Grainne retired after a 40-year career in corporate banking, most recently as Managing Director and Senior Portfolio Manager at Wells Fargo. While her professional accomplishments are notable, it is her dedication to outreach and social justice that truly embodies the spirit of the Sacred

Heart. During her time at Wells Fargo, Grainne led the Corporate Banking Division's DEI initiative from 2012 to 2018. Her work focused on building connections with minority and underserved college students through partnerships with Management Leadership for Tomorrow (MLT) and ALPFA, creating access to career development opportunities and improving recruitment equity. She volunteered at the Welcoming Center, helping immigrants develop resumes and practice for job interviews—an experience that combined her professional expertise with her passion for service.

Her commitment to faith-based education continued at home, where she and her husband raised four children who attended Sacred Heart, Waldron Mercy, St. Denis, and Merion Mercy. Each school community offered opportunities for family outreach that deepened their shared values and strengthened their dedication to social justice.

Now in retirement, Grainne continues to lead and serve. She is Secretary of the St. Malachy School Advisory Council in North Philadelphia, supporting fundraising efforts and mentoring students through monthly meetings. She also leads the Sacred Heart Alumnae Book Club, now in its third year, which brings together alumnae, faculty, and students for meaningful conversations around literature and faith.

Grainne lives out the mission of the Sacred Heart daily—with humility, generosity, and a profound commitment to others.

After graduating from Penn with a degree in Philosophy, Alice began her first career as an architectural model builder—earning a reputation as

"the best in town." But her path soon turned toward what would become a lifelong mission: building stronger communities, empowering families, and advocating for children.

A tireless force for good, Alice co-founded The Wetherill School, served as Director of Public Relations for SCAN (Stop Child Abuse Now), and created "SCANTASTIC"—Philadelphia's first multi-restaurant fundraiser of its kind. Her work helped raise significant funds to support vulnerable children and inspired nonprofits across the region.

Alice's volunteer service is impressive: decades of board leadership with Emergency Aid of Pennsylvania Foundation, St. Malachy School, Philadelphia Hospitality, Franklin Institute, Merion Golf Club, and more. She's created events, chaired galas, led fundraising campaigns, and hosted international laureates—all while raising two sons and strengthening her beloved city.

Kate Callahan '96 2025 Hall of Honor Goal IV Award

For over 25 years, Kate has worked to create educational environments rooted in equity, respect, and opportunity. As Executive Director of Research for Action, she leads efforts to transform education systems through research and policy, advancing justice from Pre-K through postsecondary education. Under her leadership, the organization launched a bold strategic vision, secured its first Institute of Education Sciences grant, and emerged as a powerful voice in the post-pandemic educational landscape.

Kate's commitment to equity began in the classroom—as a teacher in the School District of Philadelphia, then as Associate Director for A Better Chance (ABC) in Lower Merion, and later as a Maryknoll Lay Missioner supporting educators in La Paz, Bolivia. She's also taught at Temple University and Cabrini University, championing participatory research methods that elevate marginalized voices.

A respected thought leader, Kate has been invited to speak at national forums including the Bipartisan Policy Center, National Governors Association, and the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities—influencing the national conversation around educational equity and access.

At SHA, Kate was a Red Team member, field hockey co-captain, student government leader, and editor of Chez Nous. As valedictorian and recipient of the Très Bien, Sportsmanship, and Jeannine Broussard Awards, her early leadership and commitment to community were clear.

Today, Kate also serves her hometown of Havertown as a Haverford School District Education Foundation Board member. She and her husband have five children.

Sacred Heart Academy is pleased to present the Spirit of Sophie Award to Joan Meaney Quinn '47 P'73, '75, '80, '81, '87, GP'12, '15.

Joan Quinn was a devoted wife to her husband Tom for 62 beautiful years, a cherished mother to seven children, a proud grandmother to 17, and a joyful great-grandmother to two. She lived a full and vibrant life for 91

years before peacefully passing on June 3, 2021.

A graduate of Sacred Heart in 1947 and Manhattanville College in 1951, Joan remained deeply connected to her roots. She was the proud mother of five Sacred Heart alumnae daughters and two alumnae granddaughters. Her commitment to Sacred Heart spanned decades, serving as a dedicated Trustee and becoming the first woman Board Chair from 1980 to 1983, helping lead the school through its pivotal move from Overbrook to Bryn Mawr. In 2009, her lifelong devotion was honored with the Distinguished Alumna Award

Beyond her connection to Sacred Heart, Joan dedicated over 64 years to the Emergency Aid of Pennsylvania Foundation, where she held numerous leadership roles, including President and Board Chair. Her work helped uplift local non-profits focused on improving the lives of women and children—a mission close to her heart.

Joan often credited Sacred Heart with shaping her values and character, finding lifelong inspiration in the words of Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat: "Be humble, be simple, and bring joy to others." Guided by faith and love, Joan lived these words every day, and her light will continue to shine through the lives she touched.



Marcella Marino '18 Duchesne 30 Award

Marcella graduated from Penn State's Smeal College of Business in 2022 with a B.S. in Corporate Innovation and Entrepreneurship and a minor in International Business. She was an active member of the Penn State American Marketing Association (PSAMA). As a freshman, she competed

in an AMA case competition against over 370 universities; in her sophomore year, she served as Marketing Week Director, organizing a week of marketing seminars. By senior year, Marcella was elected Vice President on PSAMA's Upper Executive Board, helping the chapter earn International Chapter of the Year.

Marcella was named to the Dean's List multiple times and was inducted into Penn State's Sigma Nu Tau Entrepreneurship Honor Society in 2021. She also played on the Penn State tennis travel team.

In her junior year, Marcella developed the business plan for MarRosa's, an Italian specialty food line, launching her first products in April 2021. She continued growing MarRosa's in her senior year and won Penn State's "Inc. U" competition (similar to Shark Tank), earning \$15,000 to expand her business. She also spoke at the Invent Penn State Venture & IP Conference, receiving an additional \$2,000. These awards helped fund the early stages of her business.

Starting with farmers markets, MarRosa's now reaches over 200 grocery stores in the Tri-State area and locations across the country.

Marcella was recently named to Main Line Today's "20 Under 40" list—an honor recognizing rising leaders and changemakers in Philadelphia's western suburbs.

A "lifer" at Sacred Heart, Marcella began in pre-K. She was a standout on the crew and tennis teams, earning top tennis player honors for three years. She continues her connection to Sacred Heart and Penn State by returning to share her inspiring story.
