permitted as long as they are under 2 inches in height.
- Sponsors of extracurricular activities may set individual dress and appearance standards with the approval of the principal. The wearing of cheerleading uniforms during the school day is at the principal's discretion.
- Students may not wear hats, caps, sweat bands, visors, head coverings or bandanas in the building (neither males nor females).
- Bandanas are not allowed on campus.
- Sunshades may not be worn in the building or classroom, unless prescribed by a physician for indoor use.
- Clothing items which present a concern for safety may not be worn (i.e. chains, dog collars).
- Any disruptive, unsafe, or distractive mode of clothing, eyewear, tattoos, or appearance that adversely impacts the education process is not acceptable.
- Belts must be worn appropriately in belt loops and at the natural waist.

At High School Campuses: Leggings, jeggings, and yoga pants must be opaque and accompanied by appropriate top coverings to the mid-thigh. Piercings are permitted (lights and chains are prohibited).

Students who violate the dress code will be referred to the principal's office. The final decision regarding a dress code violation is at the discretion of the campus principal. If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school and return to the classroom. If the problem cannot be corrected at school, the principal will work with the student and parent to obtain an acceptable change of clothing for the student in a way that minimizes loss of instructional time. Repeated or severe offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.
