

CAV GOLFERS CAPTURE FIRST WIN OF THE OFFICIAL 2025-26 SPORTS SEASON

It was only the second day of school. Last week's blistering temperatures had cooled over the weekend, but crept back up to 88 degrees Tuesday. It didn't prevent Crockett County's scheduled golf match with Peabody High School, however, and a Cavalier sports team captured its first victory of the 2025-26 season at the Crockett Country Club.

The CCHS boys prevailed 172-183 and the girls prevailed by forfeit as Peabody didn't field the required number of players (two for girls) to officially score the match.

Jack Shaver and George Randall carded a 38 and 39, respectively, to pace Crockett's boys. Although medalist honors were captured by Peabody's Brodie Reuter (37) - son of multiple-time Stone Cup winner Jeff Reuter - the Cavs' team scores were more solidly bunched as Max Woods contributed a 47 and both Clay Kail and Will Harber had 48s (the four best scores are counted in boys matches). Crockett's Rachel Crossnoe rebounded from a slow start to shoot a 41 to post the best girls' score of the day.

The Cavalier teams will play again Thursday at Humboldt against South Gibson.
