Why do we need a dress code?

The purpose of the dress code is not to inhibit personal freedoms but rather acknowledge the unique role that you have as a member of the **PROFESSIONAL** Raider community. It will help you to understand that you will need to establish a “personal you” and a “professional you.”

During the school day, while riding in school district vehicles, and at all school-related activities or functions, students shall adhere to a standard of dress and appearance that is appropriate.



Student Attire Guidelines

In accordance, the following expectation guidelines have been established for student dress and appearance for students at WJ Keenan High School:

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• shirts/tops that fully cover your midsection (no skin showing)• pants, jeans, or skirts that are long enough to cover pockets and undergarments—even if they have rips or tears.• clothing and accessories that are free from profanity, vulgarity, obscenity, violence, or references to alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.• baseball caps; turbans, decorative head wraps• athletic slides, athletic shoes, dress and casual shoes, boots, sandals• appropriate outerwear that matches the weather and season (jacket, sweater, coat, etc.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• tops that expose your midsection (No skin showing in front or back)• bottoms that reveal undergarments or pockets due to length or rips• spandex/Lycra shorts, one-piece bodysuits, or leggings• hoods, bonnets, du-rags, or head coverings that cover the entire face (e.g., ski masks, shiesty, etc.)• items (including purses or backpacks) that display inappropriate or offensive content• house shoes or soft-bottomed bedroom slippers, or blankets




